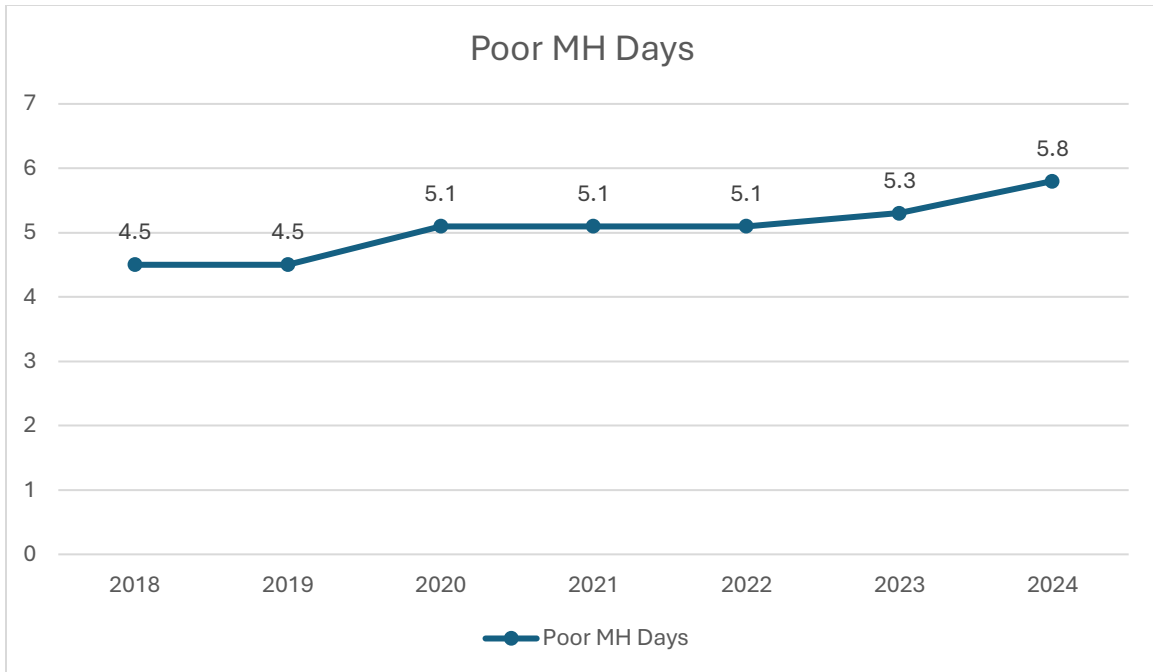

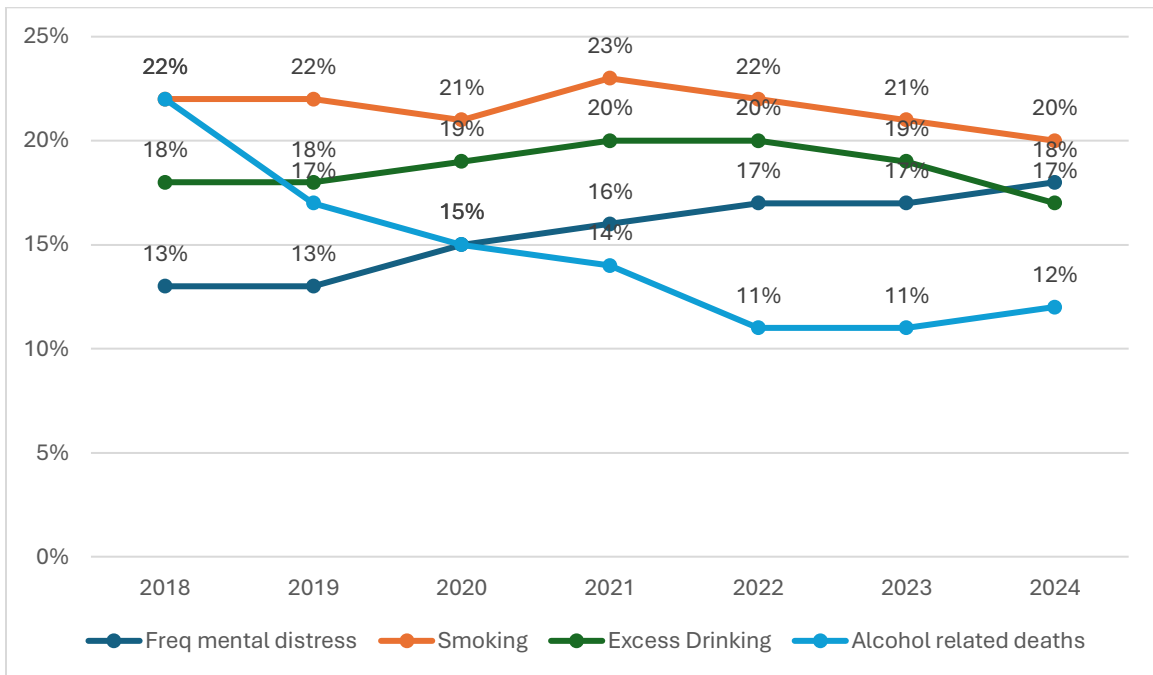

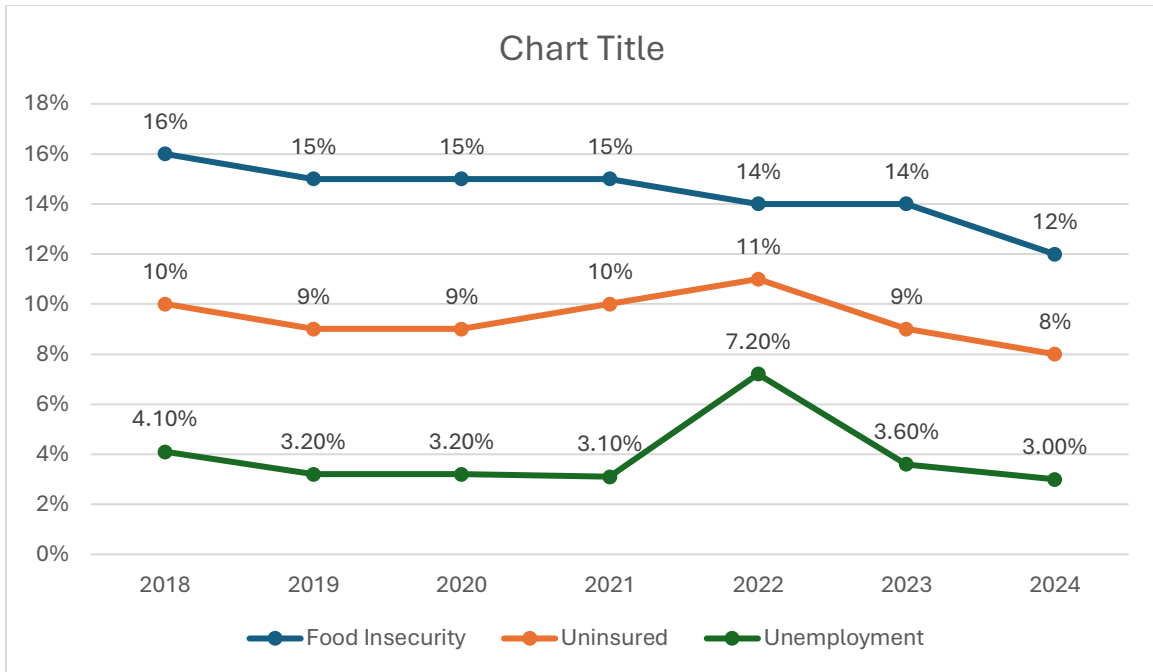




The number of poor mental health days per 30 days has increased from 4.5 days to 5.8 days.

