- For late entries, a cheque payable to the NB Beef Expo must accompany the Entry Form. Please make arrangements with Katie McCalllum (506) 227-6440 to ensure payment is coordinated by Sept 22. (i.e., mail via Priority Post).
- There is no entry fee for Junior Show thanks to our sponsors! We are ordering T-shirts, so advance registration is highly recommended to ensure sizing. If you are not sure if you have a calf to show, please contact nbbeefexpo@gmail.com and we will connect you with an exhibitor.
- For those with online breed registries are online NO papers need to be sent along with the registration forms if entered prior to September 11th. We will be able to verify the registrations prior to show day with Tattoo and Registration #. If you register after the 11th –please send along copies of the papers along with your entry form and late fee cheque.
- Proof of Liability insurance for your livestock while at the show must be provided with your registration form.
- All entries (animals) must be in barn by Friday, September 23rd between 8 am and 6 pm. Special arrangements can be made by contacting Gordie Raymond @ (506) 432-0122.
- Exhibitors who come early (i.e., on Thursday) will be responsible for paying the extras costs of barn security.

Section A: Prospect Steers

Rules and Regulations

- Steer calves must be properly castrated with no visible signs of wounds or scars. Steer calves with signs of improper castration will be disqualified.
- Steer calves must be all dehorned or polled.

Class 1: Prospect Steers: Born 2022

Section B: Purebred and Commercial Breeding Stock Show

Rules and Regulations

• A minimum of <u>2 exhibitors</u> and <u>6 animals</u> are required to make a Purebred Breed Show.

Mixed Breed Purebred Class will be created to combine breeds that don't meet							
minimum #s. If a breed not listed above has enough #s a breed show will be introduced.							

COMMERCIAL DIVISION- will host all non-registered animals.

- In classes 10 & 11 (Breeder's Herd and Get of Sire) one entry only is allowed per exhibitor.
- Calves shown with their dams in classes 8 & 9 may be shown separately in classes 1 & 5 if desired. <u>Please identify which calf belongs to which cow for the cow classes on the entry</u> form.
- Classes will only be considered for a split above 8 entries and will be the discretion of the show committee. Each split will be treated as a separate class for exhibitor & breeder point calculations.
- Breed Dress codes for showing are encouraged.
- Note to Hereford Breeders; The Hereford Show at the NB Beef Expo is a "Mark of Excellence", MOE Show. The Canadian Hereford Association MOE Show regulations are to be respected. Exhibitors will be <u>required</u> to respect the Dress Code and will be required to wear the official **red** show shirts.
- Note to Angus breeders: The Angus Show is a Gold Show: All animals must have a CCIA
 or ATQ "Angus Indicator". Any animal with colour products applied to it in a Canadian Angus
 Association sponsored show will be disqualified from the show and any aggregate Gold
 Show points this animal has amassed will be forfeited.



CLASSES ARE AS FOLLOWS:

Class 1 – <u>Bull Calf</u> – Bull calf born on or after January 1st, 2022. Minimum of three months of age on day of judging.

Class 2 - Junior Yearling Bull - Yearling bull born between Apr. 1st, 2021, and Dec. 31st, 2021.

Class 3 – Senior Yearling Bull – Yearling bull born between Jan. 1st, 2021, and Mar. 31st, 2021.

Class 4 - Mature Bull - Bull born in 2020 or earlier.

Grand & Reserve Bull

Class 5 – <u>Heifer Calf</u> – Female calf born on or after Jan 1st, 2022. Minimum of 3 months of age on day of judging.

Class 6 – <u>Junior Yearling Heifer</u> – Yearling born between Apr. 1st, 2021, and Dec. 31st, 2021.

Class 7 – <u>Senior Yearling Heifer</u> – Yearling born between Jan. 1st, 2021, and Mar. 31st, 2021

Junior Champion & Reserve Junior Champion

Class 8 – <u>Two-Year-Old Cow</u> – Female born between Jan. 1st, 2020, and Dec. 31st, 2020, with her own 2022 natural, purebred, tattooed calf at foot. Cow and calf shall be shown as a unit except that the calf is eligible to be shown as a single animal in Classes 1 & 5 and in Classes 10 & 11.

