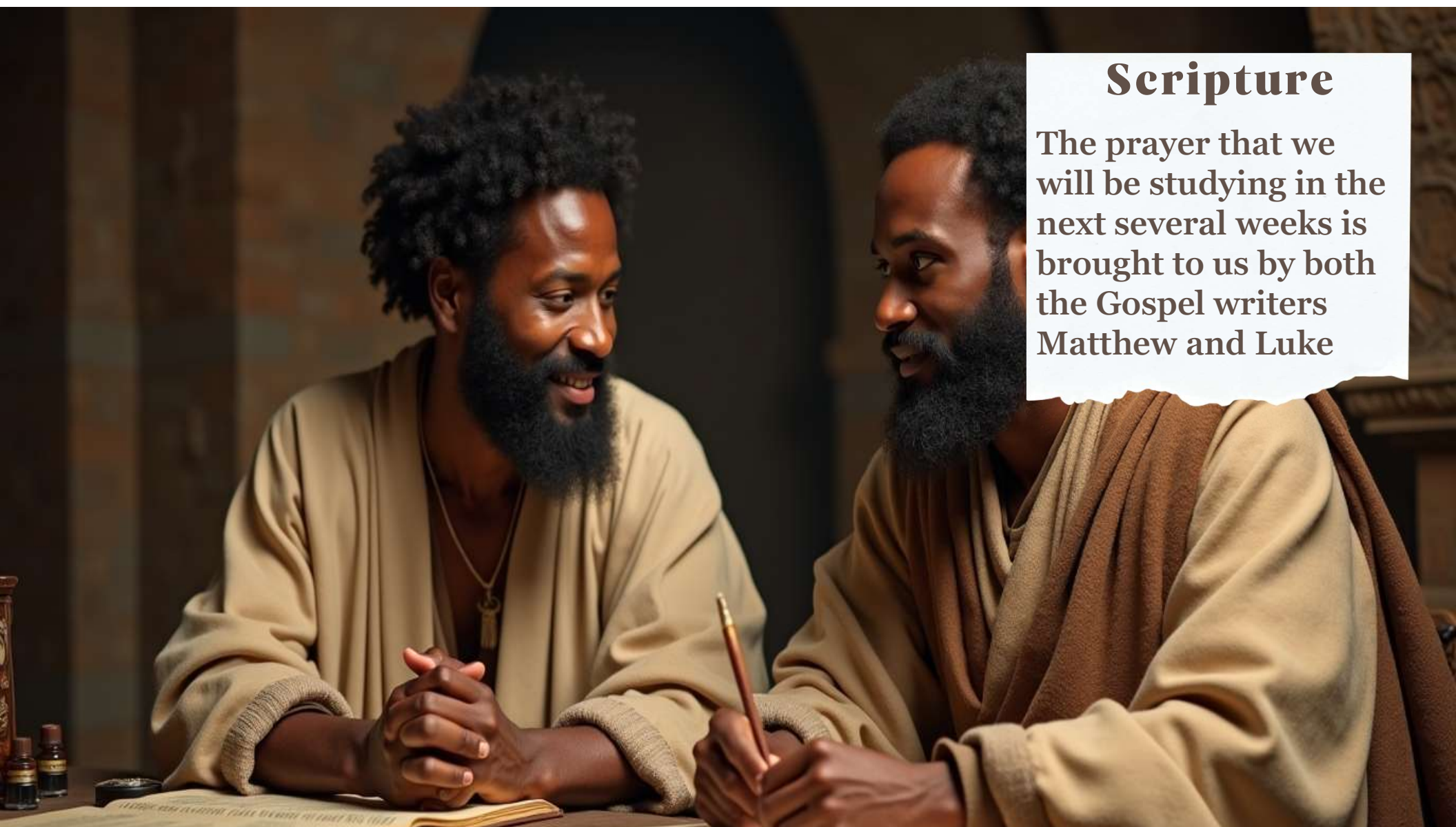

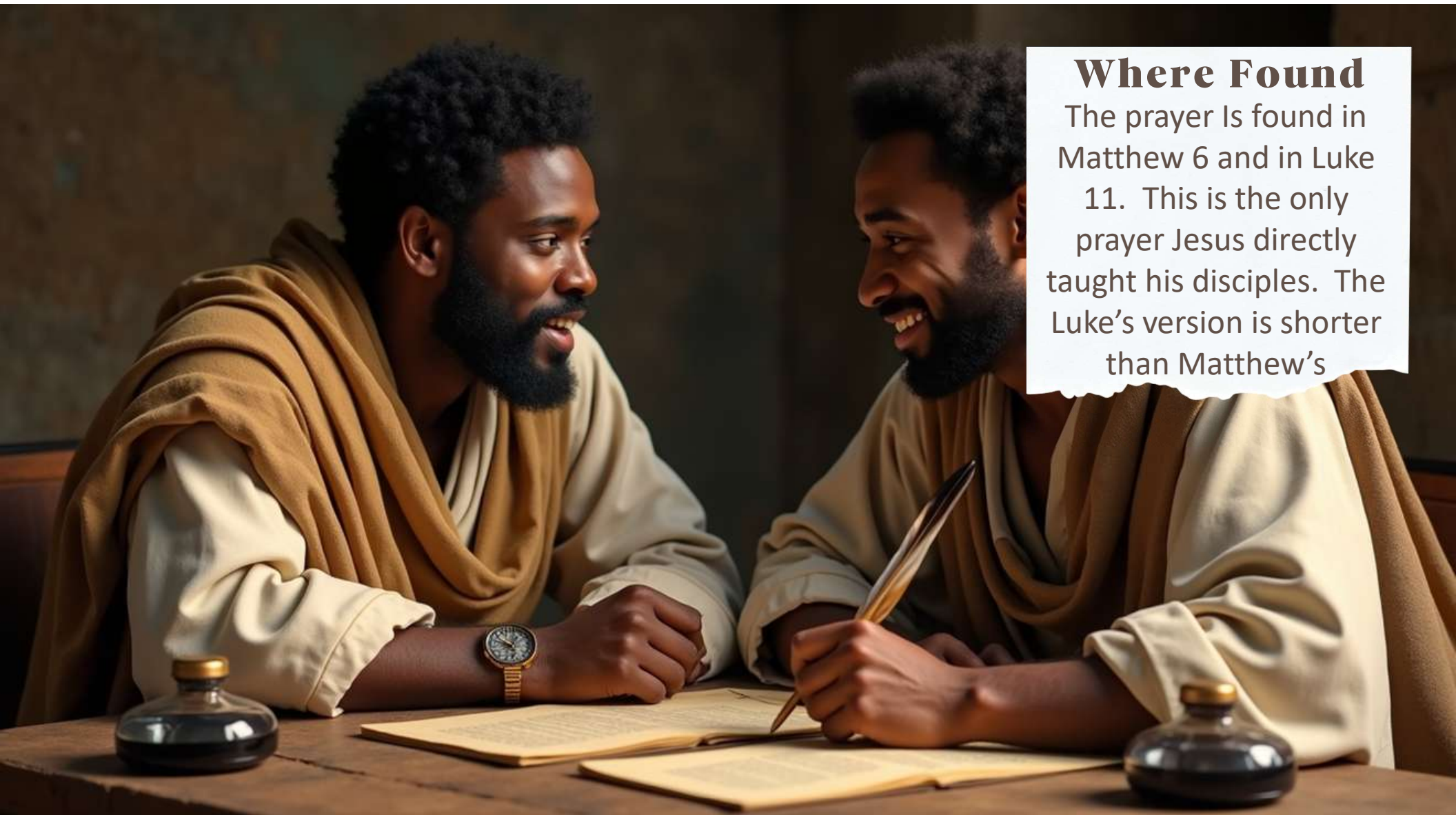


## **In Jesus's Day**

The ability to teach prayers was a sign of spiritual authority.

