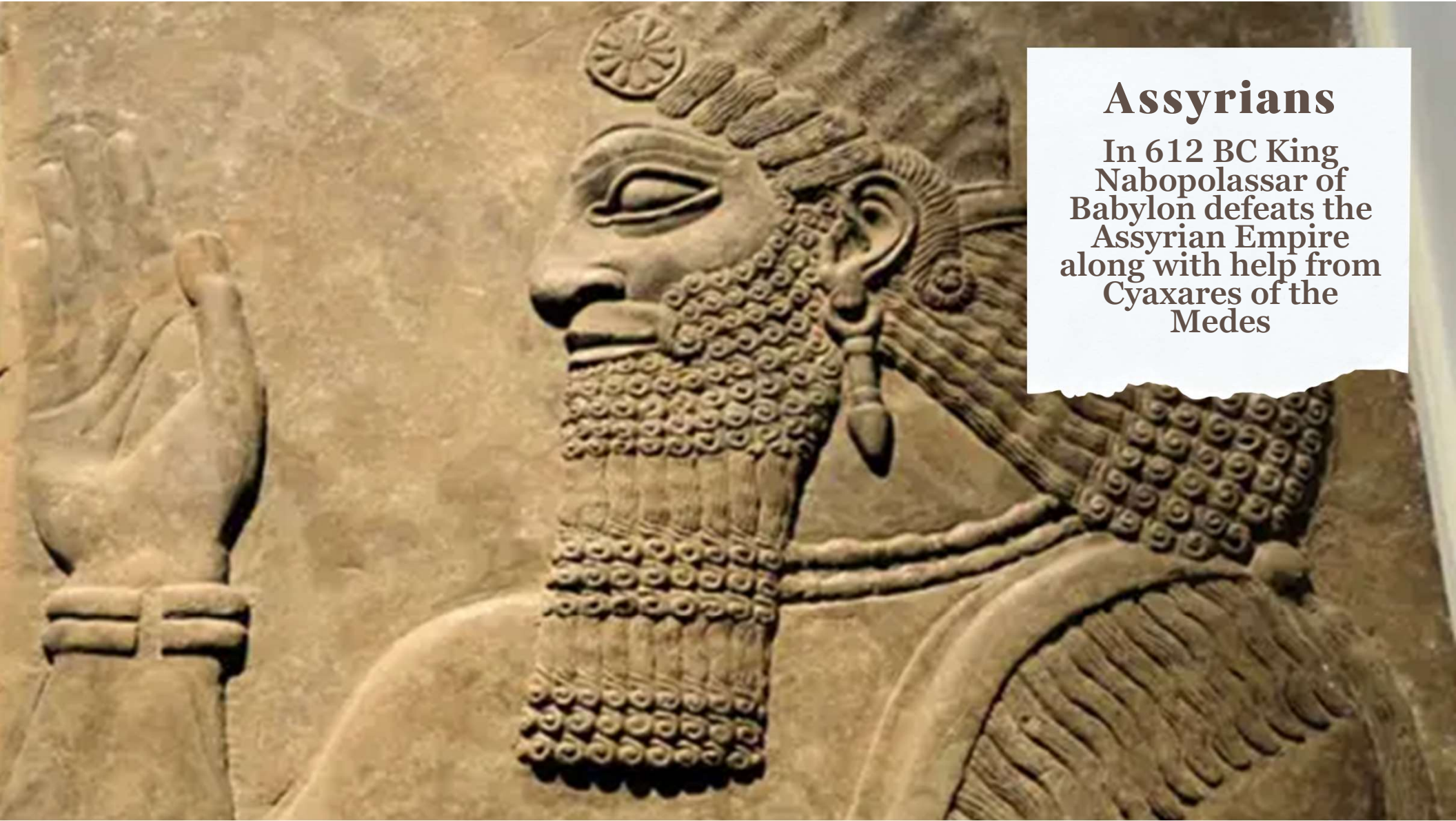


Coming to Babylon

Captivity

Unlike the Assyrians, the Babylonian choose to take the leading figures of Jerusalem into captivity and re-train them as Babylonian servants

