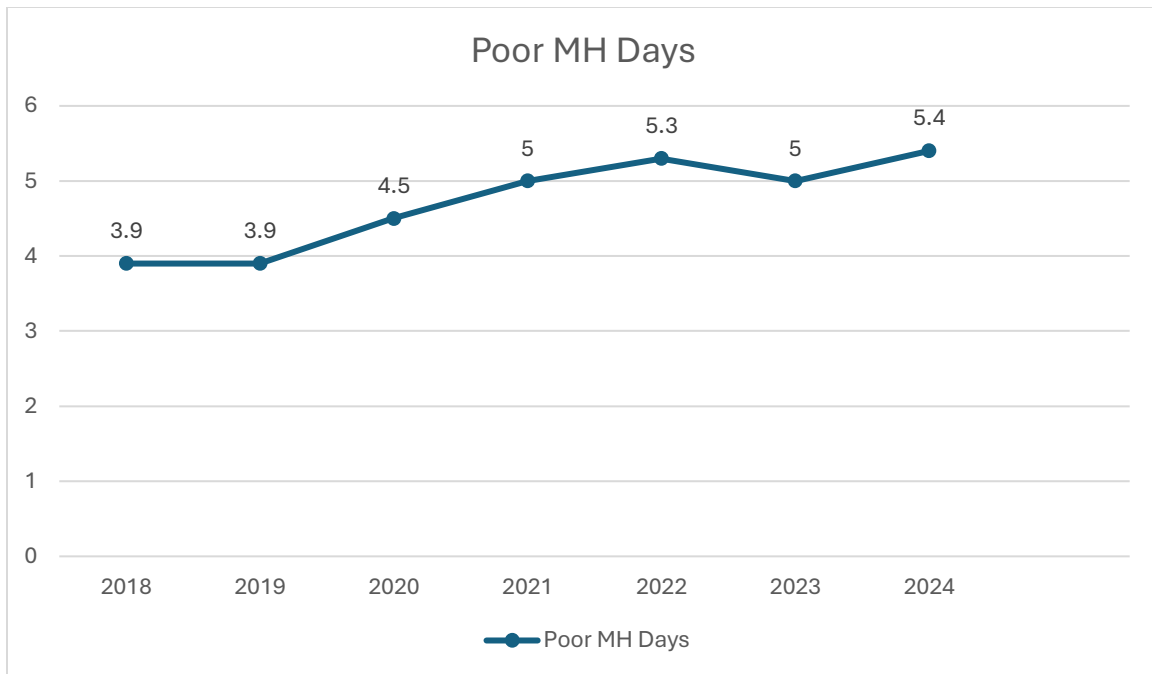

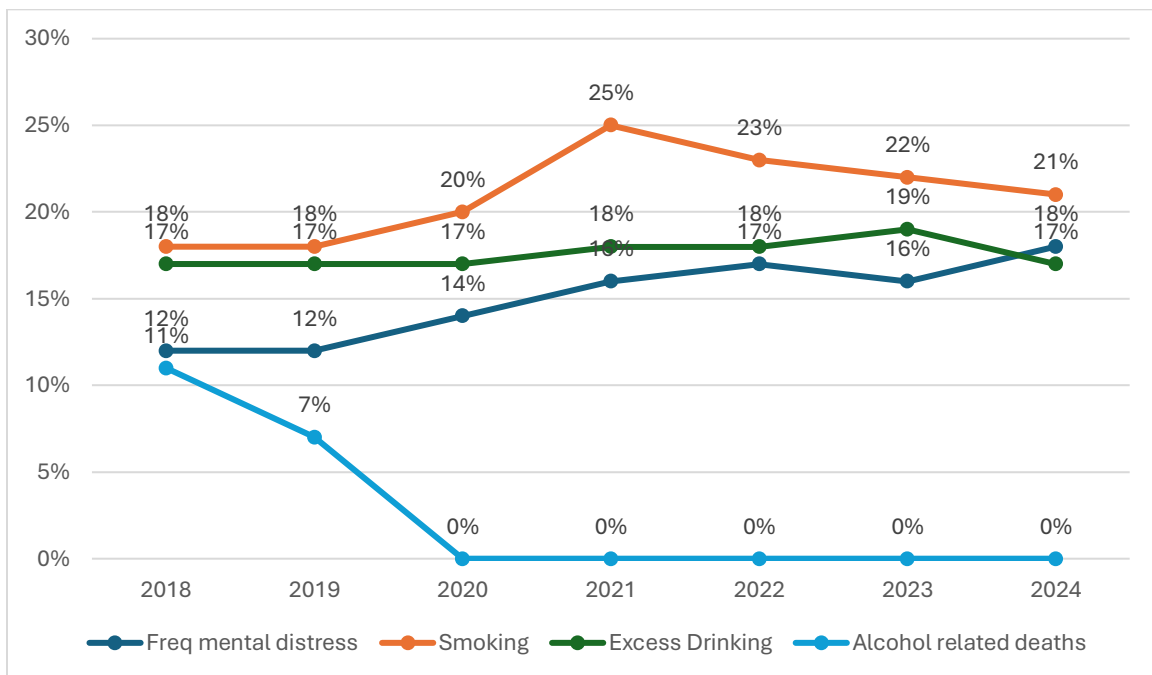

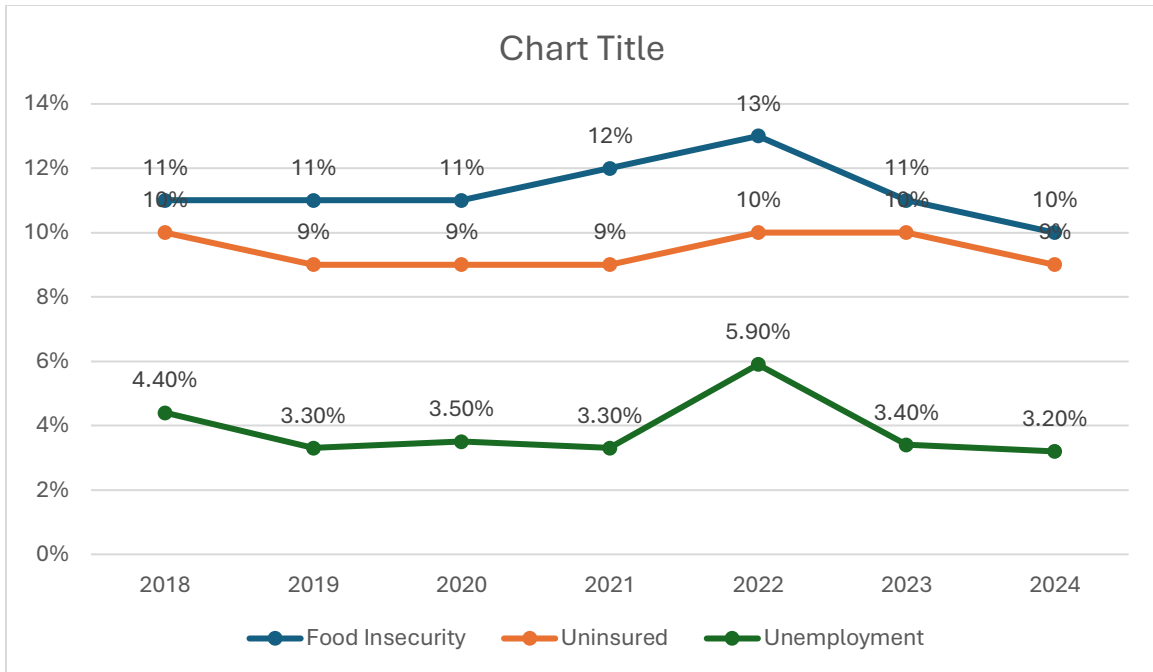




The number of poor mental health days per 30 days has increased from 3.9 days to 5.4 days.

