


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
Cimarron Region Members Invited To VW Show!

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Motorsports Update

The Danger Factor

With the loss of Justin Wilson in Indycar last month, we were once again reminded of the cost of motorsport competition. Any death of a 37 year-old person is tragic, but the loss of Wilson was particularly so because he left a wife and two young children to deal with the grief. And many friends,

too. Wilson was a well-liked journeyman driver, a pleasant Brit as only they can do, with great comradery and respect. Watching the Twitter feed of drivers mourning his death was a stark reminder of the fragile community in which they all live.

Dan Wheldon, Jules Bianchi, and Allan Simonsen are some examples of the more recent tragedies, but they are not the only ones. Far from it - they are merely the most well known. And yet, day after day, season after season, drivers continue to strap in to challenge themselves and the laws of physics. It is a cliché, but to most, driving is life. The ability to control the machine, to take it out to the limit

and bring it back is rewarding, satisfying, and fun.

As racing fans, we share in their triumphs, marvel at their skill, and hold our breath when things go wrong. Fans applaud when a driver gets out of a beat up machine, not because it was a spectacular shunt, but because he or she survived – they lived to race another day. And we wonder "what makes them do it?" They do it because they are good at it. They know the danger and the risk every time they get in the car, and they deal with it in different ways. Some smoke, some vomit, and some get very, very quiet in the moments before a race. It is there, the danger, all the time.

Justin and Jules and Dan loved to race, and they lived to race. In this age of vast safety improvements, it is still a shock to lose a driver, but we'd wager that not one of those three would have chosen a different profession. In years past, death was with us all the time in auto racing. The names of Clark, Rindt, Donohue and too many more remind us how vulnerable they were in those spindly little cars. Today we have safer barriers, carbon fiber chassis, head and neck restraints, and helmets that are far and away better than anything we've ever seen. Yet we still lose drivers.


Nothing can be made 100% safe. Our culture has changed since the days of Ronnie Peterson and Stefan Bellof. The public at large has become risk-averse and the need to protect everyone from everything is the new normal. In racing, we have learned so much from the loss of each driver, but each tragedy makes us a little more squeamish for the next one. The compounding effect of each loss makes the general public look away and condemn the sport as barbaric. For the racing fan who truly understands, we grieve each loss, ask for safety improvements, and continue to watch some of the most skilled, and bravest people on the planet.

And perhaps that is the most fitting tribute to the Wilsons, the Wheldons, the Bianchis of our world. To turn away would be tragedy, too, as if their lives were never lived. The danger is always there. And so are we, to stand witness to their courage.