Class 9 – <u>Mature Cow</u> – Female born prior to January 1st, 2020, with her own 2022 natural, purebred, tattooed calf at foot. Cow and calf shall be shown as a unit except that the calf is eligible to be shown as a single animal in classes 1 & 5 and in Classes 10 & 11.

Senior Champion & Reserve Senior Champion

Grand & Reserve Female

Class 10 – <u>Breeder's Herd (purebred only)</u> – A group of <u>four animals bred by an exhibitor</u>, <u>both sexes</u> represented, must be exhibited in one of the previous classes. **The exhibitor must own at least one animal.** Limited to one entry per exhibitor.

Class 11 – <u>Get of Sire (purebred only)</u> – A group of <u>three animals from the same sire, both sexes</u> represented. **At least one animal owned by the exhibitor.** Animals must be shown in one of the previous classes.



POINTS FOR PREMIER EXHIBITOR AND PREMIER BREEDER AWARDS

<u>Premier Exhibitor</u> – will be awarded to the individual, partnership or institution (as recorded on the certificate of registration at the time of entry) having the highest number of points based on a maximum of the six highest placing animals in the single classes owned by the exhibitor. The exhibitor of an animal must meet all 3 of the following criteria:

- 1. Be sole owner, or in the case of jointly owned animals (as per the certificates of registration of the animal at entry time) maintain the animal on the farm or breeding unit and are considered to be the producer of that farm or breeding unit.
- 2. Have duly entered and paid for the entry of said animal for the show.
- 3. Have the animal in his possession and in his exhibit at the show.

To be eligible for this award, the exhibitor must have entered and shown in a minimum of <u>5</u> <u>single classes.</u>

<u>Premier Breeder</u> – will be awarded to the individual, partnership or institution (as recorded on the registration) having the highest number of points based on a maximum of the six highest placing animals in the single classes bred by the breeder. In case of jointly bred animals, no points awarded will count towards the individual score of any of the joint breeders. To be eligible for the Premier Breeder Award the breeder must exhibit at the show. In the event of a tie for the Premier Breeder Award, the award shall go to the breeder that is tied for the award, which placed highest in the Breeder's Herd.

Points for both Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor will be awarded as follows:

Section C: Supreme Champion

Rules and Regulations \$500 Prize for supreme male and female

- Eligible animals for this section will consist of Grand Champion and Reserve Grand
 Champion Male and Female from each Purebred and Commercial Division Show.
- The selection of Supreme Champion Male and Female will be held at 1:00PM on Sunday.
 Male division will go first, immediately followed by the Females.
- Supreme and Reserve Supreme in each division will receive a Beef Expo customized Prize



GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All animals entered in the open purebred classes must be registered with their respective breed associations. If not papered, the animal will be shown in commercial division.
- 2. The NB Beef Expo retains the right to withhold any monies owed to an exhibitor for the following reasons:
 - a) Removing livestock from the grounds before the close of the show.
 - b) Not maintaining their places of exhibit in a clean and orderly condition.
 - c) Not allowing their animals or exhibit to be used in connection with any judging competitions or requests by the Management.
 - d) For any cause which, in the opinion of the Committee, justifies such action.
- 3. The Management reserves the right to reject or refuse any entry, which is considered not suitable for exhibition. Animals suffering from any contagious disease will not be accepted as an exhibit, and if such an entry is accepted the animal must be removed from the grounds forthwith upon order of the Management. However, the NB Beef Expo is not responsible for the health of livestock or for any sickness, which may be incurred by livestock during or after the Show.
- 4. Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion, and other exhibits liable to occasional accidents, injury or damage to persons coming in contact with them shall guard their exhibits and protect the public from coming in contact therewith, and every such exhibitor does hereby indemnify the NB Beef Expo from and against all such claims, demands, costs, charges, and expenses which it may incur, suffer, or be put to by reason of any accident, or of any person being injured or suffering damage through or by reason of any such exhibit not being properly guarded, or the public not being properly protected therefrom.
- 5. The NB Beef Expo will take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of the exhibits sent to the Show but the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting them and should any exhibit or portion thereof be injured, lost or stolen, the NB Beef Expo will give assistance toward recovery of the same but will not be liable or make any payment for the value thereof.
- 6. **All competitors will be required to sign a disclaimer form (on the entry form).** The NB Beef Expo, its employees, agents or servants, shall not be liable for any loss to an Exhibitor, his/her employees, agents or servants which may be occasioned by fire, accidents, condition of structure, negligence of other exhibitors, or officials, or otherwise.
- 7. Any article left in the buildings, or on the grounds, after the close of the Show shall be entirely at the owner's risk.
- 8. Cooking or heating equipment or additional load of any kind whatsoever is expressly forbidden to be used in any barns or buildings, except where permission is granted by the Management. Fire and safety equipment placed at various places on the grounds by the Management shall not be removed or tampered with in any way except in cases of emergency.
- 9. Exhibitors desiring specific bedding will be liable for the supply and placing of the same themselves.
- 10. Daily removal of manure and waste bedding from livestock stalls will be the responsibility of the exhibitor or their attendants. Such refuse is to be piled neatly at a designated spot. Removal from that point shall be the responsibility of the Management.
- 11. Ample supplies of water are available for watering and washing of livestock. Exhibitors are asked to refrain from wastage of water by leaving taps or valves running when not in use.



