I'm a Registered Teacher in Queensland and a Member of the Australian Counselling Association (ACA), blending educational and therapeutic approaches to support people in ways that feel safe, steady and genuinely helpful.

What keeps me in this work are the small but powerful moments — the shift in someone's breath when they feel understood, the quiet returning of hope, the first sign of trust after a long stretch of self-protection. Witnessing someone realise they are capable, valued and able to shape their own future is the greatest privilege of my career.

Outside of Treetop Connections, I'm a mum to one wonderfully energetic toddler who brings curiosity, laughter and a little bit of beautiful chaos into every day. I love hiking, spending time with my brilliant circle of mum friends, and travelling whenever I can — the Galápagos Islands remain my favourite adventure so far.
