

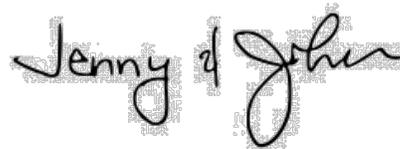


One of our Purdue professor friends, Josh, gathered some interested students into a small group to do a study on a Christian view of time management. Instead, since Jesus has promised to give us peace, (John 14:27) we schedule our lives *from a posture of peace*.
