
The Life of Samson, Part Sermon Review

From the time that I was a child, Samson has been one of my favorite stories of the Bible




I always put Samson in the category with Superman, Batman or Hercules as a popular action hero

Before examining in detail the early stor of Samson let's take quick moment to review what has happened to Israel since the close of th Gideon story



First there is the tragic story where the sons of Gideon are mass murdered in order to make Abimelek king


This story however assumes that the leader following Gideon would be one of his sons (primogeniture) instead of a person chosen by God (charismatic choice) which seem to be preferred platform at the time



This is further illustrated by the fact that the next three leaders, or judges of Israel, Tola, Jair and Jephthah, are all men whose fathers had not been leaders in Israel



These stories are followed by the criticism of the Ephraimites who complain that they were not included in the call up to fight against the Ammonites Jephthah makes the point that his victory came from the hands of God and not the help he did or did not get from the Ephramites






These three judges are followed by three others, Ibzan, Elon and Abdon



It seems that in the case of Ibzan we see the early case where israelites are given in marriage to persons outside their tribe



This establishes a precedent and signals what we would later find in the life of Samson where he married outside of his tribe The story of Samson repeats the other Old Testament stories that include Sarah and the mother of Samuel



There is a difference between a "Nazarite" and a "Nazarene"
