The 11th Annual Dogwood Spring Fling was once again an outstanding event that continues to be one of our most popular with surrounding regions and members.



Motorsport Report

PORSCHE TAKES DOUBLE VICTORY AT SEBRING




March was an up and down month for Porsches in competition. Capped by an historic double victory at Sebring in ALMS where the RS Spyder grabbed the overall win coupled with the GT2 victory in a GT3RSR, there was also some continued frustration in Grand Am.

Sebring, along with Le Mans and to a lesser degree Daytona, has played a key role in establishing the name of Porsche in motorsport. With their earliest


victory coming in 1960 at the hands of Oliver Gendebien in an RS60 (a Porsche has competed at Sebring every year since 1953), Porsche has looked to Sebring as a true test of endurance ever since. With their last overall win in 1988 with Klaus Ludwig and Hans Stuck in a 962, it had been a long drought. The memory of last year's debacle still fresh in their minds, the Porsche teams arrived at Sebring with considerable pressure to avenge their embarrassing failure. And avenge they did. Fast from the outset, the Porsche RS Spyders went to the top of the speed charts early, led by the Penske group, and aided by numerous gremlins attacking the Audis, came home with the overall win. Over in GT2, the verdict is still out on the new and improved GT3RSR as the leading Ferraris took themselves out through collisions and other misadventures. The consensus on the modified RSR is that Porsche has improved the performance of the car, but Ferrari has not sat still either. Also winning at Sebring in a preliminary round of the SCCA's Speed GT series was Randy Pobst in a Porsche GT3 Cup car.


In Grand Am at Homestead, the Alex Job-owned Porsche Crawford led for a while, but had to settle for second as the Lexus powered Riley of Scott Pruett and Memo Rojas took their second straight win. In GT, second place was again the best Porsche could manage as a Pontiac took the victory.

At the beginning of April, the ALMS street race at St. Petersburg resulted in a somewhat surprising overall victory for Audi. Street races are supposed to favor the lighter, more nimble LMP2 cars like the RS Spyder, but Audi and the ALMS officials have worked to even the odds. The LMP2 cars are carrying additional weight this year, and the ability of the cars to accelerate and slow this additional weight has taken a toll on their lap times. The St. Petersburg finish was a straight-up fight between the Audi R10 TDI and RS Spyder on track, rather than pit strategy, so the Porsches may have their work cut out for them this year.



Also looming in the background of LMP2 is the Acura camp and the considerable resources of Honda. We're entering the meat of the season now, and it will be exciting.
