Deadline to submit After school program proposal is due on September 30, 2024. After school program begins on October 7, 2024.
- 3. Revisions: Revision or modification is only allowed if driven by data and focused on developing new critical initiatives to address student needs. Any revisions to your SY2024-2025 SIP must be reviewed by the Office of ARE and OCI, concurred by FPO, and approved by COE.
- 4. Personnel/FTE. Requested FTE is pending the approval of the U.S. DOE and is subject for review.
- Travel- All travel requests outlined in your SIP must first be reviewed by the FPO and subsequently approved by COE and the Board of Education (BOE).
- Professional Learning/Professional Development- As per ESEA, PD/PL must be "sustained (Not stand alone, 1-day, or short-term workshops), intensive, collaborative, job-embedded, datadriven, and classroom-focused" (US DOE, 2016)






