

President's Corner

It's been an active fall for the Cimarron Region. The drive to Click's Steakhouse in Pawnee was great, we had awesome weather for the drive and a great dinner when we reached our destination. A couple of weeks later we had an annual dinner at Margaret's which always draws a big crowd. The only negative was the TU football loss at home a few hours later on the final play of the game. PCA-Palooza in Eureka Springs continues to grow. This year there were over 300 people registered with nearly 175 cars. Cimarron Region was well represented with a nice contingency of members and the weather was absolutely spectacular.



Holiday Party - We are coming to the end of the year with only a couple of events left. Be sure and mark your calendar for the CRPCA holiday party on Friday, December 4th. This year the party is being held at the Five Oaks Lodge. If you are not familiar with the lodge please visit their website at http://www.fiveoakslodge.com/. It is a beautiful facility located at 528 East 121st Street in Jenks (just a little east of 121st and Elm). The lodge has a cash bar and the party will begin with cocktails at 6:30 followed by dinner at 7:30. This is traditionally our largest social event of the year and I strongly encourage you to join your fellow Porsche enthusiasts for this event.

Officers – The ballot for the 2010 officers is included in this issue of the Cimarron Trail. John Shafer is running for President and Randy Kaplin is running for Vice President. In addition, Dan Arthrell has agreed to run for Secretary and Rocky Naff is running for Treasurer. I want to thank these candidates for "volunteering" to run for office. Without the efforts of these people along with the various chair positions, this organization would not function.

We are still seeking a Club Race Chair for next year's Oktoberfast. We may have to lock the doors at the Holiday Party until someone volunteers if we do not get candidate before then. As I am sure you know, Earl Schott served as Club Race Chair this past Oktoberfast but he also races and it is difficult to do both. Trust me, if you volunteer, we will give you plenty of support, so if you have any interest in this position please give me a call and I will be happy to discuss it.

Constitution – When I "volunteered" to be President back in the fall of 2006, one of my biggest concerns was the three year commitment (Vice President first year, President Elect second year and then President the third year). Once I came on the Board, I realized that during your first two years, your responsibilities were fairly minimal and they could be completed by one person rather than requiring two. I know that for me, and I suspect for others, the three-year obligation was a fairly big negative to joining the Board so I suggested we eliminate the President Elect position and reduce the President rotation to two years. The Board agreed and while we were amending the constitution we decided to clean up a couple of other things.

Following this report there is an amendment to the Cimarron Region PCA constitution which was approved by the Board of Directors at the November 9th Board meeting. The Board is recommending the full membership ratify this amendment. We will discuss the amendment and submit it to a vote of the general membership at the holiday party on December 4th. A summary of the changes proposed in the amendment follows:

- Eliminate the position of President Elect. To keep the voting members of the Board an odd number we are adding the position of Past President as an ex officio member of the Board with voting privileges
- Eliminate the provision restricting a person to holding a Board position for no more than two years. While the position of President and Vice President change each year, it is not uncommon for someone to hold the position of Secretary or Treasurer for more than two years so we have changed the language to allow a person to hold the position until their successor is duly elected.
- Add a provision which states that the books and records of the organization may be audited if the Board of Directors so requests.
- Change election procedures to allow ballots to be sent out and received electronically via e-mail as opposed to via first class mail (obviously the original language was drafted before email).
- Modify the quorum definition which currently requires the greater of 20% of the membership or 20 members to requiring the lesser of 20% of the membership or 20 members. We rarely if ever get 20% of the membership together at one time.

That's all for this month and I hope to see you at the holiday party.



Cimarron Region, Porsche Club of America, Inc. Proposed Constitutional Resolutions November 9, 2009

The undersigned, Regional President and majority of the Board of Directors, of Cimarron Region, Porsche Club of America, Inc., hereby call an annual meeting of the members, to be held at the members' Christmas Party, on December 4, 2009, for purposes of considering and voting upon the following resolutions to amend the Constitution and Bylaws (adopted on January 15, 2000), in order to change some of the offices, operations and procedures presently being used by the Cimarron Region. The resolutions, for consideration and vote of the members, are:

1. Officers – Article V (a) of the Constitution shall be amended to read:

"The management of the Club shall be vested in the Board of Directors consisting of a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. The immediate Past President shall serve as an ex officio member of the Board of Directors in an advisory capacity with voting privileges."

Article V (b) of the Constitution shall be amended to read:

"The members of the Board of Directors will hold office for one year, beginning the first day of the fiscal year following their election and ending the last day of that fiscal year, and shall serve until their successors are duly elected or appointed as provided in the Constitution and Bylaws."

Article III (a) of the Bylaws shall be amended to read:

"The management of CIMARRON REGION, Porsche Club of America, Inc. shall be its President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. These shall constitute the Board of Directors with the immediate Past President serving as an ex officio member in an advisory capacity with voting privileges."

II. Accounts - Article IV (c) Audit, of the Bylaws shall be amended to read:

"Audit. The books of the Club may be audited annually by a committee appointed by the President with the advice and consent of the Board of Directors, or by a CPA if the Board of Directors so requests."

