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

#### **President's Perspective - March 2015**

It's been an interesting month here in Cimarron Region, and we have lots of news. Our intrepid newsletter editor, Greg Petzet, will have some items further along in this issue of Cimarron Trail, but I want to cover a few things here.

On Saturday, February 21, Joy and I attended the Zone 5 meeting held this year in Jenks. As a rookie Cimarron president, it was a great opportunity to meet the other region presidents in Zone 5 and compare notes, discuss issues, ask questions, and generally learn about being an effective officer for our membership. The meeting was hosted by the Zone 5 representative, Lynn Friedman, and she did a great job. If you've never had the chance to meet Lynn, she is a tireless PCA volunteer, very enthusiastic and dedicated to our mission. Lynn provided information on many topics including region management, conduct of events, safety, and managing social media.

There were several guest presenters including R.J. Wilmoth, PCA Historian and Archivist, and Tom Gorsuch, PCA Vice President. R.J. provided a wonderful slide show on some of the collection he is in charge of organizing, with many vintage photos and documents from the earliest days of PCA. R.J. is working on a presentation for Parade later this year in honor of PCA's 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary. If you are headed to Parade, don't miss this exhibition.

Tom briefed the gathered officers on recent activities of the National Board of Directors and the Executive Council. It was interesting to get the perspective of a National official on where PCA has been and where it is headed. While not all of the news from Tom was upbeat, most of it was very positive for the future of PCA. Tom's previous role was National Treasurer and he spoke at length about the importance of the recent adoption of the Manual of National Policy and Procedure – Finance Section, or MNPP for short. This document will help guide the financial future of PCA for many years to come, and thanks to Cimarron Region member Bob Miller who was part of the MNPP development team.



Many of you have attended PCA's Parade in the past and this year's version is shaping up to be memorable. Joy and I have not yet made the trip to one of these classics but it is certainly on

our bucket list. Parade is in French Lick, Indiana this year and should be an easy trip for those of us in the central U.S. One particular feature of this year's Parade is recognizing the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the club and Parade. Part of this celebration is the 60 for 60 program which will gather together a representative Porsche from each model year of the 60 years. Rumor has it there may be a Cimarron Region member's car on display, but National is playing the selection process very close to the vest. We'll see, and good luck! 
One area of discussion during the Zone meeting deserves mention here and that is the issue of safety and risk management. PCA has an excellent insurance program for "moving car events" – one that has been reasonably priced and very successful. But it will only continue to be successful if we all participate in being aware of PCA policy and minimizing our exposure to risky activities. While we have strict policies for track events such as DE and Club Racing, and competitive events like autocross, some of the most exposure occurs during street driving events and tours. PCA and Porsche policy both require compliance with all traffic laws while operating our favorite vehicles. While it may be tempting to stretch our cars legs, so to speak, we have to remember that while on a PCA-organized event, we represent both our Club and our marque. As happened recently in another state, the media loves to label Porsche owners as speed-crazed maniacs and will not hesitate to portray us as such in any accident or law enforcement encounter. Remember, our club works very hard to provide events where you can test yourself and your cars limits. Autocross, DE, and Club Racing provide the only avenues for PCA-sanctioned speed events.

Things will begin to heat up in the Cimarron Region world soon, and we hope to see you at an upcoming event. The autocross season begins on March 8 at the Corporate Woods site with a practice event. Having done autocross in the past, I can tell you that it is F - U - N. There is no better way to learn about driving than through navigating a course of cones with your Porsche steering wheel in your hands. While there is a time element to autocross, it is not about speed. There is more finesse involved than speed and you learn about brakes, taking the proper line through corners, and throttle application. Some people are intimidated by the concept of autocross, not wanting to look "silly" or unskilled, but we have a great autocross group in Cimarron Region whose only interest is in helping you enjoy your cars. Take the plunge and join us, won't you? On March  $21^{st}$ , we will host the New Member event in Oologah. Our interest is in welcoming our new members and introducing them to all of the fun things that we do. Data shows that the first two years are critical for new members as they navigate the new world of PCA membership. Everyone is welcome, so let's show our new folks how much fun being a Porsche owner can be.