- 12. Exhibitors shall ensure that all livestock, which they exhibit, is securely fastened in stalls. Devices for fastening shall be provided by the Exhibitor.
- 13. No persons shall be permitted to enter the judging ring whilst judging is in progress except the judges, their attendants and officials, and exhibitors who are showing at that time.
- 14. All protests or appeals must be in writing, and must state plainly the cause of complaint, and shall be delivered to the Manager within four hours after the judges have given their decisions upon the animal or article in question. The sum of \$25.00 (twenty-five dollars) shall be deposited in each case of protest or appeal, the same to be forfeited if the appeal is not sustained. The Show Committee may thereupon forthwith decide the matter of such protest or appeal themselves, or may if they deem it necessary, appoint a new judge or judges, to decide the same, and such decisions, whether of the Committee or such new judge or judges, shall be final. An exhibitor has the right to protest or appeal as provided in the foregoing clauses, and is not allowed, therefore, to interfere with the judges while in the discharge of their duties. Any exhibitor so interfering or using abusive or contemptuous language to any judge shall forfeit his right to any premiums to which he may have been entitled and should there be no premium due him he shall be barred the privilege of exhibiting for two years thereafter.
- 15. No exhibit deemed unworthy by the judge or judges shall be awarded a prize and the right is reserved for the judges to withhold an award or reduce an award when the exhibit is deemed to be of inferior merit.
- 16. The right is reserved for the Management to refuse any exhibit for lack of space or of any other cause, which they consider sufficient.
- 17. No person shall enter upon the grounds with any livestock or other exhibit, which has not been properly entered into competition, without the express permission of the Management.
- 18. The Exhibition is open to entries from all Provinces and States, but the Management reserves the right to refuse entries where no space is available.
- 19. Registration papers for all purebred animals must be shown before animals are judged.
- 20. No attachments shall be affixed to any part of the electrical wiring system within the grounds, except connections made through a properly installed outlet. Any person violating this regulation shall be liable to disqualification in any classes where they may have exhibits entered
- 21. A vehicle park is provided for the general public and exhibitors. No liability whatsoever is entailed to the Show or Management, its servants or agents in providing such a parking place and the users thereof do so entirely at their own risk. All vehicle operators are subject to the direction and instructions of the official in charge of traffic and parking on the grounds. Refusal to obey instructions of these officials will result in banning of the offenders from the grounds.
- 22. Wherever the words "

 Show committee" appears in these rules and regulations they shall mean those members of the official Show committee duly appointed by the NB Beef Expo. Where the word "Management" appears, it shall be construed to mean the persons duly appointed by the Show Committee to carry on the duties and fulfil the office of Manager of the NB Beef Expo.
- 23. If an exhibitor acts in an unsportsmanlike way and/or the management rules that the behavior during or after the show is not acceptable, they will be "barred" from participating in future NB Beef Expos.