The fact that the disciples wanted Jesus to teach them was a sign of their belief in him





## **Where Found**

The prayer is found in Matthew 6 and in Luke 11. This is the only prayer Jesus directly taught his disciples. The Luke's version is shorter than Matthew's



## Type Prayers

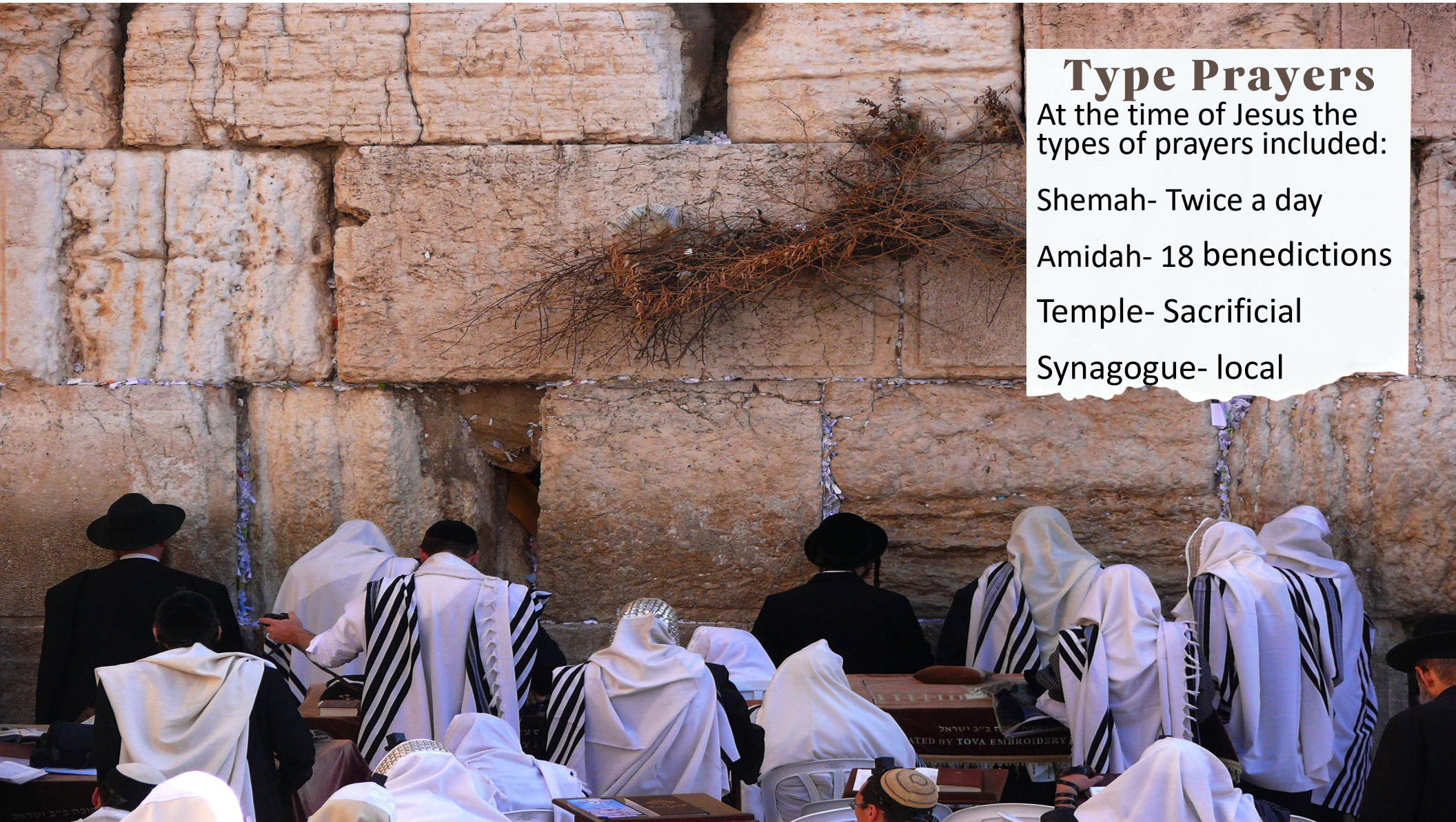
At the time of Jesus the types of prayers included:

Shemah- Twice a day

Amidah- 18 benedictions

Temple- Sacrificial

Synagogue- local



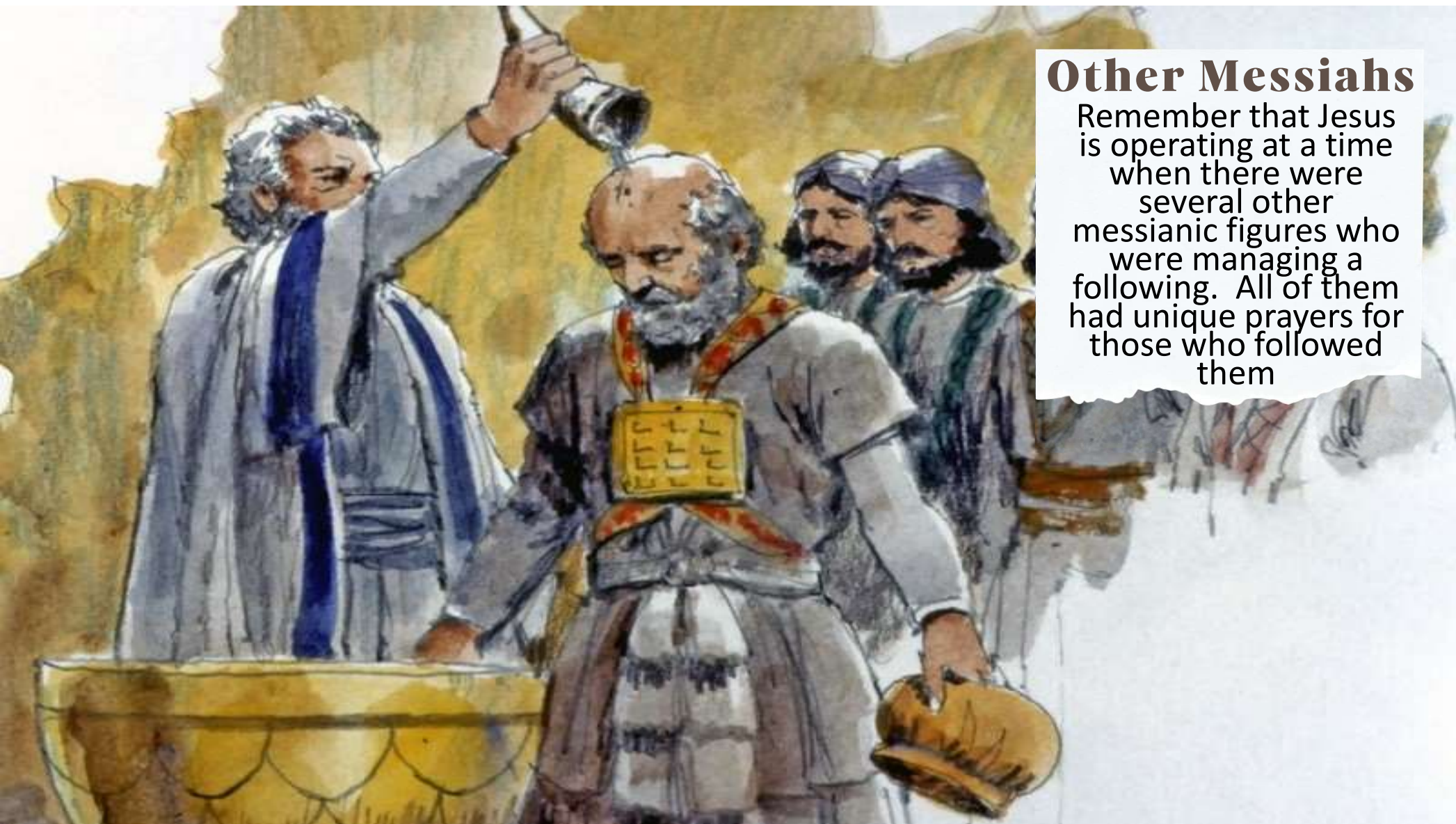




### **Structure**

Prayers were either communal or individual as well as structured or spontaneous. They were considered a covenant with God that could produce favor





## Other Messiahs

Remember that Jesus is operating at a time when there were several other messianic figures who were managing a following. All of them had unique prayers for those who followed them



## **John the Baptist**

Besides the fact that several of Jesus's disciples had been followers of John, comparing Jesus to John would have been a testimony that they saw Jesus equal to or greater than John
