This plan shows a pasture area that can be developed without compromising the hills of primar forest.



#### **About Its Biodiversity**

Located within a key biological corridor, Velamar Ecological Sanctuary offers direct access to one of the most biodiverse regions on the planet. This exceptional property lies near the Térraba Sierpe National Wetland—an internationally recognized site under the Ramsar Convention—placing it at the heart of a globally important ecosystem.

The wetland features rare and vital habitat types that support critical biodiversity and ongoing conservation efforts. Its proximity enhances not only the land's ecological value but also its appeal to research institutions, eco-tourism operators, and environmentally focused developers. Velamar is more than just land—it's a living part of a broader natural system with global significance. Properties with this level of biodiversity and international recognition are exceptionally rare.

The Térraba Sierpe Wetland serves as a vital refuge for a wide range of species, including numerous birds, fish, mammals, reptiles, and amphibians. It is a key stopover for migratory birds and a year-round habitat for resident species. Notable avian inhabitants include the blue heron, white ibis, roseate spoonbill, and osprey. Its mangrove-lined waterways are also home to American crocodiles, spectacled caimans, and diverse populations of mollusks, crustaceans, and estuarine fish—making it a critical breeding and feeding ground for aquatic life.

More broadly, the Osa Peninsula—home to Velamar—is referred to by National Geographic as the most biologically intense place on Earth. Though it covers less than 0.001% of the planet's surface, it hosts more than 2.5% of the world's biodiversity. This includes iconic and endangered species such as jaguars, Baird's tapirs, scarlet macaws, and four species of sea turtles. Its interconnected ecosystems—from mangroves and rainforests to coastal and marine environments—support an astonishing array of life, making the region a global priority for conservation and a world-class destination for eco-tourism and scientific research.
