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

PENSKE RACING, FLYING LIZARD MOTORSPORTS CLINCH 2008 AMERICAN LE MANS SERIES CHAMPI-ONSHIPS FOR PORSCHE; RS SPYDERS SWEEP LMP2 PODIUM AT PETIT LE MANS

The Porsche RS Spyder/Acura prototype pilots battle inLMP2 and the rivalry between the Porsche 911 GT3 RSR and the Ferrari 430 drivers in GT2 – a season-long affair – ended happily for the German sports car manufacturer as Penske Racing and Flying Lizard Motorsports drivers took their Porsches to year-end American LeMans Series championships at the 11th running of Petit Le Mans at Road Atlanta.

The Penske Racing Porsche RS Spyder driven by Timo Bernhard (Germany) and Romain Dumas (France) wrapped up their second straight LMP2 drivers championship by finishing second in the 1000-mile event. They finished behind teammates Ryan Briscoe (Australia) and Helio Castroneves (Brazil), who drove their Penske Porsche RS Spyder to the LMP2 victory, and finished fourth overall. Completing the sweep of the LMP2 podium was the third Penske Porsche RS Spyder, driven by Patrick Long (USA), Sascha Maassen (Germany) and Emmanuel Collard (France). In fact, Porsche RS Spyders took five of the top six places in LMP2 with Butch Leitzinger/Andy Lally (both USA) and Marino Franchitti (Scotland) fourth in their Dyson Racing Porsche, and Guy Smith (England)/ Chris Dyson (USA) Dyson Racing Porsche sixth.

In GT2, the year-long battle between the Flying Lizard Motorsports Porsche 911 GT3 RSR of Joerg Bergmeister/ Wolf Henzler (both Germany) and the Tafel Racing Ferrari 430 of Dirk Mueller/Dominik Farnbacher (also both Germany) ended in favor of the Lizards at Petit LeMans. Bergmeister and Henzler, along with help from fellow Porsche factory driver Marc Lieb (Germany), finished second in class, three laps ahead of the Ferrari, to earn Flying Lizards their first ALMS title. The Porsche drivers now have 181 points, while the Ferrari pair have scored 150. The final event at Laguna Seca in Monterey has 25 points available to win.

Both Penske Racing and Flying Lizard Motorsports clinched their respective class team championships as well, while Porsche is in the drivers seat for both manufacturers titles. Earlier in the weekend, Porsche won its second straight SCCA SPEED World Challenge title as Randy Pobst (USA) drove his K-PAX/3R Racing Team Porsche 911 GT3 Cup earned a repeat championship. Porsche had clinched the manufacturers championship the week before over Cadillac, Corvette, Viper, and Aston Martin.

"This championship was even more special than last year because Acura provided such stiff competition," said Bernhard, who has won drivers titles in both LMP2 and GT2 with Porsche. "Acura came to the series this year with the full resources of the Honda factory, and pressed us to the limit, but Penske Racing and Porsche Motorsport responded with improved performance, a new direct injection 3.4-liter V8 engine, perfect car preparation and strategy, and teamwork that makes a champion," said Bernhard.

While Joerg Bergmeister (Grand-Am DP champion, multi-time ALMS GT2 champion, and Porsche Supercup title-holder) and Wolf Henzler (multi-time Porsche Supercup champion) are used to winning races and championships, they agreed that this one was special.

"This Flying Lizard team really works hard, and we are proud to help them earn their first championship. Preparing three cars is a difficult task, but everyone from all three crews contributed to this season's successes. And we wanted to give special thanks to Porsche Motorsport for their work over the winter that resulted in a greatly-improved race car that helped us beat the Ferraris," said Bergmeister.

"With the team have to rebuild both the #44 and #46 cars at the track overnight after practice crashes, they still spent the time and expertise to prepare our #45 Porsche so we could run perfectly for a ten-hour event. I've never been on a team with such dedication." said Henzler.



Cimarron Region, Inc. Board of Directors Meeting

September 8, 2008

The Board of Directors meeting was called to order at Rennsport. Present were Gary Bernard, Jay Jackson, John Shafer, Lynne Bernard, Greg Petzet, Bill Jacobi, Earl Schott, and Bob Dodd.