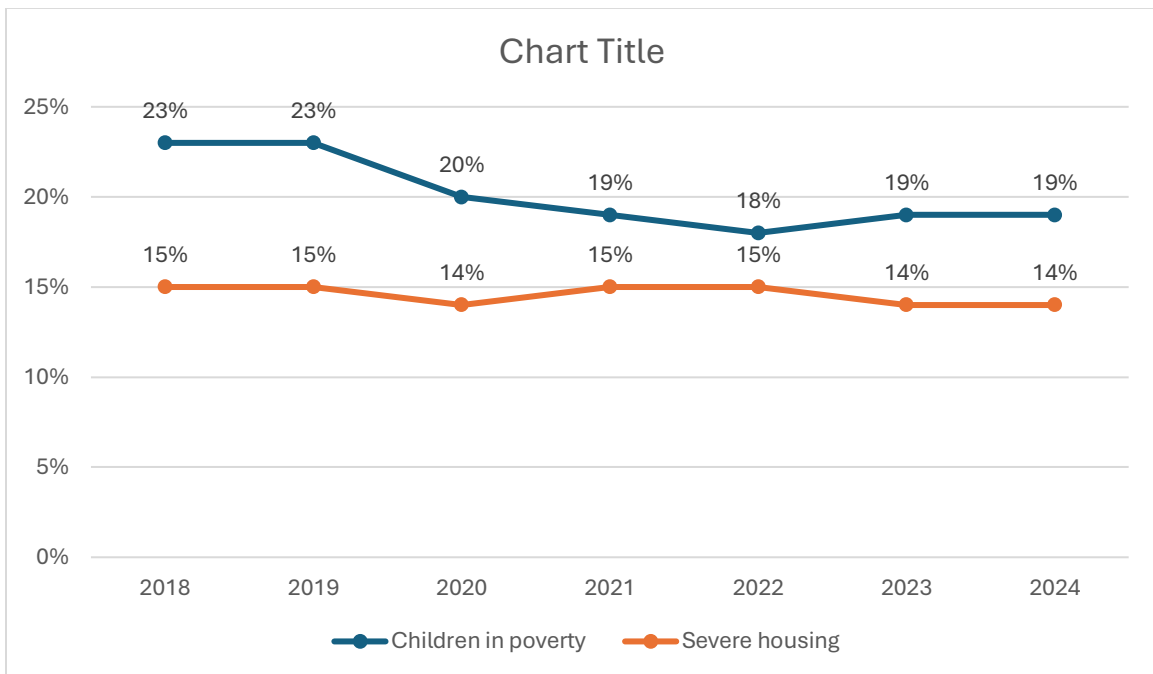


Frequent mental distress levels has increased from 13% to 18% since 2018. Smoking rates e have decreased from 22% in 2018 to 20% 2024. Excess drinking has decreased from 18% to 17% and alcohol related deaths have decreased from 22% to 12%

