Continuing on with the mini-series, "The Bible" we reviewed Episodes 7 to the end, Episode 10. Again, these discrepancies may seem minuscule to some, but they're very erroneous and the Producers, Director, historians and scholars need to be held accountable for misrepresenting the authenticity of the Bible. If it plainly says something in the Bible, you don't change it or try to make it more appealing and thus discrediting it.

- When Jesus tells Peter that he'll deny him, the movie says at dawn, but the Bible says before the rooster crows twice, you'll deny me three times.
- Jesus robe was not torn in pieces as it shows in the movie; it was kept as one piece and they cast lots for it. <u>John</u> 19:23-24
- When Stephen is getting stoned, the Bible explicitly says in Acts 7:60; "Then he knelt down and cried out with a loud voice, 'Lord, do not charge them with this sin.' And when he had said this, he fell asleep." The movie failed to show him asking the Lord to forgive him before he died.
- When Jesus spoke to Saul of Tarsus on the road to Damascus, the movie calls him Paul, but his name was still Saul. Acts 9

So in conclusion, was the movie good, yes it was. But there were many discrepancies according to the scriptures. It's a warning to encourage you that when you're watching a movie based on the Bible, that you take notes and go to the Bible yourself to read what it says. Do just assume that everything you're watching is biblically correct. You might have to study, but that's an excellent thing to do.
