Proposed Immigration Fee Adjustments

Announcement

In accordance with the recently published Immigration and Nationality (Fees) (Amendment) Order 2025 and its accompanying explanatory memorandum, the following fee increases have been proposed:

- (1) Certificate of Sponsorship (Worker routes): Fee escalation to £525
- (2) Certificate of Sponsorship (Temporary Workers routes and select sub-routes): Fee increment to £55
 - (3) Naturalisation as a British Citizen: Fee augmentation to £1,605
 - (4) Naturalisation as a British Overseas Territories Citizen: Fee elevation to £1,070
 - (5) Renunciation of British citizenship: Fee adjustment to £482
 - (6) Amendments to citizenship certificates: Fee modification to £428
 - (7) Administrative review: Fee revision to £482
 - (8) Right of abode documentation: Fee enhancement to £589
 - (9) Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA): Fee alteration to £16

Subsequent Procedural Steps

The proposed fee modifications are currently undergoing Parliamentary scrutiny and necessitate approval from both Houses before implementation can proceed. Upon receiving requisite approval, the revised fees will be enacted under amended provisions of the Immigration and Nationality (Fees) Regulations 2018, contingent upon Parliamentary scheduling constraints. This process underscores the government's commitment to maintaining a robust and financially sustainable immigration system, while simultaneously ensuring that the UK remains an attractive destination for skilled workers and investors.
