

From the Pastor...

Fall is my favorite season! There are so many things to love about it; cooler temperatures and the beginning of sweater weather, the changing colors of the leaves, pumpkin spice *everything*, Halloween Happenings at Dunkirk, being pitcrew for my brother as he runs 50 miles around Canandaigua Lake, and one of my favorite celebrations of the church year, World Communion Sunday—celebrated on the first Sunday of October.

World Communion Sunday began as World-Wide Communion Sunday at a church in Pittsburg, Pennsylvania in 1933. The Rev. Hugh Thompson Kerr and his congregation sought to demonstrate the interconnectedness of Christian churches, regardless of denomination. Rev. Kerr appropriately chose the sacrament of Holy Communion to symbolize this unity. Despite the differences in our denominations and traditions, through this sacred meal, we celebrate our unity in Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

As I was thinking about this upcoming worship celebration, I was reminiscing about a favorite communion experiences. There was a woman who I had visited years ago for a home communion. As I began preparing the elements to share communion with her, she said, "Oh, you brought grape juice again?" "I really don't like grape juice. We should have peach brandy." She then proceeded to get a bottle from her cabinet and pour a small amount of the peach brandy into our communion cups. The rest of the communion service proceeded "as usual," we finished our conversation and I headed back to church. As I was sitting in my car I thought about the unusual elements that were used but I also thought, I don't think Jesus minded. I don't think God was offended by a homebound woman preferring her beverage over the traditional grape juice.

I also recalled a time, here at First Congregational, when following a World Communion service several years ago, children who had been exploring the sanctuary discovered the tray of breads that had been left on the altar and began snacking on it. While their families were in Updyke Hall enjoying cake and coffee, these children were feasting on the left-over communion breads. It was quite a sight to see as they shoved chunks of the "body of Christ" into their mouths, wiping the crumbs off the communion table to hide the evidence. My first urge to stop them was quickly extinguished by the thought, "Who was I to tell them they couldn't eat

the communion bread?" It spiritually fed them during communion and now was nourishing their body with such goodness. I don't think Jesus minded. I don't think God was bothered by children wanting to eat that which was good.

I was also thinking about the different ways the bread and cup will be served in churches around the world, the different liturgies that will be used, the diverse ways the communion tables will be set, and I don't think God will be offended by any of it. What matters isn't the form of Communion, but the substance. What matters isn't *how* we celebrate Communion, but *why*.

We are invited to the table to remember Jesus; to remember that we are the body of Christ in the world. We are called to be God's hands at work in the world. We live in wildly divisive times, and yet we are called to remember our connection with other Christians *throughout the world*.

Our God welcomes us in, dreaming of a world united through a common sacred meal. This Fall, our stewardship theme (which you will hear more about in the near future) is "Dreaming God's Dream," an invitation to dream alongside God, a future for ourselves, for our church and for our world. We all care about the communities in which we live, the things happening in our world, the future of "the" Church, and the future of *our* church. By worshipping together, fellowshipping together, giving together and dreaming together, we can affect each of these areas in creative and faithful ways.

None of these things can happen if we work alone. When we come together and we all participate, we become a mission-engaged community, anchored in God's love, and ready to answer the call to reach out in service to each other and the world around us. We each have a part to play in the dreams and work of our church and in the future we desire.

As we dream together let us respond in faith and create a vibrant future as First Congregational UCC, Angola, NY!