### **Cimarron Region Ladies Luncheon**






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### Looking Way Ahead





#### Autocrossers Unite! Two Practice Sessions Set For March 8 & 22

Come one, come all! Our Cimarron Region Autocross season will kick off with two practice sessions this month, weather permitting. Events will once again be held on the parking lot behind Corporate Woods, located at 4500 S. 129<sup>th</sup> East Ave, Tulsa. We have the use of this lot from 8:30 am to 12:00 noon on Sundays. As in the past, we will begin setting up cones at around 8:30, and begin autocrossing about 9:30. We <u>will</u> be finished by noon or sooner. Practice sessions are FREE! Often times, drivers assemble for a late breakfast afterward.

Autocross is an excellent way to learn car control, driving the proper "line" around the course, and optimum braking and cornering techniques, all on a safe, closed course. It's just you and your Porsche alone through the cones. As in past years, we expect to see Porsches of every type, 356s to the latest incarnation, including Cayennes and Macans. Members may also bring their Chevys, Fords, Ferraris, Yugos, or any other make, but only Porsches qualify for the season long points tally. Official "counting" events begin April 12. A helmet is required, and we have a few loaners available.

Every experienced driver is willing to "show you the ropes" and help familiarize you with autocross. Don't miss this opportunity to have fun driving your Porsche, and schmooze with your fellow enthusiasts! Whether you're a seasoned veteran who tosses your car through the course, or a driver new to the event, you'll learn something every time, your day-to-day driving skill will improve, and all while you're having a great time! 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


### 40 PCAers Spice Up Arthrell's 10th Annual Chili / Bunco Fest


At least 10 chili concoctions graced the tasting

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## **PCA Zone 5 Presidents Meet**

#### **Cimarron Region Hosts Annual Gathering**

Special guests, Tom Gorsuch, PCA National Vice-President, and R.J. Wilmoth, PCA National Historian/Archivist, highlighted proceedings at the yearly Zone 5 Presidents meeting, held in Tulsa, Oklahoma on February 21. Zone 5 is made up of 12 regions, and encompasses most of Texas and Oklahoma, and all of Arkansas and Louisiana.

Lynn Friedman, PCA Zone 5 Rep, conducted the all-day program. Regional attendees included:

Kirk Bristol, Ark-La-Tex president; Jon and Joy Jones, Cimarron president and treasurer, respectively; Brvan Kerrick, Coastal Bend president; Tracey Gross, Hill Country president; Jack Merrell, Longhorn president; Jim Falgout and Wendy Shoffit (with husband, James), Maverick president and Secretary, respectively: Dan Crossett and Staton Breidenthal, Ozark president and vicepresident, respectively; and Grady Buckhalter and Matt Herndon, War Bonnet president and vice president, respectively.



There were certainly more "hats" than heads on hand, as many PCAers take on multiple voluntary roles in addition to being officers.

Tom Gorsuch, Florida Space Coast region member and National VP, spoke at length, touching on an array of points from a National PCA perspective. Subjects included the importance of adherence to the PCA Code of Ethics and Conduct, and following procedures for properly obtaining event insurance and the completion of waiver forms. Special emphasis on delivering information during safety briefings for tours, drives, and dinners, especially as it relates to alcohol consumption. PCA prohibits alcoholic beverages during these events. Participants should be informed that the insurance is in effect only during the drive, until it ends at a restaurant, for example. Those wishing to then consume alcohol should understand PCA will not be held accountable for any unfortunate incidents following the conclusion of the actual drive. Additionally, descriptive terms like "spirited drive" denote illegal speeding, and should be avoided when referring to a tour or drive. PCA Driver Education, Autocross events, and Club Racing provide numerous opportunities to "stretch it out" in a safe environment intended for such purpose.

R.J. Wilmoth, Longhorn region member and National Museum Curator/Historian/Archivist, presented a slideshow with his narration, reaching back to the infancy of PCA. Included were actual scanned photos from the first two Parades in Washington, D.C. (Gaithersburg, MD) in 1956 & 1957. R.J. is compiling a plethora of historical memorabilia for display at Porsche Parade in June. (That alone will be worth the trip to French Lick!)

