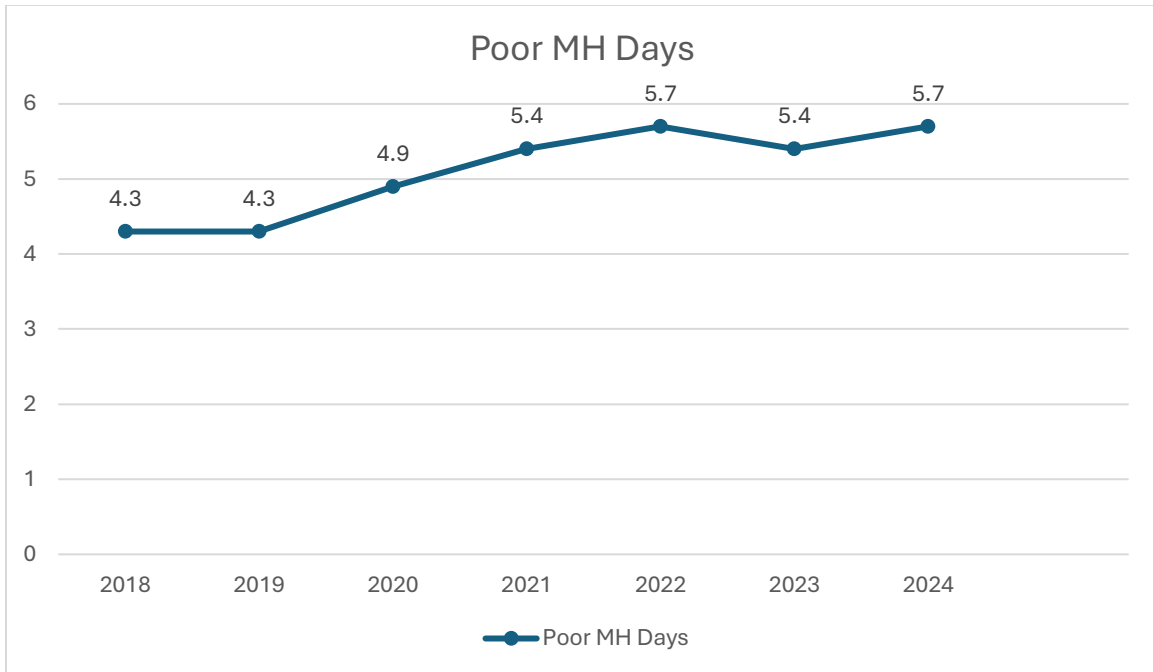

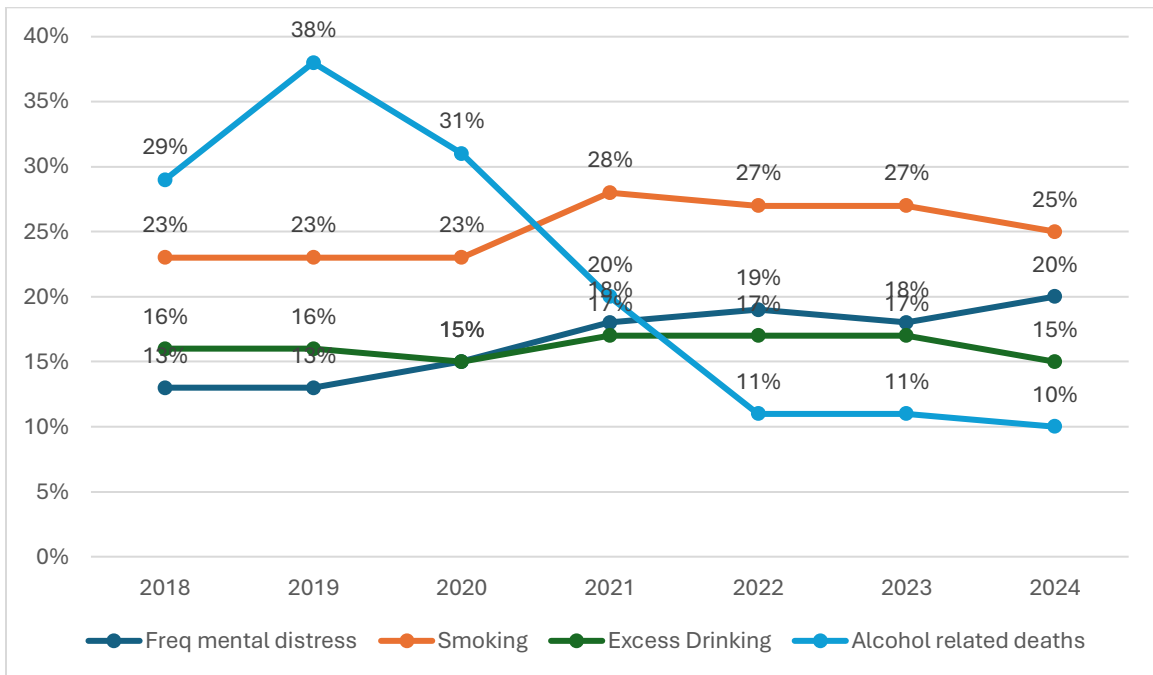

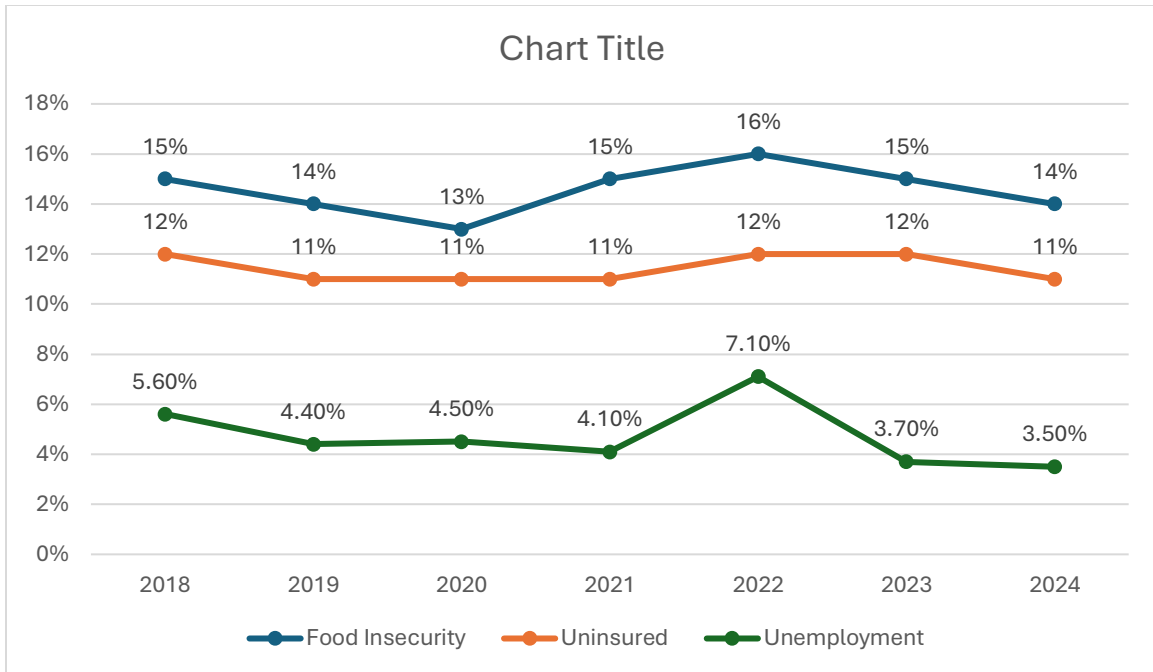




The number of poor mental health days per 30 days has increased from 4.3 days to 5.7 days.

