Second New Floating Dock Completed!

A skilled crew of volunteers constructed the 2^{nd} 8 x 20 ft. floating dock in late June 2020. Several of our U.S. neighbours were unable to come north this year, but other cottagers stepped up for the project. Again, we heartily thank Paul Cameron for donating his time and his Kubota to flip the dock and help install it. Sincere appreciation also goes to Tom, Dale, Rodger, Evann, and Tijs for their hard work. The dock is attached to the east side crib, old ramp and floater. There is now 20 ft of docking space on the west dock, and 38 ft. on the east dock.

With 6 more dock floats stored at the Blocks, the plan for 2021 is to construct a $3^{rd} 8 \times 20$ ft. floater, and an 8×8 ft. ramp if needed. Currently there is \$1461.06 in the dock fund, which will almost cover the materials for the new 8×20 ft. dock. Construction will take place as funds come in. Funds will also be needed for future maintenance of the docks and launch. Donations are appreciated and can be made by:

Lake Water Quality

Al Crowther has stepped down from the Lake Steward position. We thank him very much for his contributions in this position, especially for submitting the lake water samples to the Lake Partner Program. Rick Block agreed to perform the lake water tests for 2020, but the Program was put on hold until Oct.1, and he didn't receive the entire test kit.

In order to maintain continuity in the lake testing, the Theijsmeijers took 2 lake samples, in September, as directed by the 2019 AGM and took them to a water testing lab near their home. The results for phosphorus level put the lake in the average category, as in 2018.

Further testing will be needed to find out if this is a concerning trend.

Resources for Septic System Health and Good Lake Water Quality!

"Bacteria that break down wastes in the septic system are killed by antibacterial, non-biodegradable or toxic cleaning products, gas and oil." Many older systems may be grossly undersized for the number of visitors on any given day".

Report on Northern Broadband plans and Starlink: Chris Wheeler

The Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities (FONOM) represents 100 communities in northeastern Ontario. FONOM has joined other Northern Ontario stakeholders calling for better access to high-speed internet.

At its recent board meeting, FONOM passed a resolution indicating its support for Starlink, a satellite internet service being developed by SpaceX, the company founded by U.S.- based innovator Elon Musk. FONOM said it would also seek support from its partners for the Starlink program.

More than 1.4 million people in Ontario, or about 12 per cent of households, do not have broadband or cellular access. For those who do, the average download speed is just below 9 megabits per second (Mbps) and the average upload speed is just above 5 Mbps. For the average user that relies on fast internet speeds for business, education and more, download speeds of 50 Mbps and upload speeds of 10 Mbps are required as the bare minimum. In 2018, the federal government's Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) set a target to have 90 per cent of Canadian households with services that deliver download speeds of 50 Mbps and upload speeds of 10 Mbps and upload speeds of 10 Mbps by 2021. On November 4, Doug Ford announced the Ontario Government will be investing about \$680 million to expand and improve broadband internet and cellular access.

Starlink is aiming to deliver high-speed broadband internet, via satellite, to locations where access has been unreliable, expensive, or completely unavailable. It's targeting the northern U.S. and Canada for its initial release in 2020 and plans to reach "near global coverage" in 2021.
