Role Description

Support the Missions Ministry Coordinator in the promotion of all associated mission ministries/endeavours both locally and overseas

Responsibilities

- Support the Missions Ministry Coordinator in encouraging a Church-wide interest in, and support for, local and global missions / missionaries
- Attend Missions Ministry meetings
- Assisting the Missions Ministry Coordinator with the dissemination of missions news
- Supporting the Missions Ministry Coordinator in preparing for and attending special events when called to raise interest and the finances for the missions supported by the Church
- Encourage prayerful support for missions and missionaries
- Assisting the Missions Ministry Coordinator to provide the Prayer Ministry Coordinator and Bulletin Coordinator with missions information for the monthly prayer focus

Prerequisites and/or skills required

- Church member, and/or agree with the "Responsibilities of Membership" listed in the Constitution (5.c.)
- Compliance with the Procedure for Staff and Volunteers (Category 2 b - Volunteers not in leadership roles or engaged in child-related work or work with vulnerable adults)
- Demonstrate a love for missions