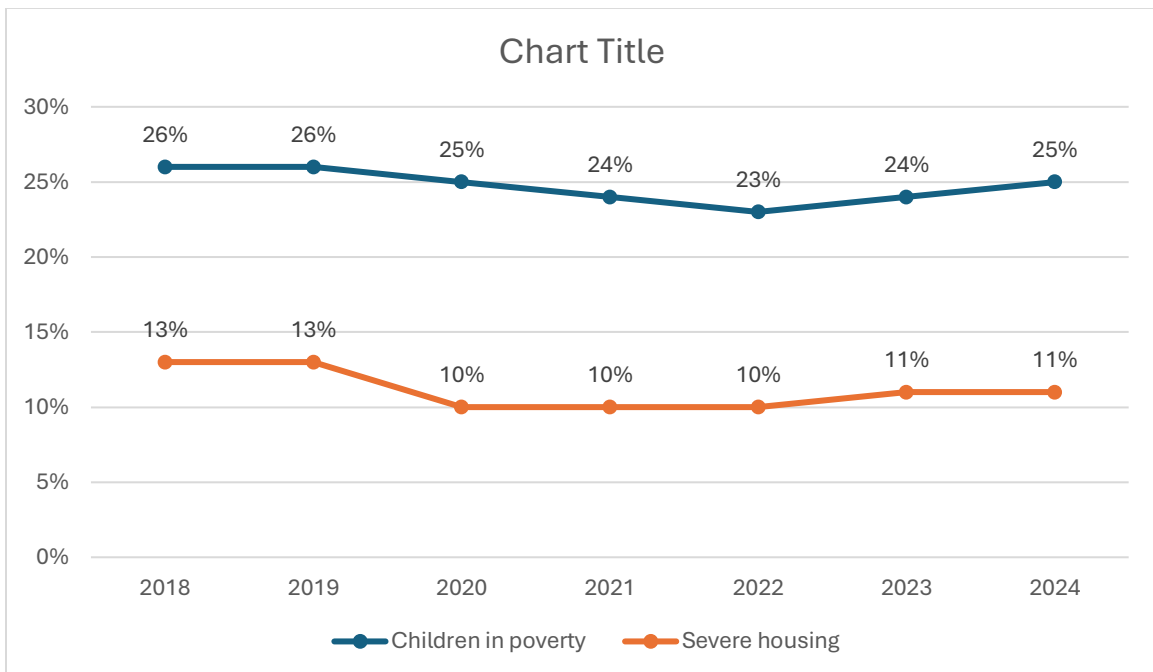


Frequent mental distress levels have increased from 13% to 20% since 2018. Smoking rates have increased from 23% in 2018 to 25% 2024. Excess drinking has decreased from 16% in 2018 to 15% in 2024 and alcohol related deaths have decreased to 10% since 2018.

