Can an SUV really be a sports car? "Don't knock it 'til you've tried it!"



Motorsports Update

Ups and Downs by Jon Jones - CRPCA VP



As could be expected, the debut of the Porsche 919 has not been without teething problems. In the run-up to Le Mans, which of course is the whole point, the World Endurance Championship has made stops at Silverstone and most recently at Spa-Francorchamps in the Ardennes forest of Belgium. At both venues there have been high notes and low notes. The high: Pole position at Spa. The low: long


delays in the same event with a mechanical issue related to a front driveshaft (Porsche is being quite coy about the exact issue). As a significant portion of the regenerative hybrid power is exerted by the front wheels, this is no small issue. But Porsche is testing redesigned parts and should have a solution before the trip to France. What do we know? We know that the cars are fast, if not fully reliable yet. We know that they are on pace with the Audi's and Toyota's. And we know that the driver line-up is



capable and competent. Mark Weber, the former F1 pilot who was signed with much fanfare, has done stellar work with the new car, but he is not number one. He is a driver among equals like Timo Bernhard, Nick Tandy, and Marc Lieb - who put it on the pole at Spa. As for the competition, Audi has encountered an extraordinary run of bad luck including a spectacular wreck at Spa. And we know about Toyota. Ah, that's the story of the season so far. Two races, two wins, and some dominating performances. Many of us railbirds think that Toyota may be *the* challenge to be overcome by Porsche, rather than the previously all-conquering Audi's. Toyota clearly has done their homework under the current WEC rulebook, and along with an excellent driver line-up, has been and will continue to be tough.

Prediction – It might sound partisan (go figure in a Porsche-themed publication) but I have confidence in the 919 for Le Mans. This race is what Porsche lives for, and the whole point of the expense. And while expectations have been somewhat soft-pedaled, the engineering department at Porsche is absolutely focused. Time in the simulator for the drivers, 24 hour runs on the dynamometer, pit stop training and repair practice for the crews, it is all aimed at one chore. Victory at Le Mans. And based on their performance so far, Porsche will be ready later this month.

There are many technologically interesting aspects to the 919. One of the most readily apparent is the rather blunt nose of the car. Compared to the swoopy nature of previous iterations of Le Mans challengers such as the iconic 956/962, the front end of the 919 Hybrid (and other LMP1 cars) has a distinctly boxy shape. Two reasons - the front wheels are not just for steering and lateral cornering loads anymore. They deliver power, in massive bursts, and they also generate energy recovery forces under braking. This necessitates the use of larger front tires and associated support structures. Compared to older cars with their characteristic little tire front, big tire rear appearance, the tire sizes are more equal. Second, advances in aerodynamics now route more air through the car than over it and especially under it. WEC has outlawed ground effects, so that avenue is closed, but routing air smoothly through the car and around it have become paramount - hence the keel or dorsal fin on the cars to stabilize the air flow to the rear wing. Ugly? Maybe. Efficient? Absolutely.