Many facets of PCA business were discussed prior to adjournment, and then zone reps met for dinner at the home of Randy and Elinor Kaplin. To end the festivities, everyone drove to a nearby private automobile collection, where dessert was served while folks admired a variety of fine cars, including Porsches and other historic marques.

The 2016 Zone 5 Presidents Meeting will be held about the same time next year, location yet to be decided.

## Is Mayfast For You?

Have you recently joined PCA? Are you a long time member who loves Porsches? Either way, it's possible you've heard about Mayfast Driver Education, but for one reason or another, you've never attended.

You probably figure the law enforcement community takes more than normal notice when they see a sports car on the road. Porsches look fast even when they're parked! So it is



really hard to explore the potential capabilities of your Porsche when you're out on the streets and highways. How is one supposed to truly learn the best time to brake, the most efficient way to take corners, when to aggressively accelerate? Knowing these aspects of driving and handling your Porsche are most important, not only in order to heighten your motoring enjoyment, but more critically to do so in a safe manner.

Where could you possibly find a safe, controlled environment, and an experienced driver to teach you the ins and outs of driving your prized possession? Where could you go to not have to worry about being pulled over for speeding, or reckless driving?

#### Mayfast! That's where!

Our Cimarron Region's Mayfast Driver Education, May 2-3, at Hallett Motor Racing Circuit offers all that, and more! Hallett is a wonderful track, 1.8 miles in length, with 10 turns. At Mayfast, drivers are split into 5 groups according to their experience level. You'll share the track with a limited number of other drivers who are also learning the ropes. First-timers, or novices, are required to sit in on a classroom session Saturday morning. You'll learn to see the most efficient "line" around the track, proper cornering techniques, where you may pass, or NOT pass other cars, and how to go about it. Signal flags, which tell you of track conditions: when to go, when to stop, when to slow down, when your last lap begins, etc., will be explained. Safety is paramount at all PCA driving events.



After class, you will be accompanied by an instructor. You and your fellow novices will make several laps of the track at reduced speeds while you and your instructor discuss braking zones, turning points, when to accelerate, spotting corner workers and signal flags, and so on. During these initial laps, you will begin to feel your car's potential. And as you accumulate "track time," your driving knowledge and skill will grow by leaps and bounds.

You will have opportunities to drive several 15-20 minute sessions each day. It is important to keep in mind Mayfast is not a race, it's Driver Education! Progress at your own pace, become "one" with your Porsche, and most of all, have fun!

(Editor's note: I shied away from DE for years, concerned with the wear and tear on my Porsche. When I finally participated, I wondered why I'd waited so long. So although I drive somewhat conservatively at Hallett, always saying, "I have to drive it <u>TO</u> the track, then back home <u>FROM</u> the track, I can say without reservation, "you gotta do it!")

#### Is Mayfast For Me?...

My Porsche story began back in the 1970s, just after high school graduation. I had been a sportycar fan, owned a "hot" Camaro for awhile, and later some Datsun/Nissan Z cars. One of my numerous jobs prior to a 30+ year career at American Airlines was warehousing at the Jimmie Jones Company, welding supplies. The bigwig at the location was John Conine. His family, along with the Swabs, ran the Porsche/Audi dealership on South Memorial. John would tool to work in a variety of Porsches, mostly 911s if I recall correctly. Two accountants at Jones founded the "Auto Flea Market" for awhile, on the parking lot in front of the Caravan Ballroom at 41st and Memorial. They would display cars for sale by private owners for a weekly fee. I "moonlighted" at their place, and dusted off the cars, and occasionally took owners home after they dropped off their cars for sale. One day a man brought in a '73 911 Targa with Sportomatic transmission to display on the lot. I was asked to ride back to his house with him, and then bring the Porsche back to the lot. It was that day over 40 years ago I said to myself, "Someday I'm going to have one of these." Long story short, 30 years later my dream came true, and Pam and I found exactly the Porsche we (I) wanted in Atlanta, GA, a guards red 1987 Carrera w/45,000 miles. I treated it like a newborn baby. Specks of dust were never welcome. It never saw rain. Surprisingly I didn't wash off the paint, although my neighbors likely thought I was trying. And sure, I'd give it a goose and drive it somewhat spiritedly now and then, but it spent a lot of time in



my garage. After all, it signified the culmination of a dream, and I wasn't willing to take any chances. If "Lil' Red" could have spoken to me, I'm certain it would have been in German, "Treiben die Porsche!" That was May/2004.

