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
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
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President's Corner





Motorsport Report

Porsche Progress

Kevin Buckler rolled the dice. Knowing that his TRG Porsche didn't have the outright speed to win the GT class in the April 24 Grand-Am race at Virginia International Raceway, he opted instead for pit strategy. After sitting out the previous round at Barber Motorsport Park, Grand-Am officials had relaxed the restrictions on the Porsche cars. Now allowed the 3.8 litre engine used by the Porsche Supercup teams, along with a weight break, the cars were still not fast enough for a head to head match up with the tube-framed Mazdas. So Buckler looked at the rule book and decided that pitting the lap before a restart would allow his team the chance to get an extra "wave around" to join the field. Although he would give up being in the same pit sequence as the other GT competitors, Buckler decided it was his only shot at a win. Caution flags were not common in the early stages of the race, but when one flew, the team manager saw his chance and gambled. And it paid off, though in the late stages of the race it was not clear that the TRG Porsche could stay in front of a rapidly closing BMW M6 driven by former Porsche pilot Bill Auberlen, and one of the Mazdas. But Andy Lally, at the wheel of the Porsche, was pushing for all he was worth. When Auberlen tried an outside pass, the Porsche and the BMW came together, with Auberlen running off into the grass. Neither Auberlen nor Lally are known for rough tactics, and it was truly just hard racing. But the gap was big enough over the now second place Mazda for Lally to take the win.


Naturally, the nay-sayers were immediately hard at work. "Well of course they won!", they said. "Grand-Am gave them a huge advantage!" But lap times don't lie, and it was only through the skill of Andy Lally, and a little bit of luck and dice action, that Porsche scored a well-deserved win.

Next up for Grand-Am is on Memorial Day weekend at Lime Rock Park.

Over in the American Le Mans Series, the Porsche GT3RSR entered by the Falken Tire company has embarrassed this reporter. Prior to the season, we opined that Porsche factory driver Wolf Henzler was wasting his time with the team. But at Sebring the car was fast—on the Falken tires—and were it not for a couple of errant wheel nuts, would have had a much better finish. At Long Beach, the next round, the Falken Porsche was again quick, showing its tail to the field for many laps after the start. It appears that Falken has a handle on their tire construction and may only lack durability for the long stints. Bravo to them. As for the Flying Lizards, a late race pass by Patrick Long around the BMW of Tom Milner (codriven by Bill Auberlen) cemented another win for the Long/Bergmeister duo—a partnership that is beginning to have the look of classic about it. Both Porsche factory drivers are earning their keep, and continue to score impressive results.

The next round for the ALMS is at Laguna Seca later on this month.

Speaking of Memorial Day weekend, we can recall being at Lime Rock as a teenager watching the IMSA Porsche Turbos of the late, great Peter Gregg and others beat up on all comers. Memorial Day was an odd event, like many at Lime Rock due to the Sunday prohibition. Lime Rock is a small town with a church right across the street from the circuit. Years of arguing with the town and church elders resulted in the agreement not to run competition events on Sunday. So Lime Rock runs their big races on the Monday of three-day weekends—unique in the world of motorsport. Qualifying on Saturday, all quiet on Sunday, race on Monday.







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
