
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Happy New Year Cimarron Region Members!

Our autocrosses will once again be held on the parking lot at Corporate Woods, located at 4500 S. 129th East Ave. Tulsa. We have the use of this lot from 8:30 am to 12:00 noon on Sundays.

As in the past, we will begin setting up cones at around 8:30, and begin auto crossing at 9:30. We <u>will</u> be finished by noon or sooner. This lot had a sealer applied in September, and should be all healed up by our first event.


The dates marked with an asterisk are counting event days. We will use (8) of your best counting days for scoring. You can miss two of the (10) counting event days without being affected. Scoring will be the same as in 2014. Counting events will be \$10 per event, practices/clinics, will be free.

The balance of the days will be for practice, clinics, or weather make up, if possible. Any member who attends at least five counting (5) events, will receive a 2015 autocross shirt at the Christmas Party. Hope to see all the old faces plus

many new faces. A helmet is required for auto crossing, we do have a couple of loaners.

For you new members, lack of prior autocross experience should not keep you away; more experienced drivers will ride with you if you wish. Auto crossing should not damage your Porsche if it is in good working order. This is a good opportunity to get to know your car in preparation for Mayfast. Let's see some lady members at the autocross events, you should not break any nails. Might however, mess up your hair a little. 


Bob Miller Remembers

Our Lifetime member looks back almost 50 years



Some of you may not know our region was originally named "War Bonnet," in the days before Northeastern Oklahoma's own Cimarron Region was born. Back



then you could open the engine compartment on your Porsche and actually see the engine! And you could perform many of your own services, repairs, upgrades, and more. All it took was a bit of knowledge and mechanical ability. Member Al Williams wanted owners to be able to do more on their cars, so the first War Bonnet Tech was staged in March of 1969, at the home of Al and Georgia Williams.

Day one began during an ice storm, but 22 Porsches from various parts of the state attended. PCA Technical Committee Chair, Roger Chaney, literally *slid* in from Fort Worth, and supervised the installation of a throw-out bearing on Don Grogan's car. He then adjusted several carburetors, set some timing, while those in attendance helped and learned. Georgia served a memorable lunch.

Tech Two occurred the next year on March 7 and 8, again at the Williams home. Roger Chaney reappeared to educate all who came, performing hands on work on their Porsches. Attendees assembled in the evening at the Planet Inn, where many out-of-towners were staying, and enjoyed the hotel club with adult beverages available, and door prize presentations.

The ensuing three years Tech was held at the shipping facility of Furrow & Company Greenhouses, a firm I managed. Multiple sessions were offered concurrently for the first time, covering an array of topics of mechanical interest. Roger Chaney continued to be a fixture at the events, and Chuck Stoddard amazed attendees with his remarkable memory for Porsche part numbers.

Over a decade after our first Tech event, Tech Tactics in Zone 1, and Rain Bonnet in Oregon, would "board the Tech bandwagon" after numerous *Panorama* articles, written by Betty Jo Turner on our War Bonnet sessions, helped the idea gain notoriety.

Our next several Tech events were held at hotels in Oklahoma City and Tulsa. Notable speakers included: Dr. Bob White, Bruce Anderson, Peter Gregg, Bob Guldstrand, Ed Mayo, Al Zim, Tom Charlesworth, Bill Burris, John Paterek, and others from the automotive industry. Tech had grown to offering three sessions each hour, covering topics of member interest. Also added was a vendor area and club store.

At the Lake o' The Ozarks Parade

in 1983, Bob White arranged a meeting with me and Helmut Bott, head of Weissach. From that discussion. Bott attended in 1984 and was so impressed he suggested we needed a contest, developed by his engineers who would be attending. Wolfhelm Gorisson, Hans Metzger, Tony Lapine, and significant Weissach contributors participated for the next 10 years. The contest awards were amazing: Indy car valve covers, art work from the Porsche archives released only by executive approval, and engine blocks for contest events.

For about 26 years, War Bonnet Tech was the event that started major PCA Spring events in this part of the country. It happened during the years owners could do many things to their cars, once a little knowledge was obtained. It was truly an event for the benefit of all members, whether attending or reading about its programs in Panorama. Tech was a fun Saturday experience. evening banquets would include spoofs on the factory, and any attendee. Perhaps the most memorable was "Sandsach," a spoof regarding the desert-like facility purportedly established by the factory. The attending engineer loved it, but the PCA national president shocked! Fortunately, he did attend the following year.

The icing on the cake came with recognition of Tech's 25th Anniversary. Professor Ferry Porsche stated, "Thank you for 25 years of support and enthusiasm to Porsche, the marque and the family. My best to you and your anniversary."

Motorsports Update

The Very Bad, Horrible, No Good Day

Rule No. 1 in sports car endurance racing: "Don't take out your team-mate." While the exact cause of the collision between the two Porsche GTLM 911 RSRs during the Rolex 24 at Daytona might be debatable, the results were not – massive damage to both cars. The video (check it out at motorsport.com) shows the number 912 of Earl Bamber exiting the very fast infield *Kink*, and taking evasive action into the grass to avoid a slower car. So far so good. But by the time Bamber arrived at the next corner, still in the grass, he had no steering or braking control on the wet turf. As the sister car driven by Marc Lieb turned into the corner, whammo came the 912, taking out both cars. Extensive repairs were made, but the 912 eventually retired. The 911 soldiered on to the end, finishing in 5th place. How'd you like to be in that team meeting?

The Falken Tire number 17, as they did at last Fall's Petite Le Mans, was doing reasonably well and appeared to be Porsche's best remaining hope in the GTLM class, until the engine oil exited the vehicle around mid-morning. Crankcase issues were the stated cause, meaning the crankcase failed to keep the oil contained. Scratch any hope of a decent finish in that class.

With nine Porsches entered in the GTD class, there was at least a little hope for a victory there. One of the Porsches, the number 44 Magnus Racing 911 GT



America driven by Andy Lally, John Potter, Marco Seefried, and Martin Ragginger, was having a decent run – not the fastest, but not the slowest. They'd had some transmission issues but were hopeful it would hold together until the end. It did, that is until Lally punched an opossum. Really, you can't make this stuff up. Opossums are not overly large animals, but a collision at speed can do damage, and since this one zeroed in on the center radiator of the Porsche like a homing, well, opossum, the damage was considerable. Lally took the car straight to the garage for an unhappy chore by the mechanics. The Porsche returned, but many laps down and out of contention.

What could go wrong, did, and at the end, the best finish Porsche could manage was 2nd place in GTD with the Alex Job Racing 911 GT America driven by Leh Keen, Andrew Davis, Cooper MacNeil and Shane van Gisbergen. Even this finish was not without unpleasantness as Keen developed stomach flu in the car overnight and the other drivers had to cope with the consequences.

On the plus side, in the preliminary event to the 24 hours, the Continental Tire Sports Car Challenge, Porsches were victorious in both classes. But the 24 is the Big Show and truthfully, we got skunked. Or maybe opossumed. Turn the page and move on, secure in the knowledge that we've already had more than our share of bad luck in 2015. Next up will be the 12 Hours of Sebring on March 21st. Cross your fingers, avoid ladders, don't break any mirrors, and just maybe we'll have something to cheer about.
