Cold drinks and BBQ options will be supplied. BYOB.


2022 AGM

3 Stage of New Public Docks Project Completed - by: Claire Theijsmeijer

Summer 2021 was challenging for any building project, with the price of lumber skyrocketing! The Directors waited till the end of August when prices came down some to construct the 3rd floating dock, and ramp. Thanks to some great volunteers, this was completed in one day. The new dock was stored in the bay near Tom Howell's cottage, since the old floating dock would remain on the east side of the landing until after hunting season. In spring 2022, the new dock will be installed on the east side to add to the old floater. This will give about 36 ft. of docking space on this side.

The DLCA would like to thank all the volunteers who helped with the project, especially Paul Cameron and his Kubota! We couldn't have done it without you! Our appreciation goes to Tom Howell for installing anchors, and for removing and reattaching docks in spring and fall, and also to Mark Young for removing the old dock in the Fall after hunting season.





Government Policy on Camping on Crown Lands in Ontario

People have been camping on Crown Lands for decades. What is new is the increase in numbers of these campers during the pandemic. We do not know if this trend will continue or taper off now. Cottage residents have noticed more campers passing through. Just to keep informed about the current status of camping on Crown Lands, you can check out this website for detailed information and a map:

https://www.ontario.ca/page/recreational-activities-on-crown-land

The main points are:

- -Canadian citizens may camp up to 21 days for free at any one site in one year
- -Non-residents who don't own property in Ontario must buy a permit to camp north of the French & Mattawa rivers, must be 18 or older, and can camp for up to 21 days per year
- -campers must find out and obey all posted rules e.g., Campfires, fishing, garbage etc.
- -campers must check the Crown Land Use Policy Atlas map on the above website for permitted uses where they wish to camp
- -camping is not allowed in green zones, which are protected areas on the map (Provincial parks may allow camping)

The DLCA encourages all campers to protect and preserve natural areas for both wildlife and human benefit.




If ever there was a year to 'shop local', this is it! By: Deborah Hart