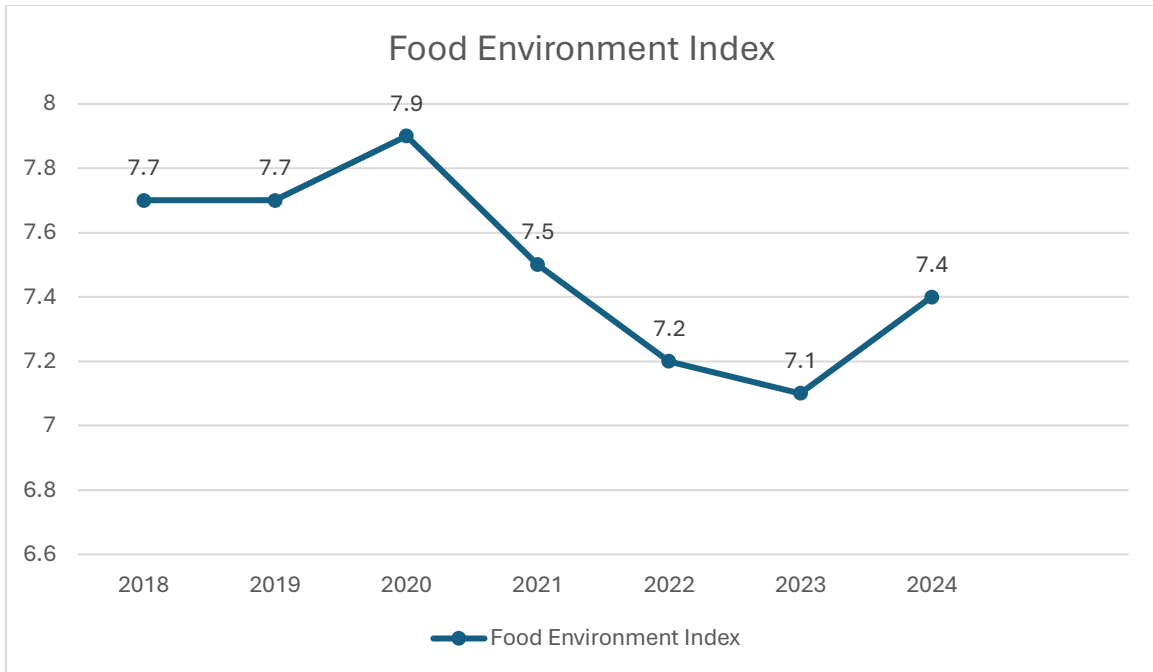


Food insecurity has decreased from 15% to 14%

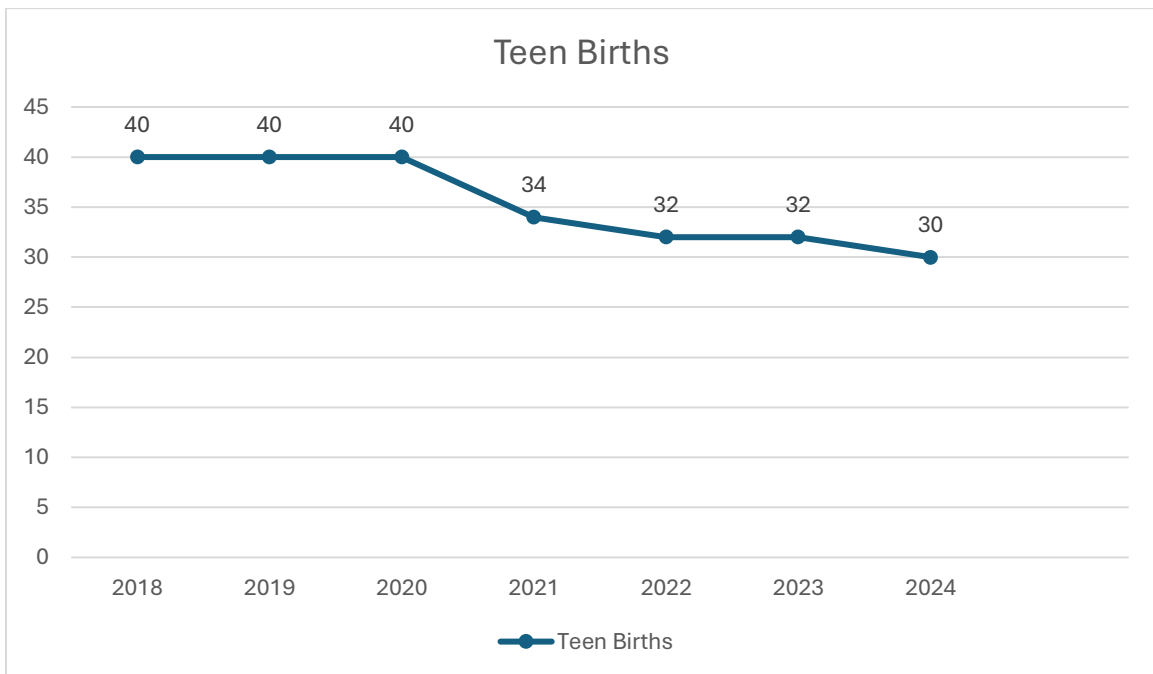
Uninsured rate has decreased from 12% to 11%. Unemployment rate decreased from 5.6% to 3.5%



