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Plusses and Minuses

July 12th at Lime Rock saw an overall win stolen away from Porsche by one of the Acuras in ALMS LMP2. In the closing laps, the Penske Porsche RS Spyder driven by Timo Bernhard had the lead. Though hounded by the second-place Acura driven by veteran David Brabham, passing on the tight Lime Rock Park circuit is never easy – it would take a desperation move to get it done. Which is exactly what happened. Hurtling down the front straight with his Porsche ahead, Bernhard defended to the inside. Left with no option but the outside line, Brabham had momentum on his side as he swept the long way around the Porsche into the fast right-hander. Usually not prone to mistakes, Bernhard was so surprised by the Acura cutting across his bow that he promptly spun his RS Spyder, giving up all chance of a re-pass. A somewhat sheepish Bernhard said in the post race interview that he ran out of room on the inside line after Brabham "chopped" him going into the corner, but it looked a little different from the in-car view. Porsche leads the LMP2 driver, team, and manufacturer point standings.

Over in GT2, Wolf Henzler and Jorg Bergmeister scored their second-straight victory in the revitalized GT3RSR at Lime Rock. Surviving the tough scrap without a mark on the car, and with the dreaded Ferrari's never a factor, the duo worked strategy and traffic to their advantage for an excellent win.



In Grand-Am, the big news after the Brumos Porsche 250 at Daytona was not the fact that a Porsche-powered car didn't win, it was that Alex Job has thrown in the towel on his Crawford chassis. Along with the two Brumos cars, one of which finished second at Daytona, the Job team has been a stalwart Porsche campaigner since their entry into Grand Am DP competition. Substantial resources have been directed at making the Job Crawford competitive, but the Riley chassis has had the clear domination of the field; even Brumos switched to Rileys last year. The debut of new bodywork for the Crawford in June raised hopes for a resurgence, but the car was not aerodynamically efficient enough to avoid being out-classed on the faster circuits. With limited development opportunities, and likely facing pressure from sponsor Ruby Tuesday and Porsche, the Job team will bring a Riley chassis to Barber Motorsports Park later this month. No doubt the presence of Porsche management officials in the Daytona pit had something to do with the decision.

In Grand Am GT, the rules change lowering the ride height of the Porsche GT3 Cup has helped the cars become more competitive. A win at Mid-Ohio in June raised spirits for the Porsche teams, but there is always the specter of more rule changes since Grand Am politics are as arcane as Washington's.


The pool party has probably come and gone by the time you get this newsletter. I hope you made it to that one. If not, take a look at the calendar and find an event that looks good to you and come on out.

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