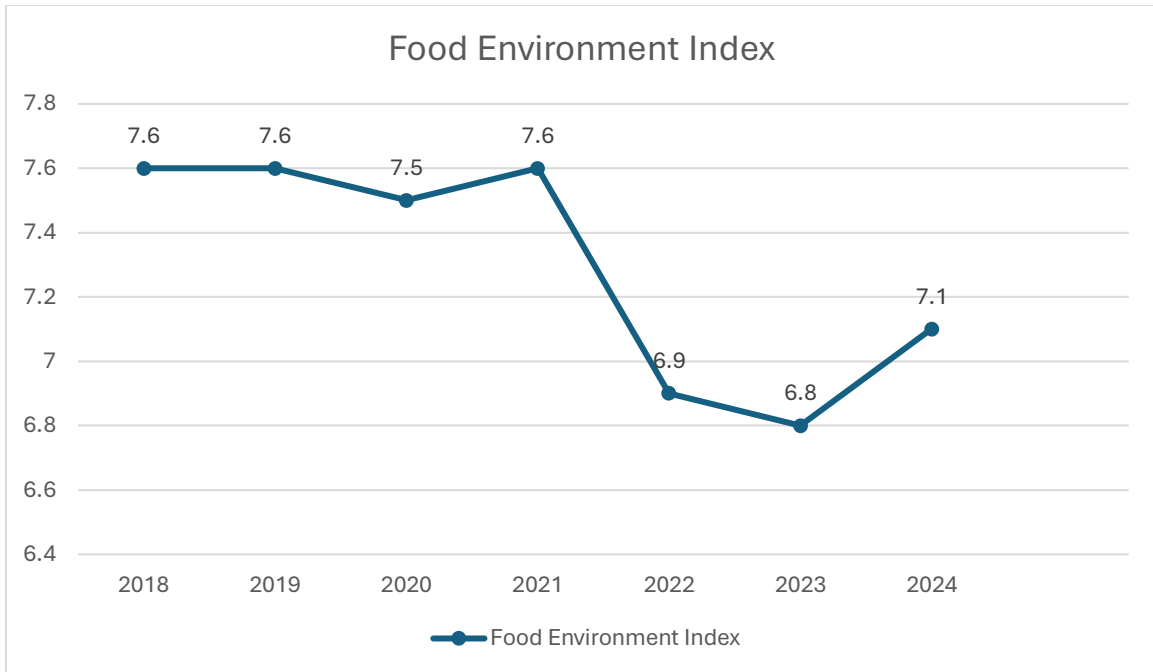


Food insecurity has decreased from 16% to 12%

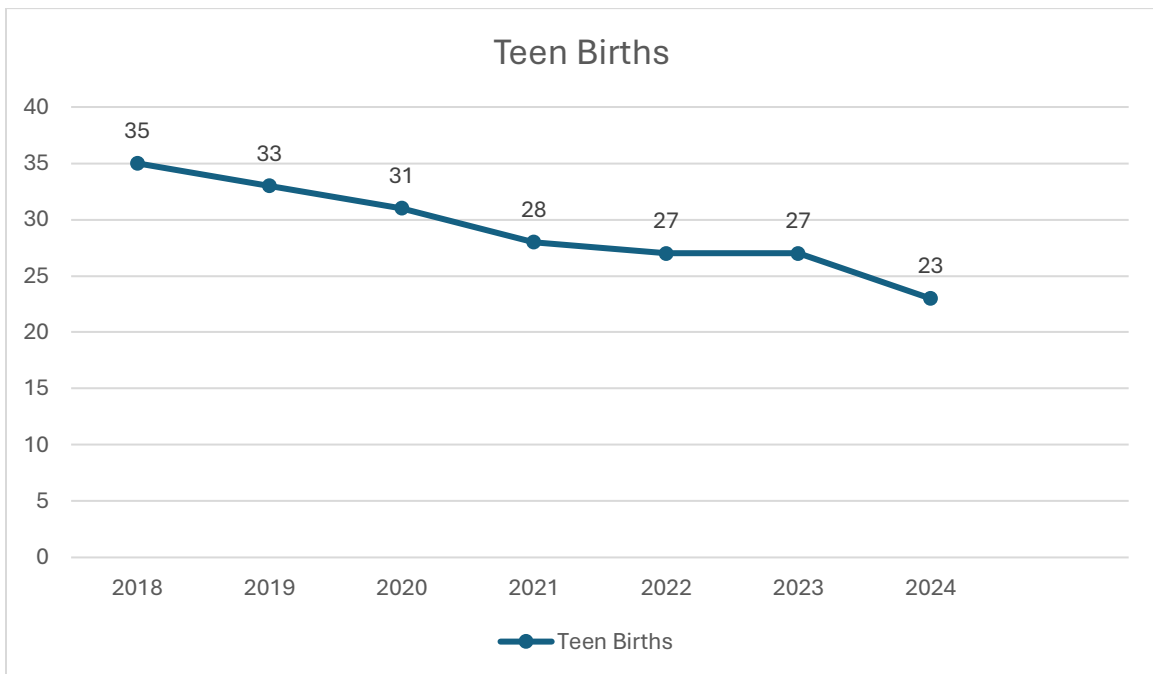
Uninsured rate has decreased from 10% to 8%. Unemployment rate