

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

The biography of my life was released by Amazon April 11. The book details my life from my South Dakota birth and my luck to be adopted by a rural Iowa family whose grandparents were pioneers in Montgomery County; my adventures growing up in Red Oak, graduating from Drake University, my journalism career interrupted by the Korea War; followed by a 27-year Air Force career. My civilian career followed as media and public affairs advisor to four Secretary's of the Air Force in Washington and on trips throughout the US and overseas, and then culminating as the Executive Manager of Armed Forces Radio & Television Europe for eight years.

Now retired in Sarasota, Florida where I became immersed in community involvement serving as President of the Broadcasters Club of Florida, President of Sarasota Sister Cities, member of the George Allen Media Round Table plus time as National President and Chairman of the Board of the Air Force Public Affairs Alumni Association.

I used my time as a Covid recluse to complete my biography to leave a historical record where none has existed before, with multiple Red Oak family connections (Halbert, Pilkington, Dillon, Jeffers, Thomas, Gregg, Replogle and Westerlund)

An American Gypsy was published by Amazon Kindle on April 11. On

April 18 I got the first book sale ranking reporting indicating that on the best seller list my book was ranked 751,929 in book sales, 1,546 in journalism biographies, and 3,722 in military leaders biographies.

Today the rankings indicated to me that my writing is resonating with my intended audiences as this morning as I learned my ranking in book sales has reached 123,412 place, and 300 for journalism biographies and 1,596 in military leader biographies.

Thank you for your support and I hope my memories will resonate with you & your family and friends.

AMERICAN GYPSY

An adventure of an adoptee born during the Great Depression; maturing in rural lowa; the awakening of journalistic potential at Drake University becoming managing editor of the Drake Times Delphic, a beer distributor magazine columnist, reporter for the Des Moines Register, state house reporter for United Press and sports editor of the Cedar Falls Daily Record.

Caught by the Korean War serving 27 years as a US Air Force Pilot, retiring in 1979; teaching journalism/public relations for the University of Maryland and public affairs advisor to four Secretaries of the Air Force for eight years and Executive Manager of Armed Forces Radio & Television Europe for 10 years expanding for three transmitted services to satellite delivery of 20 English language TV channels and 20 radio stations to military audiences reaching from the Azores to Iran, and Scandinavia to North Africa. Second retirement in 1997 eventually in Sarasota, Florida sharing talents as President and board member of local and national organizations.

Enjoy this humorous, thoughtful and at times painful down memory lanreflecting on the bends of the road of life.

VOCAL AND BAND

The Red Oak High School band and choir each gave outstanding performances at the graduation ceremony. The ceremony was highly attended by teaching staff who were recognized by our school board president.

On April 2nd, ROHS hosted class 2A Solo/Ensemble District Music Contests. There were nine 2A schools from the region represented. The ROHS Vocal Department had 34 students participate in 16 separate events. The ROHS Vocal Music Department received 10- (1-Superior Ratings), 4- (2-Excellent Ratings), and 2-(3-Good Ratings). RURAL HOUSING READINESS ASSESSMENT

I am honored to write on behalf of the Montgomery County Development Corporation (MCDC) for this quarter's Alumni Newsletter. It is MCDC's mission to grow Montgomery County in every way and, as the Housing Committee Chair, my focus has been on Red Oak's housing. Red Oak is about midway through a process known as the Rural Housing Readiness Assessment (RHRA), initiated by MCDC's Executive Director Steve Adams. The RHRA is conducted through Iowa State University and the Iowa Economic Development Authority. Our goal is to identify the key ways to improve access, quality, and affordability of housing in Red Oak. We seek to develop a coherent, realistic, and well-reasoned housing strategy for our community.

Our "Housing Steering Committee" is made up of exceptional members of our beautiful little town. Some of our members include architect Daric O'Neal; councilmember Tim Fridolph; YMCA Director Carrie Shalters; and Building Crafts VP Jeff Soe. The unique contributions of our whole committee will ensure the success of our project.

As we fulfill our mission we will consider a wide range of information on housing access, characteristics, affordability, and demographics. We will evaluate whether residents are able to find housing easily enough and whether the available units match the existing demand.

The US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) set a standard for what is considered affordable housing. No more than 30% of household income should be spent on housing costs. This includes mortgage or rent, insurance, utilities, maintenance, taxes, etc. A household spending more than 30% is considered cost-burdened. Currently, approximately only 15% of Red Oak households fall into this cost-burdened category; meaning ~76% of households spend less than 30% of their income on housing. While there are many factors at play, this statistic could indicate that Red Oak's affordability is an asset!

Our committee is also considering the quality of housing stock in town. We will evaluate the physical settings of residential buildings and their surrounding lots, and qualify both cosmetic and structural conditions. This is where the building and contractor members of our committee will play a crucial role.