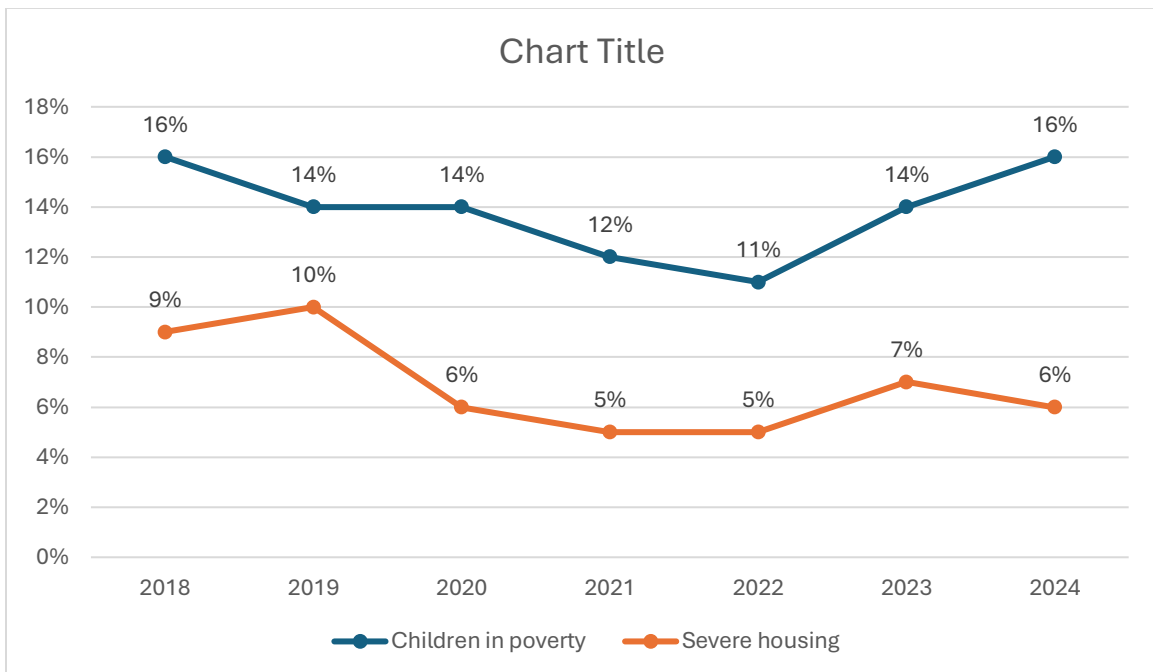


Frequent mental distress levels have increased from 12% to 18% since 2018. Smoking rates have increased from 18% in 2018 to 21% 2024. Excess drinking has stayed the same at 17% and alcohol related deaths have decreased to 0% since 2020. Data should be interpreted with caution as a 0% rate is rare and considered a data outlier.

