
The Children of Abraham Part 5


Up until now we have reviewed the children of Abraham via his descendants of Lot, Ishmael and Esau




Now we turn to Jacob, the second born son of Issac and grandson of Abraham




Jacob would produce 12 sons from four wives






This story also includes the romantic tale of Jacob working 14 years in order secure his marriage to Rachel





However, I do not want to by-pas the fact that Rebekah, the mother of Jacob and Esau had come from the household of Nahor and Milchor

The point here is that when **Rebekah chooses** to follow the servant of Issac, she leaves behind a brother by the name of Laban who she will turn to later in the story



Despite how crafty Jacob had been in his fathers house he is outwitted by his uncle Laban who substitutes his older daughter Leah in place of Rachel on the wedding night of Jacob Leah would bear four sons for Jacob, Reuben, Simon, Levi and Judah





Rachel then gives Bilhah to Jacob which produces Dan and Napthali Leah responds by providing Zilpah to Jacob which results in the birth of Gad and Asher




Leah somehow rediscovers her fertility and bears two more sons, Issachar and Zebulon




Leah somehow rediscovers her fertility and bears two more sons, Issachar and Zebulon
