




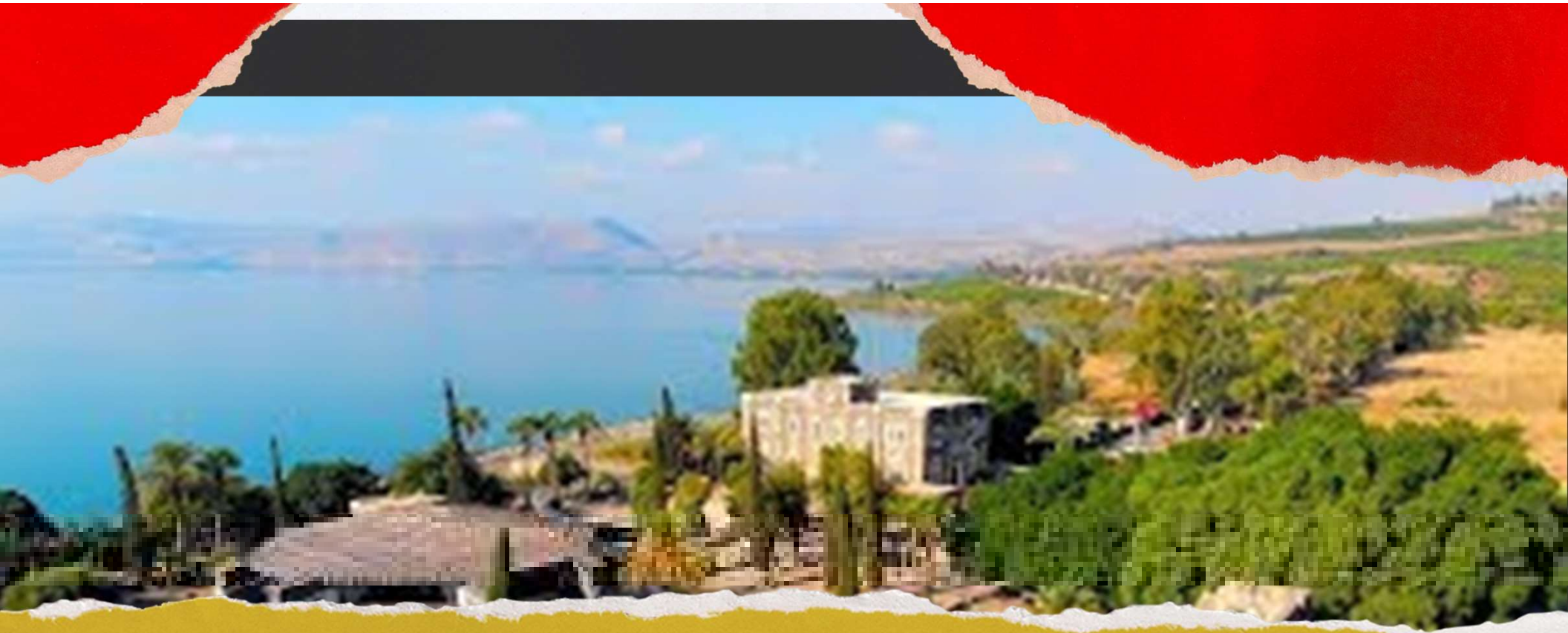

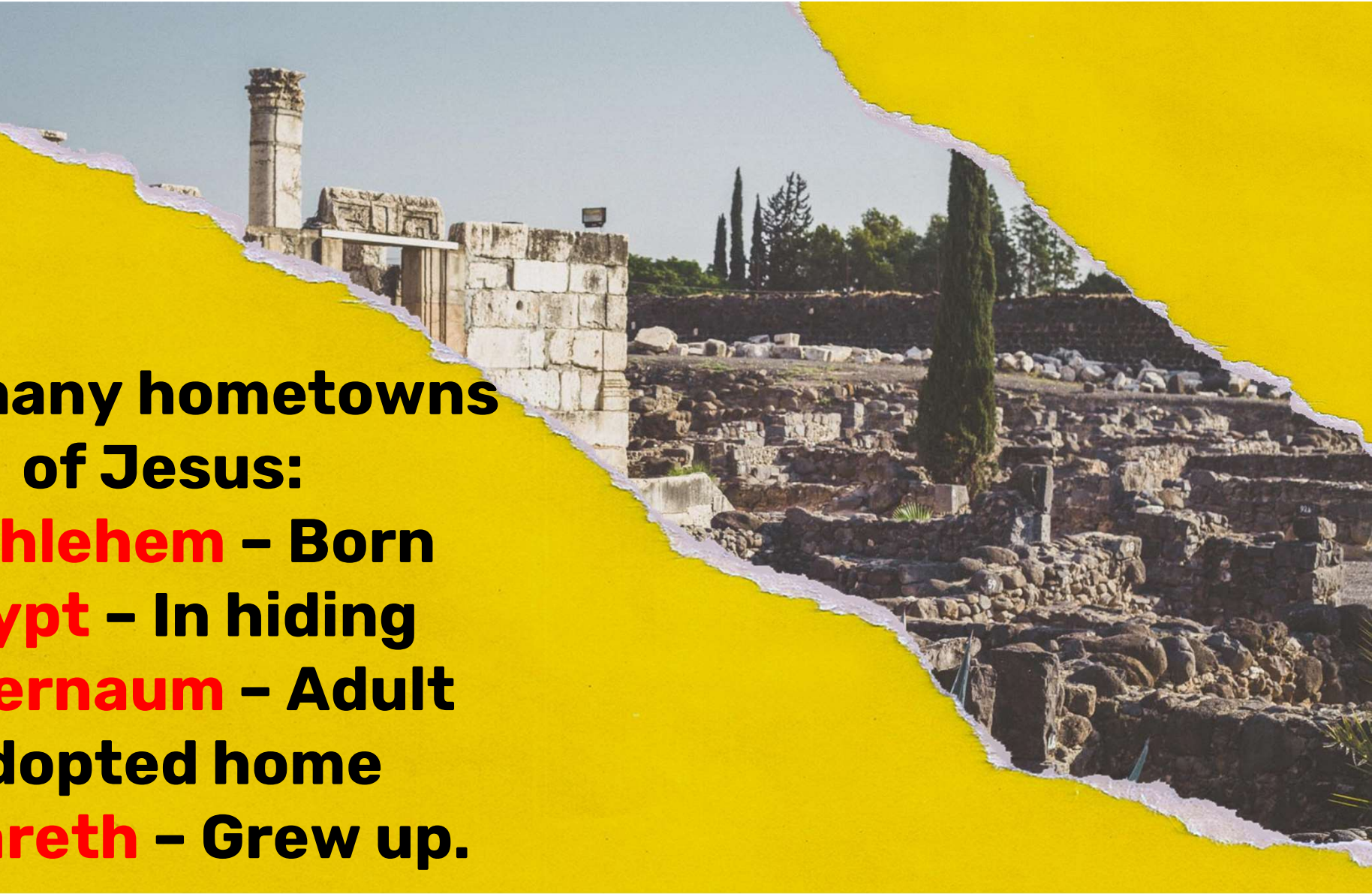

for 18 yrs**