#### ... A Resounding YES!

5 years later I realized you don't leave a race horse

in the stable. Like a Thoroughbred is born to race, your Porsche hungers for the track! Besides, being on the track in a controlled environment with a handful of drivers with the same



goals as you is actually safer than driving on the streets with all those texters, cell phone talkers, law enforcement professionals, etc.

But still a bit apprehensive, I signed up for Mayfast 2009. Arriving at the track on Saturday morning, I attended the Novice class, which quickly went a long way to putting me more at ease. Then I climbed into my baby with qualified, seasoned driver and instructor, Earl Schott, in the passenger seat. During the first three laps at almost "school zone" speed, he calmly offered pointers and directions one at a time, patiently bringing me along bit by bit, until I gained a little know-how and increased confidence. Then, approaching the start/ finish line, we got the green flag, and I was hooked! I knew then I wasn't playing the *Pole* 

*Position* video game anymore!

I could try, but there aren't enough words to describe what it's like to navigate your Porsche around that circuit. Attention and alertness reach all





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### Motorsports Update

Heresy

Here at Motorsports Report, we generally don't celebrate the efforts of the competition. But something happened last month that, as a racing purist, warrants some attention. Nissan launched their World Endurance Championship LMP1 HY car in a commercial during the Super Bowl. While spy shots had appeared, most notably from secret testing at the Circuit of the Americas, the roll out of this car was a shock. Not that Nissan entering the WEC was especially earth-shattering, they'd been rumored to be considering it for some time, it was the car that was notable. Designed by Ben Bowlby of Deltawing fame, this car represents a radical interpretation of the ACO LMP rules. And a radical racing machine it is. The car is a front-engine design, and while the engine location is farther aft than your average Altima, it is still unorthodox in today's motorsport world. Last seen in the Panoz LMP-1 "aircraft carrier" cars of the '90s, the design is generally undesirable from a weight distribution standpoint. The car is also front-wheel drive. More correctly, all-wheel drive, but the front tires carry the bulk of the drive power. Long-time IMSA fans might remember the front-wheel drive Dodge Daytona in GTU in the '80s with their odd-ball big front tires, but this concept was abandoned shortly thereafter. Because it didn't work. Now here we are in 2015 and there it is again. What's the saying, "what's old is new again"?

Looking at the Nissan there is a very good reason for the radical design. According to Bowlby, it allows the design to duct the air from the front of the car *through* the body work via enclosed ducts. The front engine allows space to route the air around the engine, down alongside the driver's compartment, and out the back. The front drive arrangement allows narrower rear tires to be used which frees up space for the ducts and associated air flow. The Hybrid component of the car drives the front tires, along with the twin-turbo V6, but also the rear tires under certain

circumstances – most notably when the car is stable exiting a corner. This stability is important since Nissan is reportedly shooting for the 8 mega-joule hybrid category, the highest allowed under LMP rules. Where does the engine exhaust go, you ask? Why, out the top of the engine cover, naturally.



This is such an interesting LMP concept that we just can't wait to see it race. And while we hope Porsche wins, this is a testament to WEC and what racing should be about. F1 used to welcome innovation and novel designs; Indianapolis used to welcome the small operator or the genius designer, but they are both more spec series than not. Congratulations to the ACO and WEC for allowing such innovation.

- Porsche factory driver Earl Bamber has been promoted to the third 919 for Spa and Le Mans. Apparently his indiscretion at Daytona didn't cause a crisis in confidence in the Porsche camp.
- Pre-season testing of the new 919 at Bahrain and Abu Dhabi went well, according to Porsche. Despite sandstorms and other factors the team sounds upbeat about the new version of the car, Porsche having addressed understeer and drivability issues. The cars will be on track at the WEC Prologue on March 27-28 at Paul Ricard. The first race is April 12<sup>th</sup> at Silverstone.