- <u>Minutes</u> The minutes from the August meeting were presented to the Board for review and approval. On the motion by Bill, seconded by Jay, the Board unanimously approved the minutes.
- <u>President's Report</u> Gary will continue recruiting a nominating committee for 2009 officers. Voting will be accomplished electronically. Gary made a motion to approve funds of \$25-30 for 2008 board gifts. Jay seconded, and the motion carried.
- <u>Autocross</u> As the TCC venue is no longer available, Dan Arthrell is in discussions with Union school officials for the possible use of one of their parking lots. Bill Jacobi reported an equipment trailer has been purchased. The board approved funds to add a front wheel, as well as purchase three locks. Trailer is temporarily insured through Bill; permanent insurance options are under consideration. AAA recommends storing trailer on jack stands with wheels removed to discourage theft. Additionally, electronics will be stored separately.
- <u>Treasurer's Report</u> Lynne reported quarterly subsidies have been received. Race sponsorship monies are in the club account. Lynne will vacate office of Treasurer 1/1/2009, but will be available to assist if necessary.
- **Social** Upcoming events include a possible ballet outing 11/1, the annual dinner at Margaret's TBA, PCA-Palooza 11/7-9, and the Holiday party 12/5.
- <u>Newsletter</u> References to "Elf" are to be removed from "Trail" ads for Scott Bever. Company is now "SynPro" (sp?), and/or Sabre-Chem (sp?).
- <u>PCA-Palooza</u> A meeting was held to discuss our involvement in the annual Arkansas event, with our neighboring region. Cimarron's Gary Bernard, Jay Jackson, John Shafer and Leonard Zechiedrich met with Rick Daes, president of the Ozark region. Items included ensuring ALL participants sign the event waiver, autocross feasibility, and an acceptable accounting of event finances. Volunteers to help attendees complete insurance waivers would enable 100% compliance. Cimarron Region will have helpers on hand to assist.

<u>Adjournment</u> – With no additional business on the agenda, the meeting was adjourned on a motion by Greg, seconded by Gary.



Motorsport Report

PORSCHE AT INDY...AGAIN?

SpeedTV's Robin Miller broke the story over the Columbus Day weekend—Porsche was one of the manufacturers who attended meetings with IndyCar regarding engine suppliers for 2011. Porsche has a history at the Indianapolis 500, but it is not a pretty one. So it came as something of a shock to find out that the German marque was once again dipping its toe into the waters of The Speedway. While much remains to be decided, in particular if Porsche is indeed serious, the mere mention of the name raises eyebrows in the racing world.

Porsche's history at Indy was stillborn in 1980 with the development of an engine specifically for the 500-mile race. Known to be very powerful and based on the 1978 935 engine, the movers and shakers at Indy lobbied hard to have it restricted. While the turbo boost had been set at 54 in. (1.8 bar) in early negotiations between Porsche's Jo Hoppen and the United States Auto Club, these agreements were re-done in April 1980. The new boost setting was 48 in. (1.6 bar), for an engine that had seen extensive development on the higher boost. Some stories relate that Hoppen, not being born yesterday, had already tested the engine at 1.6 bar, but Porsche was not impressed with the politics of Indy. It was a management decision— Porsche promptly packed up and went home.


Again in the 1988, '89 and '90 seasons, Porsche had a presence. Teo Fabi had a win in 1989, but also once again, the arcane politics of Indy left Porsche with a very bad experience.

Which begs the questions, why now? Why again? Along with Porsche, the other

manufacturers were reported by SpeedTV to have been Audi, Alfa Romeo, and the current supplier, Honda. One wonders what these manufacturers see in IndyCar, with its low TV ratings and balance of ovals, road courses and street circuits. Especially in light of the current economic climate, it might be hard to justify a big racing budget. For Porsche, could it be the influence of their stake in Volkswagen? A new VW manufacturing plant for VW has already been announced; could it be that the stated importance of the U.S. market for VWs could extend to the Indianapolis 500?









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