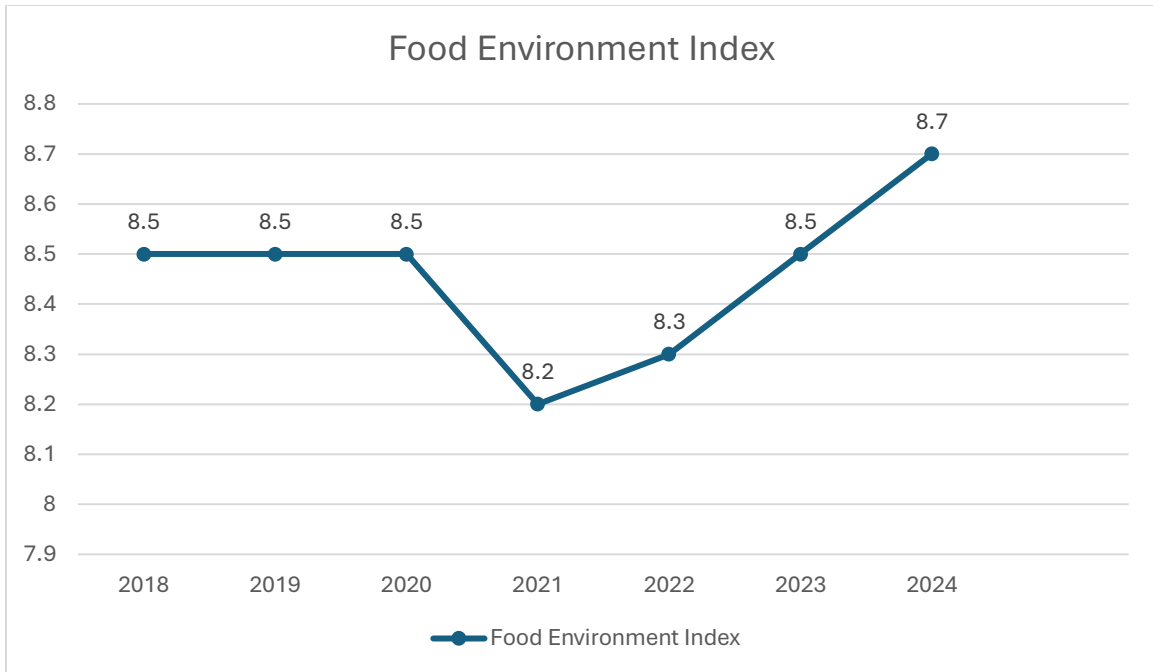


Food insecurity has decreased from 11% to 10%

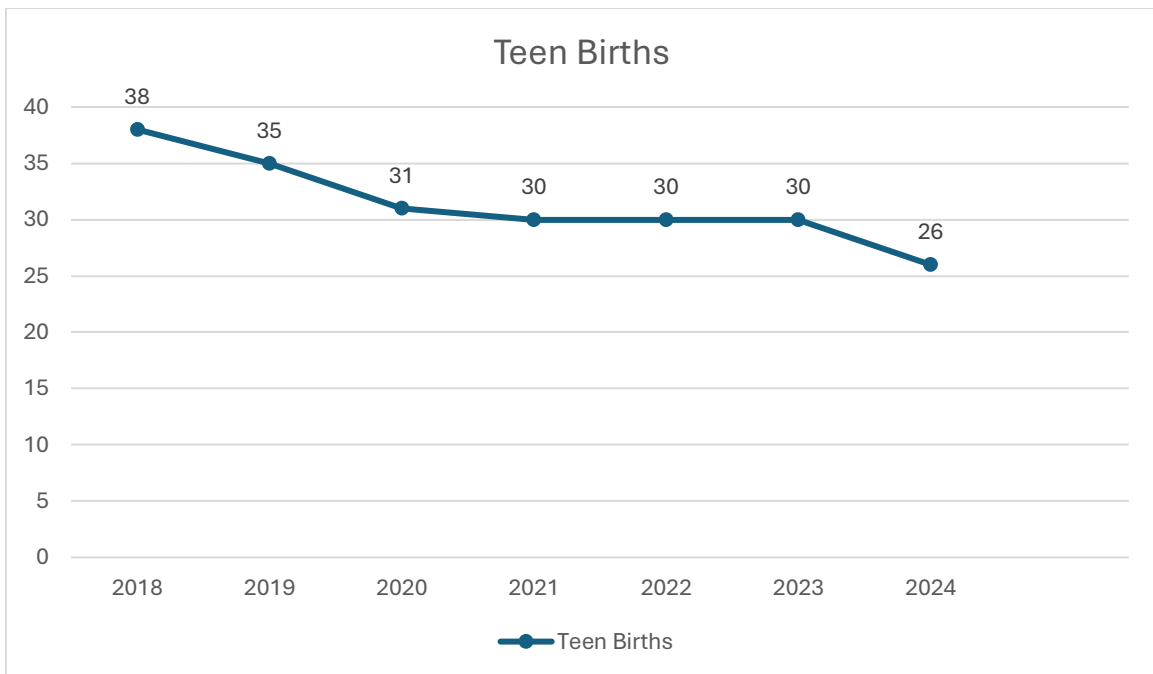
Uninsured rate has decreased from 10% to 9%. Unemployment rate