CHECKLIST

Keep out unwanted guests

- \Rightarrow Seal up your home
- ⇒ Trim fruit trees and clean up fallen fruit
- ⇒ Clean up garbage areas and do not overfill the bins on trash day
- ⇒ Eliminate or clean up spilled food from bird feeders and place trays under the feeders
- ⇒ Use alternative traps inside your home (zap traps, snap traps, or live traps)
- \Rightarrow Use rodent sealed composting bins
- \Rightarrow **NEVER** use glue traps
- ⇒ Keep the hood of your car up and shine an LED light in the engine compartment
