## From the Pastor... Come Together and Imagine!

Saturday, September 14<sup>th</sup> was a great day; we held our first ever revival—the "Soulshine Revival," where more than 50 people gathered to share in music, scripture, fellowship and of course, yummy food! One of the sets of music that that band—the Gang of Scoundrels—performed was a Beatles set.

The following are reflections I shared reflecting on the songs, "Imagine" and "Come Together":

And Mary said, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." —Luke 1:38 ESV

An angel of the Lord appeared to Mary with a message that was world-changing news. Even though Mary was a virgin, she would conceive and bear a son whose name would be Jesus. Mary's future had just taken a miraculous, albeit frightening turn. How could this be? What would people think? Yet Mary responds with unshakeable faith. "Let it be." And with that statement, Mary placed her future in God's loving hands.

It certainly can be very difficult to figure out what you want to do in life and what your purpose is. We were all put on this earth for a reason and to make a difference. Sometimes we have a difficult time finding our purpose, but God has one for each and every one of us.

We all have an idea of how we want our lives to turn out and what we want to do in the future, but our plans may not line up with God's plans. It can be a challenge to let faith prevail over fear because the unknown can be scary.

Our faith in God grows stronger as we pray, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Even when we are tempted to fixate on "How can this be?" may God give us the grace to end up in the "Let it be" of faith.

"Glorify the Lord with me; let us exalt his name together." — Psalm 34:3 NIV

On the Beatles 1969 <u>Abbey Road</u> album, the song "Come Together" was one of the most popular; it was a chart topper for several weeks in a row. Even filled with Lennon's silly, nonsensical lyrics (like "toe-jam football") the idea behind the title remained the same; let's come together for something, or to do something, or to become something, but let's just do it *together*.

There is simply something about the human spirit's yearning to come together in order to avoid being alone, to be part of something bigger than just us and to know that there are others similar to us in interests, work, faith and purpose.

Jesus called his followers to walk with him, to follow him into places that need to be touched by love and grace. Jesus called his disciples, and Jesus calls us, to come together, to work in community. We know there is strength in numbers and Scripture reminds us that wherever two or more have come together and gathered, there is love.

Through Jesus love and grace, we are called together

to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the captives, to rebuild nations, to bring peace into the world, to make music in the hearts of people. (paraphrased from Howard Thurman's, *"The Work of Christmas"*)

In Psalm 34: 3, the Psalmist pleas for others to join him glorifying the Lord, likely through song but also through action and likely so he is not alone in doing so. If you work in a position that requires you to mostly be by yourself, you know how encouraging it can be to meet up with colleagues and peers and not feel so alone. Yes, the Lord is always with us, but it doesn't hurt to join with the Psalmist in asking others to come together, too.

Lately it seems that everywhere we turn it feels there is something happening to drive a wedge between people. But not Jesus! Jesus calls us...come together...right now...follow me!

This Fall, our stewardship theme (which you will hear more about in the near future) is "Imagining Together", a fitting reflection and statement of what we strive to do as a congregation. We all care about the communities in which we live, the things happening in our world, the future of "the" Church, and the future of *our* church. By worshipping together, fellowshipping together, giving together and imaging together, we can affect each of these areas in creative and faithful ways.

None of these things can happen if we work alone. When we come together and we all participate, we become a mission-engaged community, anchored in God's love, and ready to answer the call to reach out in service to each other and the world around us. We each have a part to play in the work of our church and in the future we desire.

May it be that we all have the faith of Mary to respond to God's call with a "Let it be" faith...and come together and imagine a vibrant future as First Congregational UCC, Angola, NY!

Halloween Happening at Dunkirk Conference Center October 12, 2024


