Our Urban Wildlife

It's **baby season**! Here's some information for you on coexisting with urban wildlife when spring is in the air.

Birds

Many birds nest in the spring. **Fledglings birds** have feathers but **cannot fly**. You will see these birds on the ground. **Juvenile crows** spend time on the ground under the watch of their parents. Please ask children not to chase them. **Use caution** with **domestic pets** and **backyard activities**.

Rabbits

Rabbits breed and build nests in spring and early summer. Rabbits leave their young for long periods of time. If you come across a nest of baby rabbits and worry if they are abandoned, crisscross the nest with a couple of strands of thin string. If the string is moved out, the mother is returning to the nest.

Coyotes

Coyotes give birth the middle of April. Please abide by our park rules regarding off-leashed pets. Protective mothers need their space. You may see more coyotes at this time so be careful when walking small dogs in our neighborhoods. Carry a whistle or a can filled with coins to haze coyotes.

Squirrels

The stork will deliver baby squirrels from **March to June**. Keep your tree trimming to **late fall and early winter**. Tree trimming could disturb **nests and babies**.
