WHAT IS LEAD?

Lead is a toxic metal that can harm a child's brain, growth, and future.

Even small amounts can cause learning difficulties, developmental delays, and health issues.

The good news? Lead poisoning is 100 percent preventable.

KNOW THE SOURCES

 Homes built before 1978 may have lead-based paint.

 Old pipes can contaminate drinking water.

 Toys, spices, and cosmetics may contain lead.

 Construction or renovation work can release lead dust.

 Some herbal or traditional remedies may contain lead.

GET TESTED

Have your child tested for lead at ages 1 and 2 or as soon as possible before age 6.

Testing is simple, quick, and often free for families.

Parents can ask for a lead test at:

- Their child's pediatrician or family doctor (covered by Medicaid and most insurances)
- Local Health Department — most offer free or low-cost testing
- Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) and community clinics across New Jersey
- The New Jersey Department of Health Lead Screening Program

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Keep your home clean and dust-free.
- Regularly wipe surfaces and floors to remove lead dust.
- Run cold water for a few minutes before using it for drinking or cooking.
- This helps flush out any lead that may have built up in old pipes.
- Wash hands and toys often, especially before eating.
- Good hygiene helps prevent accidental lead exposure.

Contact your doctor for lead testing and follow-up.

Ask about a simple blood test to check your child's lead levels.
