Immunization Branch updates

- Recipient portal is officially retired patients will now seek their COVID-19 vaccine records directly from providers
- Save the Date!
 - Imm branch is hosting an in-person VFC training conference May 8-10 2024 (\$200 registration fee; opens July 1)
- Immunization branch created an Mpox equity report that will soon be released. High level takeaways include:
 - Total of 709 cases reported statewide and over 26K doses administered to over 15K individuals
 - Outbreak is slowing with both cases reported and doses administered.
 - We continue to see disparities in the Black or African American population. They account for 67% of cases and around a quarter of doses administered
 - NCDHHS is working closely with counties and LGBTQ+ partners to conduct outreach and education aimed at increasing vaccine uptake, particularly in those at highest risk.
- We have several <u>Pride events on the books</u>.
- We have <u>issued guidance</u> in the event of a hurricane.

Ensure healthy lives and promote wellbeing for all, at all ages

By 2030, end preventable deaths of newborns and children under five years of age, with all countries aiming to reduce neonatal mortality to at least as low as 12 per 1,000 live births and under-5 mortality to at least as low as 25 per 1,000 live births.


The Problem

1 in 5 children around the world do not have access to lifesaving vaccines¹ due to:

- Social & geographical exclusion
- Insufficient resources
- Weak health systems
- In-country conflicts

Millions of deaths from preventable causes

Most child deaths are due to conditions that can be treated and prevented.



Challenges to Global Vaccine Coverage

- According to the World Health Organization, global vaccine coverage dropped from 86% in 2019 to 81% in 2021 (the lowest since 2009).²
- In 2021, the number of completely unvaccinated children increased by 5 million.³
- During the pandemic, 67 million children missed out on routine immunizations.4



The Solution? Access

Vaccines are one of the most cost-effective ways to save the lives of children.


Expanding access to existing vaccines can save a child's life EVERY 20 SECONDS.¹²








The U.S. Federal Budget








U.S. Spending on Global Health





Estimated \$225.3 million increase since FY12 for global immunization activities through USAID and CDC (achieved in tandem with other partners' advocacy efforts)




U.S. Federal Funding for Global Childhood Immunization Programs

Letter to the Editor: Regarding Missouri's vaccination rollout

To the Editor:

Missouri is clearly struggling with vaccine distribution even as bad weather caused the cancellation of some distribution events. As frustrated as we are, we all need to remember these awful feelings of uncertainty, so we can empathize with vulnerable low-income countries dealing with poor access to vaccines in even the best of times. Our safety depends on their access to vaccines as well.

Many wealthy countries, including the U.S., ordered two to three times as many vaccines as required for their populations. Vaccine hoarding creates gross inequities and conditions for dangerous mutations. Now is the time to invest in effective programs well-placed to provide COVID-19 resources to low-income countries.

Congresswoman Ann Wagner, Sen. Roy Blunt, and Sen. Josh Hawley should urge congressional leadership to fight the pandemic worldwide by providing \$4 billion to the Global Fund to Fight ATDS_TB and Malaria as

To the Editor:

We believe that vaccine passports would be yet another measure that widens the gap between the haves and have-nots. There are myriad problems and challenges with these passports.

For how long would such passports be valid? What will happen to passports when variants that reduce vaccine efficacy become dominant in a community? What about those with immunity due to natural infection — highly comparable or perhaps better than vaccine-induced immunity? And how can one equitably treat those with true contraindications such as anaphylaxis to similar vaccines?