decreased from 4.4% to 3.2%



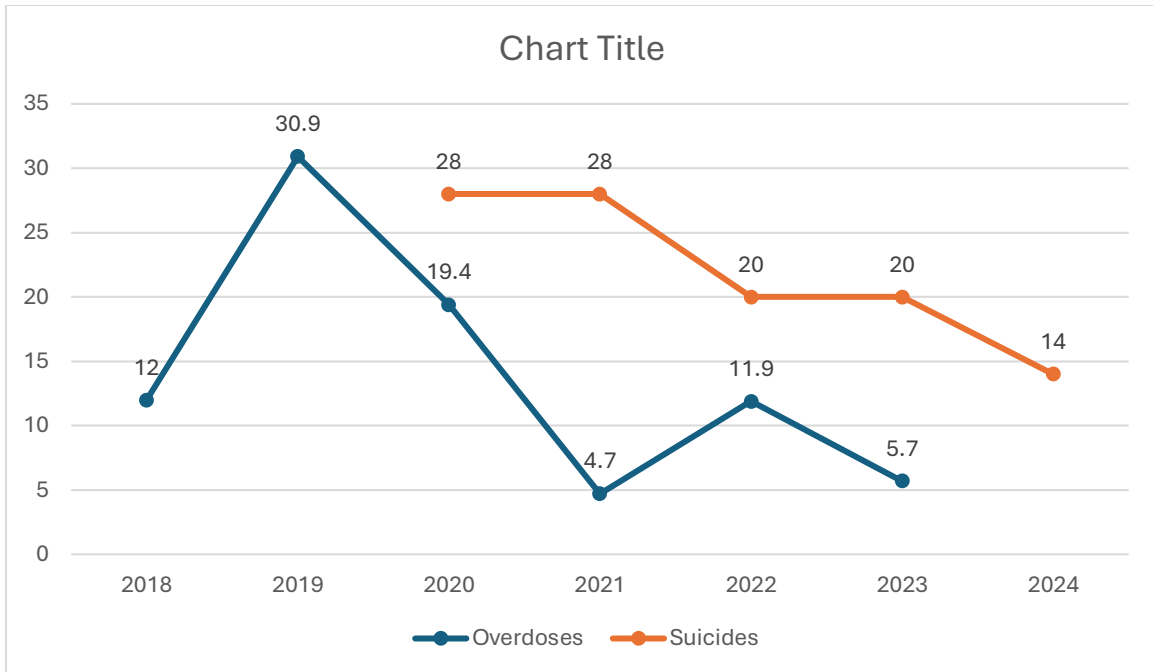
Children in poverty has stayed the same at 16%. Severe housing issues has decreased from 9% since 2018 to 6% in 2024.



