







Motorsport Report

Murphy's Law at the Porsche 250

What could go wrong, did – in spades. In a bizarre series of misfortunes, Porsche was absent from the podium in both classes of the Porsche 250 presented by Legacy Credit Union on July 19 at Barber Motorsport Park.

Beginning with the first practice session on Friday, the vaunted Daytona Prototype teams of Penske and Brumos were struggling. Eleventh and twelfth place was the best the two Brumos cars could do, and the Penske team? In what can only be described as an absolute catastrophe, Romain Dumas went off the road in the number 12 Porsche Riley and destroyed the under tray of the car when it dug into the turf. Dumas injured his left foot in the process and the car needed almost a complete rebuild for Saturday's practice and qualifying.

Over in GT the Farnbacher-Loles Porsche GT3 Cup was struggling too, and driver Leh Keen was unhappy. "We've already changed springs three times," Keen said on Friday, "We're lucky it's a long weekend". Though currently leading the points with co-driver Dirk Werner, Keen had expectations of doing better than ninth after the first practice. "We're usually fast right off the truck," added Keen.

By Saturday, things were looking up, if only briefly. Penske had shipped another car in from North Carolina to be cannibalized, and the team had worked late into the night to get the primary car fixed. The crew was rewarded with second-quick in the final Saturday practice, and even spent some time at the top of the heap. The Brumos cars were still languishing at the back of the grid in practice, but David Donohue managed a time good enough for sixth place on the qualifying grid, followed by Dumas, now visibly limping from his off the day before, in seventh.

Once again, the brightest spot in the Porsche camp was the unofficial and underfunded Cayenne-based V8 of the Spirit of Daytona team. The car itself was old, the team having torn up a brand new chassis at Daytona the race before. The underdogs were fourth, fifth, and sixth quick in the three practice sessions preceding qualifying, where they scored the fifth spot – ahead of all the flat-sixes. In GT, Keen's handling problems had been mastered as he grabbed the GT pole – but only by .007 sec. ahead of the Mazda of actor Patrick Dempsey.

At the start, disaster struck Penske yet again as Dumas moved briefly over the edge of the pavement and – wait for it - dug the nose in again. This second turf encounter effectively ended their day as the Penske Porsche needed an extended stop in the pits for a new nose and other repairs. For Brumos, Law and Donohue found their rhythm and led during the mid-point of the race. Team principle Hurley Haywood thought they had a shot at the podium, but it was not to be. Not just one, but two flat tires struck the 58 during the last half of the race. They could not recover and were bitterly disappointed to finish tenth – one spot behind their teammates in the 59.

With the Penske car mired back in fifteenth spot at the finish, the only hope was the Cayenne V8 – and what a day they had. Though the race was dominated by the Pontiac-powered Riley of Alex Gurney and Jon Fogarty, the Spirit of Daytona car ran in the top five all day, and even led during pit cycles. Drivers Antonio Garcia and Buddy Rice never put a wheel wrong, and were rewarded with a fourth-place finish – the highest placing by a Porschepowered car. Even Keen and Werner in GT could manage no better than a fifth in class.

Watkins Glen is next in two weeks, and Mr. Murphy better watch out: there's a couple of teams that want to have a word with him.
