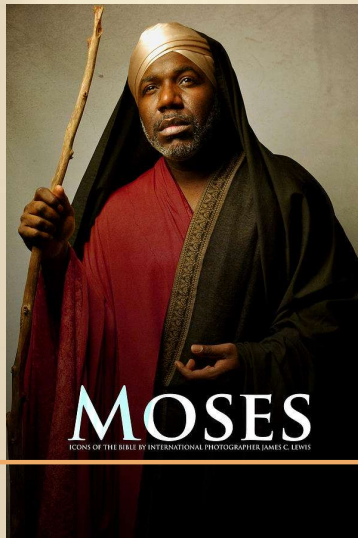

Background on Moses

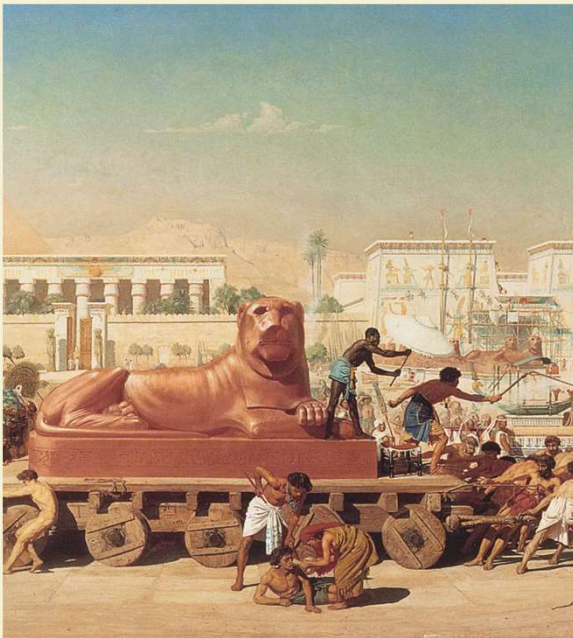


• Prophet and leader of the Israelites

The Call of Moses



- Called by God to deliver the Israelites from slavery

- The burning bush and God's instructions to Moses



Pharaoh's Refusal



- Pharaoh's initial refusal to let the Israelites go
- The hardening of Pharaoh's heart and its consequences

The First Plague - Water Turned into Blood

- The Nile River and all water sources turned into blood
- Mention the impact on Egyptian daily life



The Second Plague - Frogs

- Frogs infested Egypt, covering the land
 - Discomfort and the impact on Egyptian society

The Third Plague - Gnats



•Gnats swarmed Egypt,
causing irritation and
discomfort

•and the impact on
people's health and
hygiene



The Fourth Plague - Flies

• Flies invaded Egypt,
causing widespread
nuisance



The Fifth Plague - Livestock Disease

•All the livestock of Egypt,
except that of the Israelites,
perished

- Boils afflicted the Egyptians, causing pain and suffering

The Seventh Plague - Hail



- Pharaoh's initial refusal to let the Israelites go

The Eighth Plague - Locusts

- Describe the eighth plague of locusts
- Swarms of locusts devoured all remaining vegetation



The Ninth Plague - Darkness

- Describe the ninth plague of darkness
- Darkness covered the land of Egypt for three days
- The psychological and spiritual implications of the plague



The Tenth Plague - Death of the Firstborn



- Describe the tenth and final plague
- Firstborn of every Egyptian household, including Pharaoh's, died
- The significance of the Passover and the Israelites' protection
