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

If you are not familiar, the scrutineers are essentially the tech inspectors for PCA Club Racing. With an eye towards ensuring safety as the first and foremost responsibility, we also make sure the cars are conforming to the PCA Club Racing rules. To a large extent, club racers are selfcertifying their cars as compliant at each event, but the scrutineers

may inspect any car at any time for any issue during an event. Scrutineers are also the eyes and ears for the National Steward of the event, the person in charge. PCA Club Racing has a strict policy regarding contact between cars on track, and anytime an incident occurs, the scrutineers are on the scene to interview the drivers, assess the damage, and ensure the drivers check in with the medical staff. We fill out a report on all of these areas, and get it to the Steward for his part of the process.

As a racing fan all of my life, I have always wanted to be involved in the action, and this year I have had my wish come true. From walking the grid as the cars line up before their session, to walking the hot pit while the cars are out on track, to tech inspection afterwards, this has been the best experience I could imagine. It is so much fun, I can't believe they let me do it. I was welcomed into the group of veteran scrutineers right away, and felt a part of the team from my first event in May at Watkins Glen. I'm looking forward to doing as many events as I can in 2016. Thank you to Cimarron's own Brian Thomas of Rennsport for giving me encouragement and coaching along the way. It has been a blast.



Best wishes in the new year, and see you at a Cimarron Region event in 2016!



The Year In Review





Cimarron Region Briefs





"Mr. Bill" Jacobi Ends 12 Year Run As Autocross Chair

Bill Jacobi says he's not going anywhere. But after heading up the Cimarron Region Autocross events for 12 years, he feels its time to confer the cones to a willing volunteer. (More on that in *The* New *Cimarron Trail*, coming in January!)

Bill and wife, Jean, began autocrossing in 2000, after acquiring a new Boxster. Dave Hughes was heading up the events at that time, at the OSU Tulsa facility. Almost immediately after the school resealed the lot, an OSU official was on hand as the autocrossers impacted the resealing job. That was understandably the end of autocross at that location.

In 2003, Bill secured use of the infield at the Tulsa Fairgrounds Fair Meadows horse racing track. The space was quite large and provided for many variable course layouts, and spirited driving. Drivers met there through 2006. Rental of that site became prohibitive when our usage cost went from \$250 to \$750. Consequently there was no Cimarron Region autocross during the 2007 season.



By 2008, Bill had found another location at Tulsa Community College's Southeast Campus, near 81st St. and US 169, where events were held for 2 years until, once again, their lot was resealed, and permission to use that site was rescinded.

But also in 2010, Bill contacted Dave Ortenburger, property manager at our present site, Corporate Woods. After completing a trial period to study feasibility of our use, the region has now completed 5 years of autocross events at that location! Bill hopes that excellent relationship will continue for many years to come.

Summing it all up, Bill commented, "I have had the honor and privilege for about 12 years. It's been fun, but I could not have done it without the help of all our great members and fellow autocrossers. A special shout out to Brian Thomas, Gary Bernard, and most recently George and Mike Fugate."





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Motorsports Update

A Year To Remember


As a racing fan, every January you look at your favorite cars, drivers, or teams, and hope for the best. The optimistic side of us tends to put a happy face on even iffy situations, but we always hope for the best. Never in our wildest imaginings could we have hoped for a season in Motorsport like Porsche has had in 2015. In fact, we'd bet that this year will be viewed in hindsight as one of the best ever for the marque: World Championships in WEC for both the 919 Hybrid in LMP1 and the 911 in the GTE Pro divisions; and championships in the IMSA GT class here in the States, and multiple victories all around the globe. It never got boring, it never got old – the sight of Porsche dominance is a rare enough occurrence to be fascinating right to the end.

But it wasn't easy. The 919 had a remarkable record of poles, wins, and podiums, but each race was a challenge and not without nail-biting finishes. The finale at Bahrain was a perfect example. With the championship leading number 17 encountering electrical issues early on, the evolution of the race strategy and the pressure of the response by Audi was breathtaking. Had not Audi encountered their own problems, we might not be celebrating a Driver's World Championship for Messrs. Webber, Bernhard, and Hartley today. That is the character of Porsche – never give up, find a way, do your job.

In 2016, Porsche will likely face stiffer opposition. Toyota stopped development work on their 2015 car early on in order to focus on next season. The 2014 manufacturers champion was embarrassed in 2015, and will not rest until they are on the sharp end of the grid once more. Audi has already launched their car for next year, a new R18. It looks very slick and they will move up their energy level to the 6 mega-joule category, from 4mj this year. We're sure Porsche has not been sleeping, and development continues on the 919 – no doubt reliability will be high on their list. The last we knew the GT program was in limbo as Manthey Racing is moving to another manufacturer next year, so we'll have to wait and see. Porsche will be back next year in IMSA, although without the crowd favorite Falken Tire team. We'll leave the full preview for another column – suffice to say it should be very exciting.

Those following the cheating scandal involving VW diesel engines might be wondering if there will be any impact on Porsche Motorsport activities. VW is facing potentially huge financial penalties – we're talking billions in fines and compensation payments – and has already begun scaling back some corporate activities. The recent word from Porsche Motorsport leadership is that their budgets are safe and should not be affected. One wonders however if the rumored move into F1 by VW or Audi will forever remain a rumor. The new head of the VW Group is the former CEO for Porsche, so we should have an edge when it comes to the chopping block. Porsche also provides VW's highest profit per unit, which bodes well for a hands-off policy.