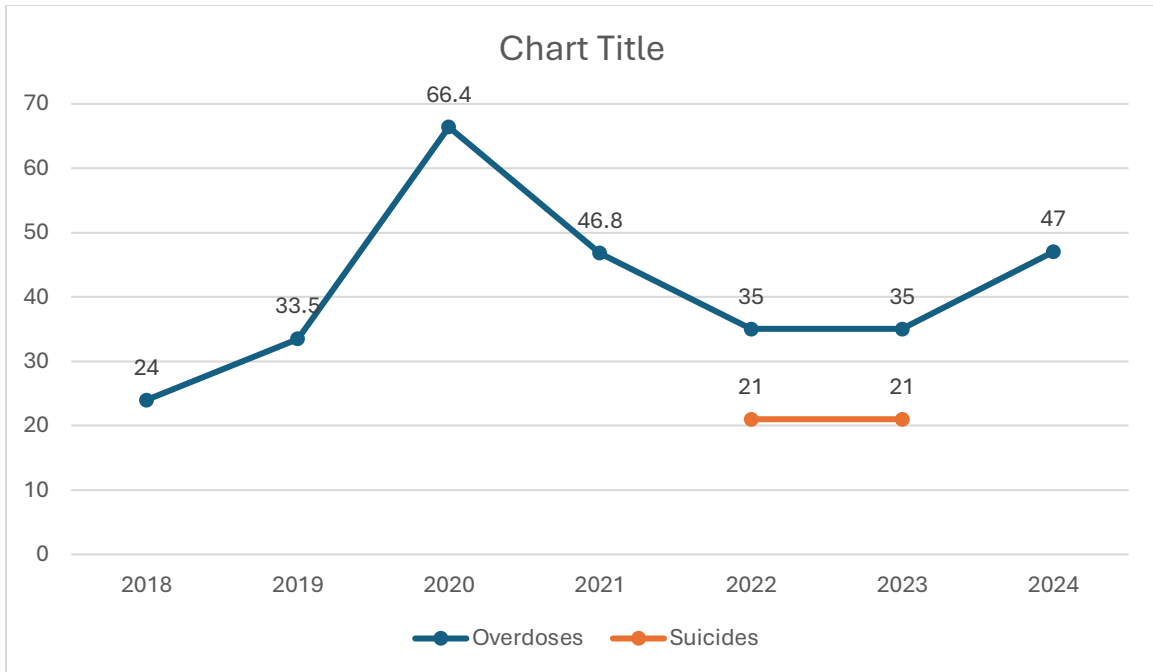
Children in poverty has decreased from 26% to 25% since 2018. Severe housing issues has decreased from 13% to 11% since 2018.



