

Last week we examined the descendents of Abraham through his adopted son, who actually was his nephew, Lot who became the Ammonites and the Moabites


The same Moabites who would provide a Ruth that would marry Boaz and become the ancestors to King David and Jesus












Now we move our attention to the first of two sons that would be born to Abraham and that would be Ismael, the son of Hagar






Ishmael was born at the suggestion of Sarah who makes her handmaiden, Hagar, available to Abraham to have a child Hagar would later be expelled from the camp of Abraham along with Ishmael, Abraham's son



12 This is the account of the family line of Abraham's son Ishmael, whom Sarah's slave, Hagar the Egyptian, bore to Abraham.




13 These are the names of the sons of Ishmael,

firstborn of Ishmael, Kedar, Adbeel, Mibsam,
14 Mishma, Dumah, Massa, 15 Hadad, Tema,
Jetur, Naphish and Kedemah



Islam identifies Ishmael as a major prophet of Islam, who was the ancestor of the Prophet Muhammed There is also the rival belief in Islamic circles that the child to be sacrificed to please God was Ishmael and not Issac as believed by Jews and Christians

It is also of note that one of the daughters of Ishmael, Mahalath, was one of the wives Esau, the older son of Issac





Again, Muslims believe that it was Ishmael that would produce Adnan a direct descendent of the Prophet Muhammed.





Even though Islam does not get its official start until the 7th century AD that faith community claims a history of antiquity that goes back to Abraham and Ishmael
