




Every year Blacks from all across the country and world gather at the Edmund Pettis Bridge in Selma, AL

PETTUS BRIDGE


Celebrities and the famous have been apart of this annual event







Just on the other side of the bride



... is a small pile of stones

These stones are based upon a powerful passage of Old Testament scripture from the book of Joshua



6 That this may be a sign among you, that when your children ask their fathers in time to come, saying, What mean ye by these stones?



7 Then ye shall answer them, That the waters of Jordan were cut off before the ark of the covenant of the Lord; when it passed over Jordan, the waters of Jordan were cut off: and these stones shall be for a memorial unto the children of Israel for ever.

Once again God would part the waters of the sea so that Israel could cross on dry land






However, God told Joshua to take stones from the wilderness across the Jordan

God tells Joshua what to say when their descendants ask about the stones





The stones are to remind Israel how God had blessed them to cross the **Red Sea**





In like fashion, the stones on the other side of the Edmund Pettis Bridge is to remind us how God brought us across the **Red Sea** of racism, segregation and **bigotry**





One of the reasons we pause each year to recall our history in February is to march past the memorial stones of our history

You may not have physical stones or a bridge but you do have some memories of where God has brought you from