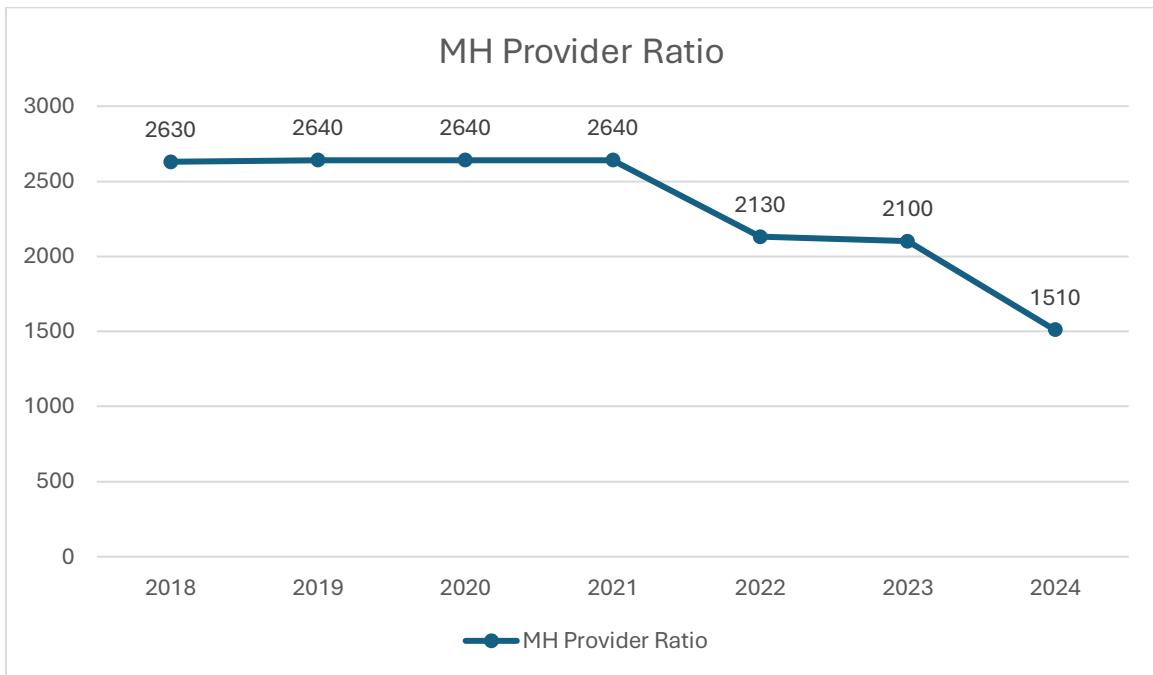
The food environment index has decreased from 7.7 to 7.4 since 2018.



Teen births have decreased from 40 to 30 since 2018.



Overdose rates have increased from 24 to 47 since 2018. Suicide rate has stayed the same at 21 though limited year to year data is available for Crawford County.



The mental health provider ratio is how many patients there are to every one mental health provider. The average in Indiana is 550:1. Crawford county has had a decrease from 2630:1 to 1510:1 since 2018.