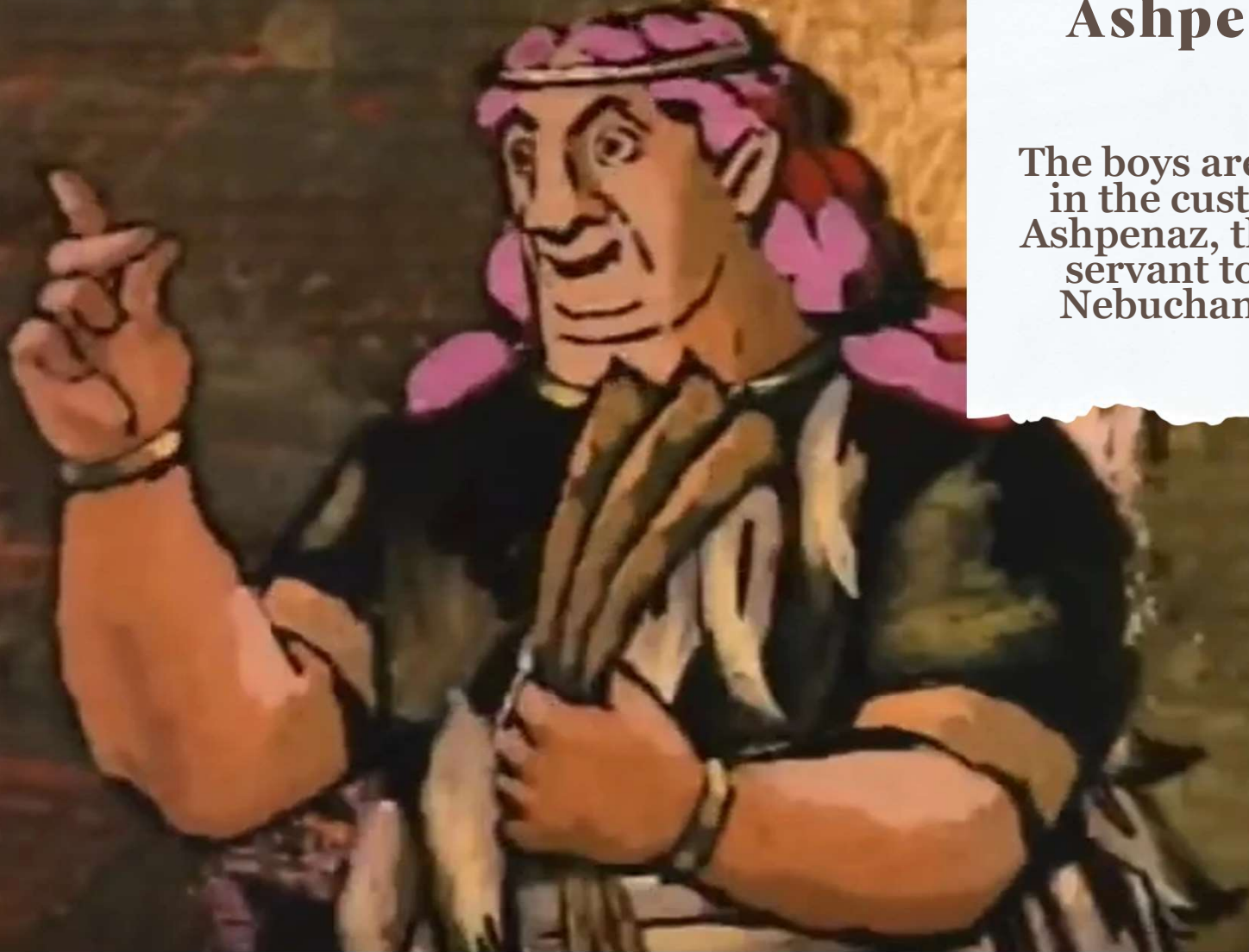


Hebrew Boys

Among those taken into captivity are four Hebrew boys by the names of Daniel, Azariah, Hannaniah and Meschel

Ashpenaz

The boys are placed
in the custody of
Ashpenaz, the chief
servant to king
Nebuchanezzar





Unclean Food

Daniel dares to ask where the food they are to eat comes from. He then proposes that they eat on fruit and vegetables for a period of 10 days



The Results

After 10 days the appearance and the health of the Hebrew boys is superior to those who ate from the king's table



Benefits

With proof in hand, the boys are allowed to continue their diet and avoid the food from the kings table




Covenant
