

Collapse in a Basketball Player

- Hank Gathers was a 23-yearold collegiate basketball player who collapsed in a game on March 4, 1990.
- Had previous syncopal episode in a game several months earlier.
- Had extensive work up and was allowed to return to play.
- Diagnosis: Cardiomyopathy




Collapse in a Volleyball Player

- Flo Hymen was a 31-year-old Olympic Volleyball player who collapsed during a game in Japan on January 24, 1986.
- She had just come out of the game and suddenly keeled over on the bench.
- She had a history of previous syncopal episodes.
- Diagnosis: Aortic Rupture related to Marfan's Syndrome.








Collapse in a NFL Football Player

- Kory Stringer was a 27-yearold 336 lb. tackle for the Minnesota Vikings, who died during training camp on July 31, 2001.
- It was the 2nd day of 2-a-day practices in Mankato, MN.
- Heat index was 110° (hottest day in a decade).
- Stringer had a hx problems tolerating heat and vomited during practice the day before.
- Diagnosis: Heat Stroke





Collapse in an NFL Football Player

- Damar Hamlin was a 25-year-old safety playing for the Buffalo Bills who collapsed on January 2, 2023 in a Monday Night Football game.
- He was hit in the chest while making a tackle, stood up and then collapsed.
- CPR and AED were administered quickly, followed by transport to local hospital.
- Discharged after 9 days.
- Diagnosis: Commotio Cordis





Collapse in a High School Football Player

- Freddy Mendoza was a 17-year-old high school football player who collapsed on the sideline during a game on October 1, 1991.
- He came off the field after a hard hit, suddenly collapsed and was unresponsive; Transported to hospital where he died.
- In a game the week before he complained of a headache following a hard hit that persisted during the week preceding his death.
- Diagnosis: Second Impact Syndrome

District must pay \$809,000 for fatal football injury

McFarland Unified School District must pay \$809,000 to the family of prep football player Freddy Mendora who died of a head isjury suffered in a game, a Kern County Seperior Court jury ruled Friday.

Collapse in an Amateur Marathon Runner


- Cynthia Lucero was a 28-year-old psychologist who died running the 2002 Boston Marathon.
- She was said to be looking strong only 6 miles from the finish.
- Started to feel bad and was said to have increased her drinking.
- Collapsed 4 miles from finish.
 - Taken to local hospital comatose.
 - Life support removed next day.
- Diagnosis: Hyponatremia





Collapse in a Retired Basketball Player


- Pete Maravich was a 40-yearold retired professional basketball player who collapsed during a pickup game in the gym at First Church of the Nazarene in Pasadena, Calif on January 5, 1988.
- He was 7 years retired from the NBA.
- After 2 pickup games, he suddenly collapsed to the floor face-first and died.
- Diagnosis: Coronary Artery Anomaly





Collapse in a Marathon Runner

- Jim Fixx was a 52-year-old amateur marathon runner when he died while out for a run in 1984.
- Previously overweight and 2-pack per day smoker.
- Hx high cholesterol.
- Strong family history of CAD father died at 42 of MI.
- Complained of exertional CP in weeks before he died – was scheduled for TM test.
- Diagnosis: Coronary Artery Disease.




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
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
