

From the Pastor:

For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. ~Jeremiah 29:11

I have mentioned it in church...Advent is on its way. And yet, now that it's here, I don't know how we got here so quickly! Advent is the beginning of the church year. It's an exciting, and busy, time in our church year as we prepare for the holiday season.

Advent marks an important time on the church calendar, the beginning of the church year. I always found it interesting that the "New Year" on the church calendar and on the secular calendar fall about a month apart. Advent is one of my favorite times of the church year. I enjoy the preparation, the idea of getting ready. But what exactly are we getting ready for?

The answer that most of us would likely default to is "Christmas," or "Jesus' birth." But a little deeper dive into that question. Last year as I was sitting in our creche display with one of our kids, I was asked, "How many times is Jesus going to be born?" Hmmm...

It really got me thinking. We know the story of Jesus' life...Jesus was born, lived, died and was resurrected, and yet here we find ourselves in the season of Advent, waiting for Jesus to be "born again."

But as I thought about it some more, it made more sense to me—we're waiting, we're preparing for re-birth; not in a physical sense, but in a spiritual one. As we prepare for the new (church) year, we are preparing for our spiritual new year. Advent and preparing for Christmas provide us an opportunity to look back over the past year and reflect on the spiritual practices we participate in. What worked and what didn't? What new practices might we try?

It may sound like a tall order, now, in the busy-ness and, at times chaos, of the holidays and end of the year deadlines. We might find ourselves thinking, "When will I have time to reflect on anything?? I have so much to do!"

And yet, Advent is a great time to take time—to make time, even if just a few minutes each day—to intentionally spend time with God and then to breathe in the Spirit; to listen and respond. I find that when something is really important to us, we will make the time. When we make the time to breathe and reflect, we will be calmer and less anxious, more prepared to take on the day, the season

with confidence. When we make the time to put God first, (not suggesting we neglect the rest of our lives), we will find ourselves making better decisions and feeling braver, more peaceful, and more prepared for whatever December has to throw at us.

May you find hope, peace, joy and love in the Advent season and the year to come!


GIVING ENVELOPES
