## Materials Needed:

1. Watercolor paper: I Prefer 140\# cold press in a block form. You can also use watercolor pads: sizes 9"x12" minimum to 18 "x24". The $11^{\prime \prime} \times 14^{\prime \prime}$ is a good size to start with. If purchasing watercolor sheets, go with 22"x30" (full sheet) and trim down to desired size.
2. One scrap piece of water color paper (to test color mixes)

## Paint Colors:

Suggest Cotman or Academy tube watercolor for beginners.
(I don't recommend pan colors) Purchase what you can afford.
3. Cobalt Blue
4. Cadmium Red
5. Cadmium Yellow med
6. Ultramarine Blue
7. Burnt Sienna
8. Hooker's Green
9. Yellow Ocher
10. Payne's Grey
11. Van Dyke Brown
12. Prussian Blue
13. Windsor Violet

## Palette \& Brushes:

14. I would suggest a $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Flat and \#6 round (minimum to start) Use whatever sizes your comfortable with.

## Miscellaneous:

15. Bottle of liquid frisket \& old brush to apply frisket
16. Rubber cement pickup and kneaded eraser
17. Backing board (slightly larger than your watercolor paper)

To use as a rigid backing surface for your paper.
If using a watercolor block, you don't need.
18. Masking tape $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
19. Your favorite drawing pencil \& sharpener
20. X-Acto knife
21. Small sponge (for making texture)
22. Water bucket \& paper towels
23. QuicKomp Artist Drawing Tool