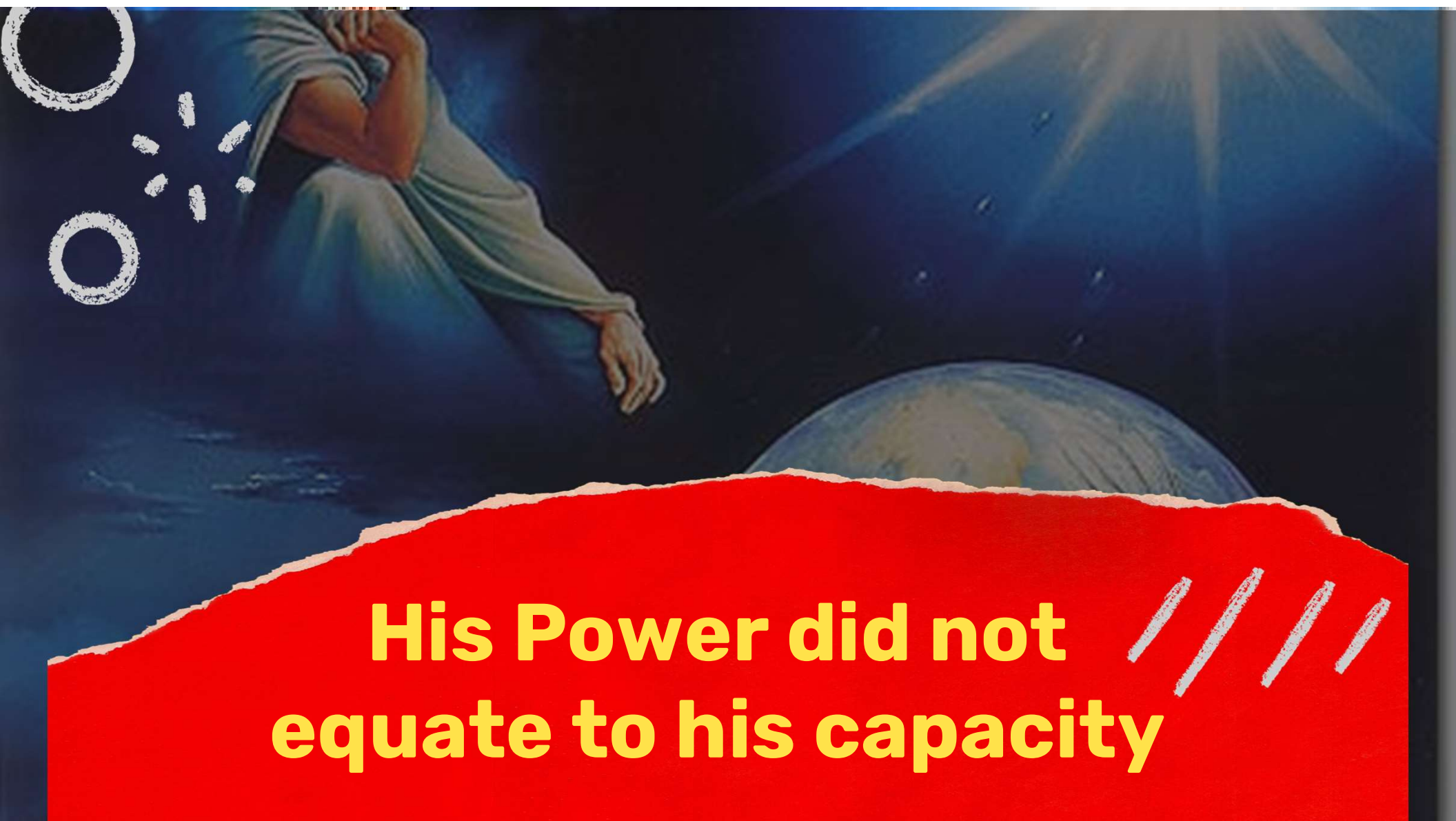
5 Now He could do no mighty work there, except that He laid His hands on a few sick people and healed them.

equate to his capacity**

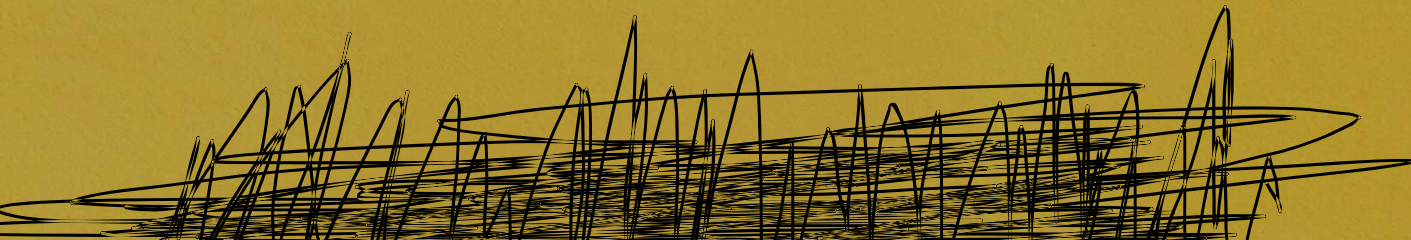