With an average home sales price of ~\$142,000, we will look into renovation and rehab incentive programs. Our existing housing stock is aging, though much of it is entwined in our rich local history. We will explore ways to help keep familiar landmarks in place. Keeping our

existing neighborhoods strong and healthy will require resources and planning.

Our Housing Steering Committee will also look at new construction. With the aging of our housing stock, open lots, called "infill lots", have left missing teeth in neighborhoods. Do city ordinances or building codes need changed in order to build new homes in these once-occupied parcels? Can unique dwelling visions such as pocket neighborhoods or 3d-printed houses fill the space? These questions and more will be explored on our mission to develop a coherent, realistic, and well-reasoned housing strategy for Red Oak.

A key portion of this RHRA process is collecting community input via our online survey. Whether you are a current, former, or aspiring resident of Red Oak, please share your input with us. We just finished up a highly successful 4-day sold-out run of Disney's renowned classic Beauty and the Beast. A powerhouse cast of 45 members along with a dedicated crew of professionals and volunteers from local communities worked hard to bring this magical tale to life.

THE RESTORED BNSF DEPOT/WWII MUSEUM

The Depot is alive and well. Many wonderful things have been happening and several projects are in the works. We have hosted numerous parties so far in 2022 with the last being hosts to the Class of 1962 and the Class of 1972! Both were here Junction Days and had a great time. Saturday, July 9, we will be hosting a Pop-Up Restaurant and are anxious to see how that goes.

A wonderful project just nearing completion is the recreation of the garden on the east side of the building. Many years ago it was established as a memorial rose garden for Glenn Nelson - father of Phyllis Nelson Moore. It had been neglected for many, many years. Bud Barnett tilled it many times over the last couple of years. This spring with the help of Sasha Henton, Randall Wilson and Pete Crawford the soil was prepared. Echternach Construction poured a beautiful new sidewalk. Amanda Bak (grower for RO Greenhouse) and her mother, Mary, brought and planted ALL the flowers and then mulched it. It is so beautiful. We have added a couple of birdhouses, a bee house and a feeder.

We are prepared to begin the new

parking lot which will be to the north of the BNSF right of way. Only thing stopping that is BNSF stakeholders who have to give us permission to move some of their dirt. This has been in the process for 2-3 months but you don't move the railroad very fast!! It will be a much needed addition.

A most important project it the upcoming ADA compliant entry to the Depot from the south side which will include a concrete parking pad for 2 vehicles, concrete on the back side past the door, a ramp, platform, new door and electric opener. Jolene is busy raising money. As soon as we get the word that concrete is ready – the project moves!! Goal is to be completed by September 1 to be ready for the Coburg Historical Society annual get together!

Beyond that – the chimney needs to be repaired and we have grants for





that. The attics need to be foamed and we have half of the money for that in a grant.

Inside, we had the office floor refinished in February which makes the theater room the only floor not redone. Just before Junction Days Pete installed 14 cellular blinds (H/M grant) to help defuse some of the harsh light. After the Class of 72 was there we discovered an added bonus – no echoing and better to be able to hear! The H/M grant also allowed us to add 4 tables and more folding chairs so we can now set up 12 tables seating 72. Class of 72 needed all of them!!

As you can see – work at the Depot is always moving. We are in the process of planning some of next year's improvements.

The Red Oak Grand Theatre is a non-profit, 501c3, completely run by volunteers. Our list of volunteers encompass all walks of life and includes many in the surrounding communities. Our mission is to serve the citizens of the greater Montgomery County and beyond. Tickets cost just \$2.00 to ensure our movie goers can come and enjoy a movie with us at a very responsible price. Our concession items are also priced affordable to make your movie going experience all that you would hope for. In addition to our weekly showings Friday, Saturday and Sunday at 7 p.m. with a Sunday matinee at 2 p.m. our theater is used outside of those hours. We open our doors for area schools, daycares,

businesses and churches during the week as well.

In 2013 the Red Oak Grand Theatre Board of Directors purchased the building next door as the building was in need of repair. This building shared a wall with the current theatre. Until 2018 the board discussed different ideas on what to do with the acquired building and the answer surfaced as "Expand the Grand." A core group from the board gathered a plan and began the process of raising \$975,000.00 to repair the building and create a second screen. Today our two screen theatre is a delight to the area with a fabulous theatre room, remodeled lobby, new restrooms and updating the original theatre room

with new heating and air, a new fire alarm system and other behind the scene improvements.

The "Expand the Grand" project was a project the community embraced and helped us accomplish. We could not have completed the project without countless grants, donations and pledges. It is amazing what happened in a small town in Southwest Iowa.
