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
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



Building Your Dream Car One Man's Journey

We wrap up our series on John McDermott's hot rod 911 with the details those little touches that make the difference between ho-hum and ka-pow. And as you can see, John's car is Ka-Pow!



All of the glass is now in along with the black window trim. Paint has been polished but still awaits the final clean and shine until the interior is finished. The car is sitting on its new wheels and tires for the first time. I really like the way the frosted RSR wheels look against the arrow blue paintwork. Makes my old scratched and faded lug nuts look terrible though.

Good sound is a relative thing. In a 911 with little to no soundproofing, lightweight carpet, no cat and a 2-in 2-out muffler there is no point in aiming for audiophile quality sound. I will be happy if it produces pleasant noise.





I just cleaned up the tire sidewalls then took my trusty model-making paintbrush and delicately painted the lettering with KILZ interior/exterior primer. I just like the look of painted sidewall lettering. Must be the shameless cafe racer in me I guess.



Light weight? Right down to the door handles. I saw the drilled door handles that TRE Motorsports did on the Fraise RSR and could not resist them. I hope they understand that imitation is the ultimate form of flattery.

I made no modifications to the muffler. It is a stock M&K sport muffler painted with high temp flat white paint. Probably not the most durable finish but I just love the look of white pipes sticking out the back. With the standard pipes and the stock bumpers the end of the pipe did not protrude past the bumper. Pulling the bumper back makes the pretty pipes more visible.



The ducktail took quite a bit of shaping to fit but the effort seems to have been worthwhile.



The finished product! I have ended up with exactly the 911 I wanted, from the exterior color selected by pouring over 30 years of production color charts, to the hound's-tooth interior and down to the finest of details. Sort of a retro cafe racer without the expense and potential complications of a backdate. It has been a really fun project and I hope others are encouraged to do the same.

And just to prove that this car is no "garage queen", the first track day at Hallett.

On Saturday, September 11, the Cimarron Region Porsche Club attended an invitation-only visit to the Zink Ranch. Twenty-seven members attended with nineteen Porsches of all ages making the trek out from Downtown Tulsa. The day was somewhat damp, weather-wise, but the trip was well worth it for the twisty roads, the view from the top of the hill at Zink Ranch, and the museum.

John "Jack" Zink was a Tulsa businessman and philanthropist. He was also a twotime winner as car owner of the Indianapolis 500, a racer himself, and a friend of Ferry Porsche. Zink expanded the ranch, started by his father in the 1940's, and developed it into a 32,000 acre site dedicated to conservationism and both boy and girl scout activities.

The grounds are beautiful and the museum is elegant. It is filled with memorabilia from John Zink's life, his conservation activities, industrial successes, and his racing exploits.

The car below is the 1958 Race of Two Worlds winner. The event took place on the high-banked Monza track in Italy. This car was driven by Jim Rathmann to a 166.756 mph average speed.

After the race at Monza in 1958, Ferry Porsche heard that John Zink, the two-time Indianapolis 500 winning car owner was in Europe, and wanted to get him to try one of his cars. Zink was uncertain at first about the fancy sport cars that Porsche built, but relented and was suitably impressed by the car he drove. This early 356 rests in the museum as testament to the connection between the two pioneers. "Rest" may be a relative term though—it has a current tag on it... 

Petit Preview

With a deeper entry list than might have been expected, the 2010 Petit Le Mans at Road Atlanta on October 1-2, is shaping up to be a classic event. The diesel powerhouses of Peugeot and Audi will be on hand, and headline a 45car field.

It's hard to imagine a mix of 45 cars getting around Road Atlanta, the famously fast circuit in the Georgia hills, without incident. Couple the four different classes of cars, from the ultra-quick diesels to the GT Challenge Porsche Cup cars, the rates of top speed, overtaking, braking and cornering speed will make for an action-filled event. Hopefully the carnage from the last round at Mosport will not carry over to this race. The sight of a prototype hip-checking a Porsche Cup into the barrier at 150 mph was not a pretty one. Fortunately, the driver was okay, but the race had to be called because the Armco could not be repaired in the time allotted.

While the Audi/Peugeot battle will be fascinating to watch, the race marks a significant debut for the Porsche GT3R Hybrid. The car has competed three times this year, including at the Nurburgring 24 Hours where it turned heads by running in the top three for most of the race. Unfortunately the Hybrid, laboring under the increased weight of the regenerative system, suffered an engine failure an hour and 50 minutes shy of the 24 hour distance. This will be the North American debut.

No doubt the forensics have been done on the corpse, and improvements made, for this is what Porsche does best—bringing innovative engineering to the race track. A class win is not in the offing as the GT3R Hybrid has not been homologated, but we can expect a victory of sorts if the car finishes the 10 hour/1000 mile Petit Le Mans well up in the order.

The Hybrid will be piloted by Porsche stalwarts Romain Dumas, Timo Bernhard, and former Porsche factory driver, and Le Mans winner, Mike Rockenfeller.