decreased from 4.1% to 3%



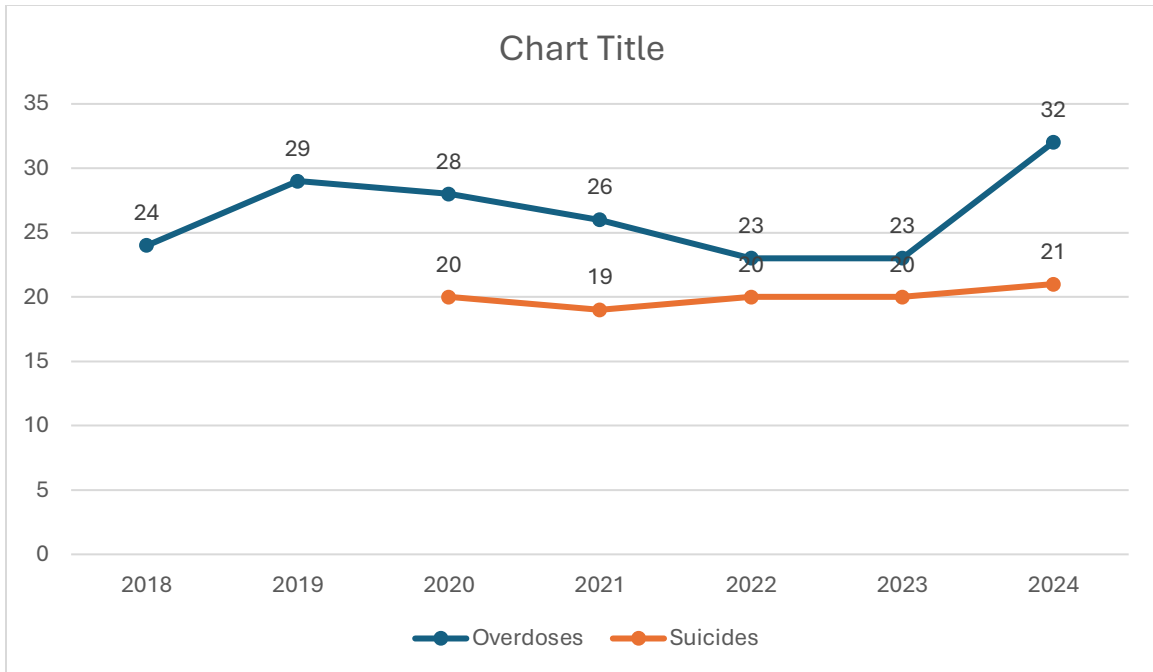
Children in poverty decreased from 23% to 19%. Severe housing issues has decreased from 15% since 2018 to 14% in 2024.



