# The Focus of this Lesson

- During this time of the year our focus is usually upon the resurrection of Jesus
- However, in this lesson I want to look at what happens after the resurrection



# **Last Sunday's Sermon**

- **Remember I stated that the disciples did not initially believe the women who told them that Jesus was alive**
- **Also, that Thomas wanted to have the same experience as what it took for the other disciples to believe**

# **In This Text**

- **In this text the Bible says that what the women told the men seemed to be fables**
- **And even though Peter ran to the tomb and found it empty, he still did not believe**

# **The Men on the Road to Emmaus**

- **The fact that they were on the road to Emmaus is further evidence that they did not believe**
- **Emmaus was in the opposite direction and not where Jesus told them to meet him**
- **The fact that they were sad further suggest that there hope was gone**

# Jesus Raises a Question

- **Jesus pretends not to know what had occurred in Jerusalem**
- **Their inability to recognize him demonstrates that depression can obscure our vision**
- **Their eyes were not opened until he broke bread with them (last supper or 5000 feeding)**

# **Their Message to the Disciples**

- **At the time they report to the eleven the disciples were still in a state of disbelief**
- **It is not until Jesus shows up in the room that they believe**
- **Only after thinking they had seen a ghost and the wounds in his body**

# Jesus' Word to Thomas

- **This passage illustrates that what Jesus said to Thomas about believing because he had seen was actually intended for all of the disciples**
- **It further reaffirms that those of us who are able to believe without having seen the resurrected Jesus are blessed the more**