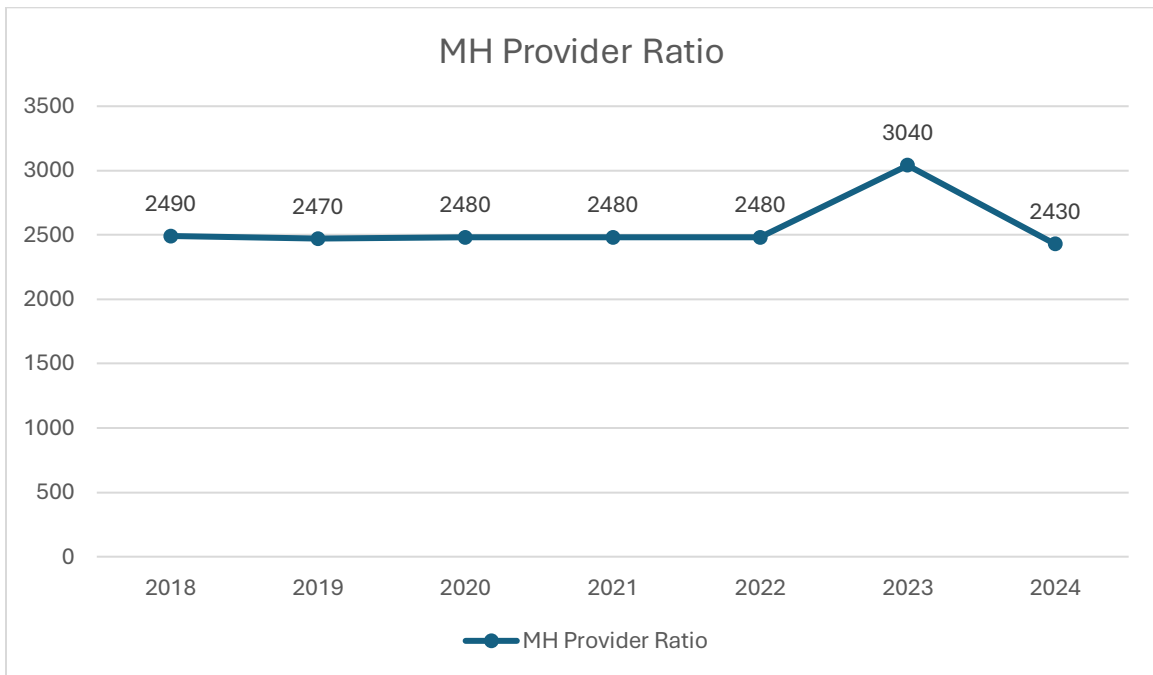
The food environment index has increased from 8.5 to 8.7 since 2018.



Teen births have decreased from 38 to 26 since 2018.



Overdose rates have decreased from 12 to 5.7 since 2018. Suicide rate has decreased from 28 to 14 since 2018.



The mental health provider ratio is how many patients there are to every one mental health provider. The average in Indiana is 550:1. Pike county has had a slight decrease from 2490:1 to 2430:1 since 2018.
