
Surviving a Slow Start, Part 2 Sermon Review

- demonstrates that God does not always use the most talented people to do his job, sometimes he uses the one with the least talent but the greatest dedication and integrity






I have a person who helps me maintain my house and to be truthful they are not necessarily the best person to have done that job, but they are the most honest and who I can trust






Perhaps one of the best lessons from this story of Gideon is that it demonstrates how our faith in God is not contingent upon us knowing exactly how things are going to turn out

Sometimes when God calls us, we have to go despite not knowing exactly where we might turn up







Finally, God does not call us based upon where we have been but calls us based upon where we are going
