#### **RATS**

Rats like warm engines. Here's a picture of a rat on my engine. A spray that is a combination of **Spearmint oil** and **Cinnamon oil** seems to be deterring the nest building. Shining a **bright LED light** over the engine at night and **leaving the hood up** are practices that have worked for me.



Poison Free Malibu encourages everyone to see RED and "REPEL/EXCLUDE/DETER" rats.

## **BIRDS AND TREE TRIMMING**



It's still too early to trim your trees. The California Wildlife Center recommends tree trimming in late Fall and early Winter as birds begin nesting in January. The nesting period usually ends in November.

### **COYOTES**

Accompany your dogs, chickens, cats, and other small domestic pets when they are outside. Coyotes are diurnal animals. I've tracked them on my wildlife cameras during day and evening hours. A simple way to haze them is to yell and wave your arms. You can carry a whistle with you while walking your dog. Keep pet food inside your home.