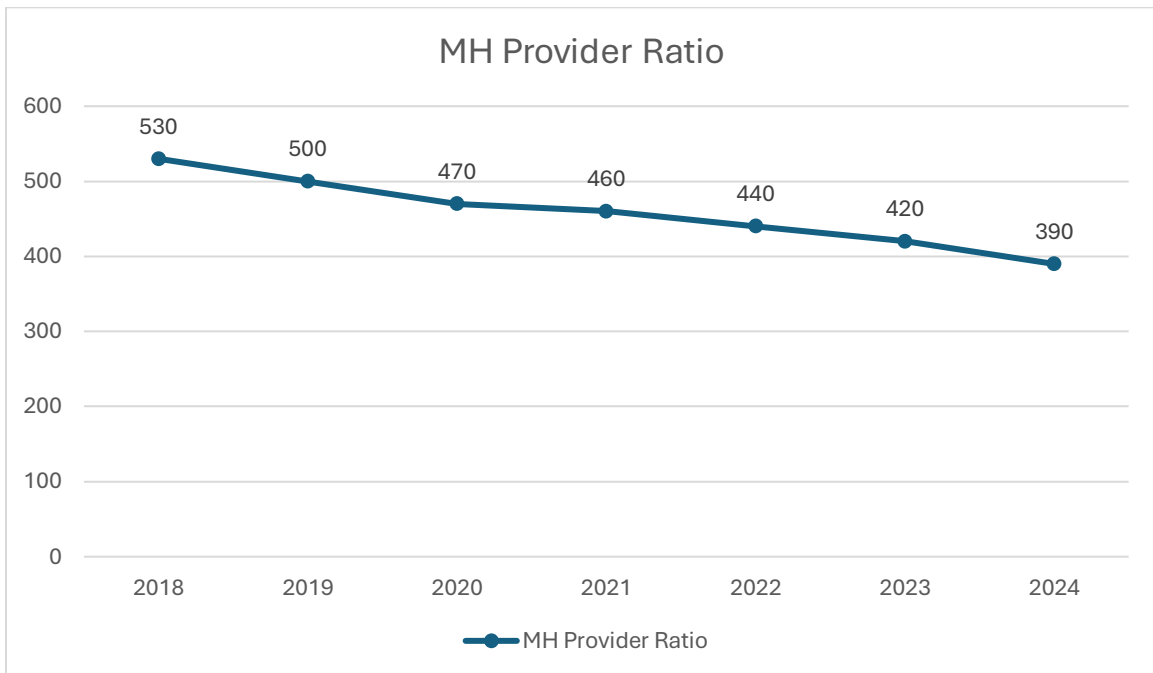
The food environment index has decreased from 7.6 to 7.1 since 2018.



Teen births have decreased from 35 to 23 since 2018.



Overdose rates have increased from 24 to 32 since 2018. Suicide rates have increased from 20 to 21 since 2020.



The mental health provider ratio is how many patients there are to every one mental health provider. The average in Indiana is 550:1. Vanderburgh county has had a decrease from 530:1 to 390:1 since 2018.
