Comparisons for Town of Tanque Verde

What stays the same

- Taxes
- School District
- Trash and recycling pickup
- Fire and EMT services
- Parks and Rec
- Flood plain

What gets better

- Reduced water rates
- Dedicated Pima Sheriff deputies
- Control of zoning
- Control of building permitting process
- Control of road repairs
- Town growth plan
- Input on environment
- New RTA projects: bike paths, sidewalks, major transport improvement



Funding for Town based upon census

No property tax increase or sales tax increase

- \$9M from AZ State revenues: Income tax, sales tax, gas tax, license tax
- \$1M from Regional Transportation Authority local tax plus a seat on the board for large projects like Houghton corridor
- After reviewing costs, we project a small surplus each year
- We will plan for a census update in late 2023 which will increase state funding in 2024

Town Incorporation schedule

- 2022 Fact finding phase. We submitted a letter to the Pima Board of supervisors and completed legal notice requirement
- Jan 2023 Get letter of approval from City of Tucson
- Jan Feb 2023 Conduct opinion surveys
- April 2023 Present to County Board of Supervisors
- May 2023 Collect signatures (very tight schedule)
- June 30 2023 Deliver petition and signatures from 10% of registered voters (1564 verified voters)
- August 2023 Vote

Zoning Committee


- 9000 parcels within the town boundaries
 - 806 vacant parcels
 - 143 county own parcels
 - 36 city of Tucson owned parcels
 - 9 US govt owned parcels

- Any parcel can be rezoned to increase density
- Town would approve zoning requests
- What do we want our future growth to look like?



Road growth committee

- Review maintenance
- Develop a plan for community





Town of Tanque Verde Organization

- Small, active organization
- Mayor Initially appointed by city council, then election
- Council 7 members. Initially appointed by county supervisors, then election
- Town manager critical employee. Runs day to day operations
- Town business manager manages accounts, revenues
- Town engineer interface for roads, planning, zoning, building permits
- Town clerks –
- Town marshal if we can afford it. Interface to Pima County Sheriff



Contract support

- Sheriff deputies and other safety services with them
- Court and jail services
- Legal (contract small town legal team)
- Development services. We should do this in the town eventually
