






burn.



Motorsports Update

Oh! Where to Begin?



By the time you (hopefully) read this, we will be on the cusp of the start of the 24 Hours of Le Mans. We are not reliable when it comes to predictions here at Motorsport Report, but we will say this – based upon the podium finishes for Porsche at the first two events of the year, hopes are running high. We're not sure what the Las Vegas odds are, but we might even take a little of that action. Reading "European Windows" in *Panorama*, we have the sense that Porsche is all in this year, and perhaps used the first two events of the 2015 season as shakedown runs for the biggest prize of all – the 24 Hours. Clearly the 919 has straight line speed. Using 8 mega-joules of recovered energy, the Porsche Hybrid is scary fast. Any weakness, at least at Silverstone and Spa, seemed to be tire life and downforce. While the Audis would outperform the 919 in the corners, Porsche would blow right by them once on the straight. It was a sight to behold! Swapping positions lap after lap while the drivers optimized their cars' strengths, and worked to minimize their weaknesses, led to some of the best motor racing seen in years. And clean – nary a fender was used to gain an advantage. Both early events seemed to come down to tire management and the related pit strategy. We will see what transpires at Le Circuit de la Sarthe, but our money is on Porsche, of course.

What of GT? A troublesome year so far with only a handful of wins in some of the minor classes. Porsche's competitors, chief among them Ferrari, Aston Martin, Lamborghini, Corvette and McLaren, have done their work and are formidable foes. While in the Pirelli World Challenge, the GTA class winner at the start of season drove a Porsche GT3R, Michael Lewis has since been moved to the top -tier GT class for being too good. Career progression for Lewis, part of Porsche's Young Driver Program, but now he's faced with butting heads against the Cadillacs, Acuras, and the other aforementioned makes. Teamed with Ryan Dalziel on the Effort Racing Porsche team, Lewis may yet shine.

For the other GT opportunities, Porsche must rein in the self-defeating mistakes of drivers (Bamber at Daytona) and mechanical ills that have plagued the cars (everywhere else). There is no doubt that the current generation of 911 RSR is fast, but the different teams here in the US and in Europe have yet to put it all together. And Le Mans, for the GTE PRO cars, will not be easy. Once again, expect to see a tooth-and-nail battle with Ferrari and Aston Martin. The Porsche factory-supported team of Manthey Racing (previous Le Mans winners in GT) knows how to get the job done, but it will require some *bon chance*. In GTE AM, most eyes here stateside will likely be on the team of actor Patrick Dempsey and Porsche factory driver Pat Long. Dempsey is a true believer and has been to Le Mans before, but given his difficulties at Spa, the team may have a long 24 hours.

Like the sun rising in the east, the 911's difficulties once again raise rumblings of the end of development for the rear-engine design. Porsche has been hard at work on various versions of the mid-engine Cayman, but as yet has not committed to that platform as the face of the factory GT effort. While Aston Martin and Corvette make the front-engine balance work, one could argue that it is up to the rules makers to find a healthy compromise of design and performance. We for one would hate to see the end of the historic run of that ole flat 6 hanging out the back, but times change and we need to change with them. Here's to all the drivers and teams at Le Mans – let's have a safe 24 Hours!
