Why study the "theology of worship"?

- What a "theology" is...
- What a "theology of worship" is...

1. GOD'S WORD tells us who God is.

GOD is the *subject* of our worship.
Worship is *about* Him.
We must worship Him *as He really is*.

2. GOD'S WORD tells us what God wants.

GOD is the *object* of our worship. Worship is *for* Him, for His pleasure. We must worship Him as He wants.

3. GOD'S WORD is our guide.

"Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." (Psalm 119:105)

4. GOD'S WORD is our only unchanging standard.

Forever, O Lord, Your Word is settled in heaven." (Psalm 119:89)

5. GOD'S WORD tells us that all of life is to be worship.

"... present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship." (Romans 12:1)

6. Only GOD'S WORD can give us a unified understanding of worship.

THE GLORY OF GOD

Not an attribute; but rather the sum total of ALL His attributes, all His perfections All that makes Him God His complete and utter perfection in every way The greatest subject of all! "The beauty of God's manifold perfections" (John Piper)

in Creation

"The heavens are telling of the glory of God." (Psalm 19:1)

"Bring My sons from afar and My daughters from the ends of the earth, everyone who is called by My name, and whom I have created for My glory."

(Isaiah 43:6-7)

in the Fall

"Even though they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God or give thanks . . .

Professing to be wise, they became fools, and exchanged the glory of the incorruptible God for images . . .

They exchanged the truth about God for a lie

and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator." (Romans 1:21,22-23,25)

in the Fall

"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

"The essence of sin is the belittling of God's glory." (John Piper)

in Jesus Christ

"And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth." (John 1:14)

in Redemption

"He predestined us to adoption as sons through Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the kind intention of His will, *to the praise of the glory of His grace* ... to the end that we who were the first to hope in Christ would be *to the praise of His glory* ... with a view to the redemption of God's own possession, *to the praise of His glory*.

(Ephesians 1:5-6,12,14)

in Redemption

Christ redeemed us that we might:

- Glorify God as God and give thanks
- Exchange images for the glory of the incorruptible God
- Exchange the lie for the truth of God
- Worship and serve the Creator rather than the creature

(Romans 1:21-25)

in Sanctification

- "Whether, then, you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God" (1 Cor. 10:31).
- "My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit, and so prove to be My disciples" (John 15:8).
- "Whoever serves is to do so as one who is serving by the strength which God supplies; so that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 4:11).

in Heaven

•And the city has no need of the sun or of the moon to shine on it, for the glory of God has illumined it, and its lamp is the Lamb. (Rev 21:23)

It's not about you.

The purpose of your life is far greater than your own personal fulfillment, your peace of mind, or even your happiness. ... If you want to know why you were placed on this planet, you must begin with God. You were born by his purpose and for his purpose....

You cannot arrive at your life's purpose by starting with a focus on yourself. You must begin with God, your Creator. You exist only because God wills that you exist. You were made by God and for God....

Many people try to use God for their own self-actualization, but that is a reversal of nature and is doomed to failure. You were made for God, not vice versa, and life is about letting God use you for his purposes, not your using him for your own purpose.

We need to see first and foremost that God is God—that he is perfect and complete in himself, that he is overflowingly happy in the eternal fellowship of the Trinity, and that he does not need us to complete his fullness and is not deficient without us.

Unless we begin with God in this way, when the gospel comes to us, we will inevitably put ourselves at the center of it. We will feel that our value rather than God's value is the driving force of the gospel. We will trace the gospel back to God's need for us instead of tracing it back to the sovereign grace that rescues sinners who need God.

Worship is *about* God (about His Glory)

Worship is *for* God (for His Glory)