III. <u>Election of Officers</u> – <u>Article V (b) (sentences 1- 4) of the Bylaws shall</u> be amended to read:

"By the first day of November the Secretary shall send (by either mail, electronic mail [e-mail], or posting in the Club Newsletter) to each Active, Associate, or Family Member in good standing, a ballot to their last known address/e-mail address, or such ballot may be sent (whether sent electronically or otherwise) in conjunction with the Club Newsletter sent out between October 1st or November 1st. Each ballot shall contain the names of all qualified nominees. Due notice shall be given therein that only ballots mailed/sent on or before Midnight November 15 shall be considered valid. Ballots are cast by return to the Club Secretary, and may be delivered in written form, or sent by either mail, or electronic mail (e-mail)."

IV. <u>Meetings of the General Membership- Quorum</u> – <u>Article V (b) (sentence</u> 1) of the Bylaws shall be amended to read:

"A quorum of any meeting of the members hereof shall consist of a majority of the elected officers and whichever is the lesser of: (a) twenty (20) Active, Family, or Associate Members in good standing, or twenty percent (20%) of the membership in good standing."

Except as specifically provided above, the Constitution and Bylaws of the Club shall remain in full force and effect, until duly amended in accordance with the Constitution and Bylaws.

Panamera S

This Panamera S was the first one delivered to Jackie Cooper Imports. The car has generated considerable showroom traffic, despite its \$118,000+ sticker. Controversy has followed the introduction of the Panamera with most of the comments directed at the roofline. In keeping with their tagline of "Four, Uncompromised", the car focuses on looking like a four-door 911. Though not meant to emulate the exact lines of the iconic sports car, the Panamera nevertheless carries numerous styling cues to link it to the two door classic.



Viewed from the front or the rear, the Panamera is clearly a Porsche. Couple the low hood line with the corporate headlight and taillight design, along with the characteristically deep front valance and muscular fender flares. It all adds up to P-O-R-S-C-H-E. Oh yeah, the hood badge doesn't hurt, either.

"The Hump"- the most controversial part of the design. Porsche has succeeded in providing true four seat capacity, but at the cost of a roofline that is awkward at some viewing angles. "Better in person", as has been stated numerous times, is a true expression. Viewed in its entirety, there is a suitable blending of the Panamera's curves.



Functional air outlets in each front fender enhance brake cooling and help to exhaust air trapped under the car. Some reviewers have turned up their nose at these vents, but in person, they look tasteful and in keeping with the overall design. From the rear, the abrupt transition of the roof line over the heads of the rear seat passengers is less noticeable. The bulging rear fenders and the 911-like tear-drop side window planform (though reversed in the Panamera) is clearly noticeable. The rear spoiler deploys automatically at speed. On the Panamera Turbo, the spoiler includes extra winglets that deploy on either side of the main plane to increase down force above 125 mph.



The interior is a wonder of exquisite detail. Comfortable, but firm as well. Though daunted by the number of buttons, most reviewers have said they are laid out in an intuitive format. Fit and finish appeared to meet expectations for a top of the line Porsche.





A 4.8 liter, 400hp V8 powers the Panamera S. With a dry sump oiling system, 4 valves per cylinder and VarioCam Plus valve timing, the lineage of this engine is clear.



As with the Cayenne in 2002, Porsche has stepped outside of their traditional market. While the Cayenne's development was vindicated by sales, the Panamera is being introduced in a distinctly softer economy. Porsche has hinted at developing a hybrid version of the Panamera, which may also boost its appeal and acceptability. And there are those rumors about a Panamerabased coupe to reintroduce the 928...

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



Motorsport Report

Rumors, and Rumors of Rumors.

At this point of the year, there isn't much to go on but rumors. At the top of the rumor mill in Grand-Am seems to be the story that Brumos will only be fielding one car next year—for David Donohue and Darren Law—carrying the famous number 59. As to power for that car, it seems to be a little bit up in the air. Team principle Hurley Haywood stated last season that there would be one flat-6 car, but then hinted that the other car would be "something else". Porsche has never supported the V8 program run by the Spirit of Daytona group, but with the introduction of the V8-powered Panamera, one wonders whether this might provide the basis for an alternative power plant for Grand-Am Rolex Series competition. The engine used in the Panamera is already a four-valve, dry sump engine of 4.8 liters displacement. This might translate easily to the Grand-Am format where V8s have dominated over the last few years. The flat-6 engine has clearly fought the good fight over the years, but Grand-Am officials staunchly refuse to let it loose on the competition—limiting RPM, overall weight, or both during the year. As to another Brumos car, rumor central says that it might be a customer program out of the Brumos shops for Joao Barbosa and veteran Terry Borcheller. Don't expect J.C. France to return under any circumstances.

And what of Penske? Roger showed his frustration towards the end of the season by noting that the team finally felt competitive after Grand-Am relaxed some of their restrictions. But Penske was clearly snake-bit all year, and no amount of rule changes would have fixed some of the oddball things that happened. Truth be told, some of them were self-induced, but who could anticipate the under tray digging into the turf, not just once, but twice during the same weekend? The Penske group always play their cards very close, and will likely not make an announcement until all of their ducks are in a row. The biggest duck of which might be sponsorship. Verizon Wireless was thought to be on the cars only as an extension of the NASCAR program, so it's unknown what financial deal went along with their exposure in Daytona Prototypes.

There is some consternation over the upcoming Grand-Am season schedule, too. Gone is any west coast visit, and the usual July Barber Motorsport Park date is missing as well. Grand-Am will race in April at Barber with the Indycar Series, while the closest they get to the left coast will be Miller Motorsports Park in Utah. Grand-Am is of course putting a brave face on this, but how can you promote a national series when 90% of the events are in the eastern 1/2 of the continent?
