Furget Me Not Adoption Policies

Please read through these policies carefully.

- 1. Applicants are to be the intended owner(s) of the cat. Cats are not to be adopted as gifts.
- 2. Applicants that are currently renting their home are responsible for ensuring they have permission to have pets.
- 3. We expect potential adopters to conduct an in person visit with the cat(s). Exceptions may be made on a case by case basis by our Executive Director (i.e. for out of town adoptions).
- 4. All pets in the household must be spayed/neutered and up to date on vaccinations.
- 5. We do our best to ensure all cats/kittens are healthy at the time of adoption, however we recommend quarantining your new cat/kitten from existing pets for 7-14 days. We are not responsible for the health of any existing pets in the household.
- 6. Adoption fees are due at time of adoption. Our adoption fees include:
 - a. For kittens under 6 months dewormer, minimum of 1 FVCRP vaccines, microchip, spay/neuter. Pre-op bloodwork, booster FVCRP vaccine and rabies vaccine are <u>not</u> included and are to be done at the discretion of the owner if not done prior to adoption.
 - b. For cats over 6 months, specifics of any outstanding vet services to be included in the adoption fee will be specified in writing at the time of adoption.
- 7. Should you no longer be able to care for your cat, it will be surrendered back to Furget Me Not. Refunds may be issued on a case by case basis.
- 8. Medical records are provided at the time of adoption. Should there be any pre-existing/underlying medical issues with the cat they will be disclosed at this time. If you have any questions or concerns it is your responsibility to clarify before the adoption is complete.
- 9. Should your cat require veterinary care within 10 days of adoption, please contact the rescue and we will make an appointment for you with one of our partner vets. Should our vet determine that the root cause of the visit occurred while the cat was in our care, we will deal with the clinic directly to cover costs.
- 10. Recommended products (food, litter, etc.) must be used for the first 30 days following adoption. We are not responsible for any new illness or injury that occurs once the animal is in your care, or illness or injury that results from changes in diet, litter or any additional recommended products.
- 11. If a cat/kitten is sent home with medication or ongoing treatment plan, failure to follow recommended medical advice will terminate any responsibility of the rescue to provide or cover the cost of care.
